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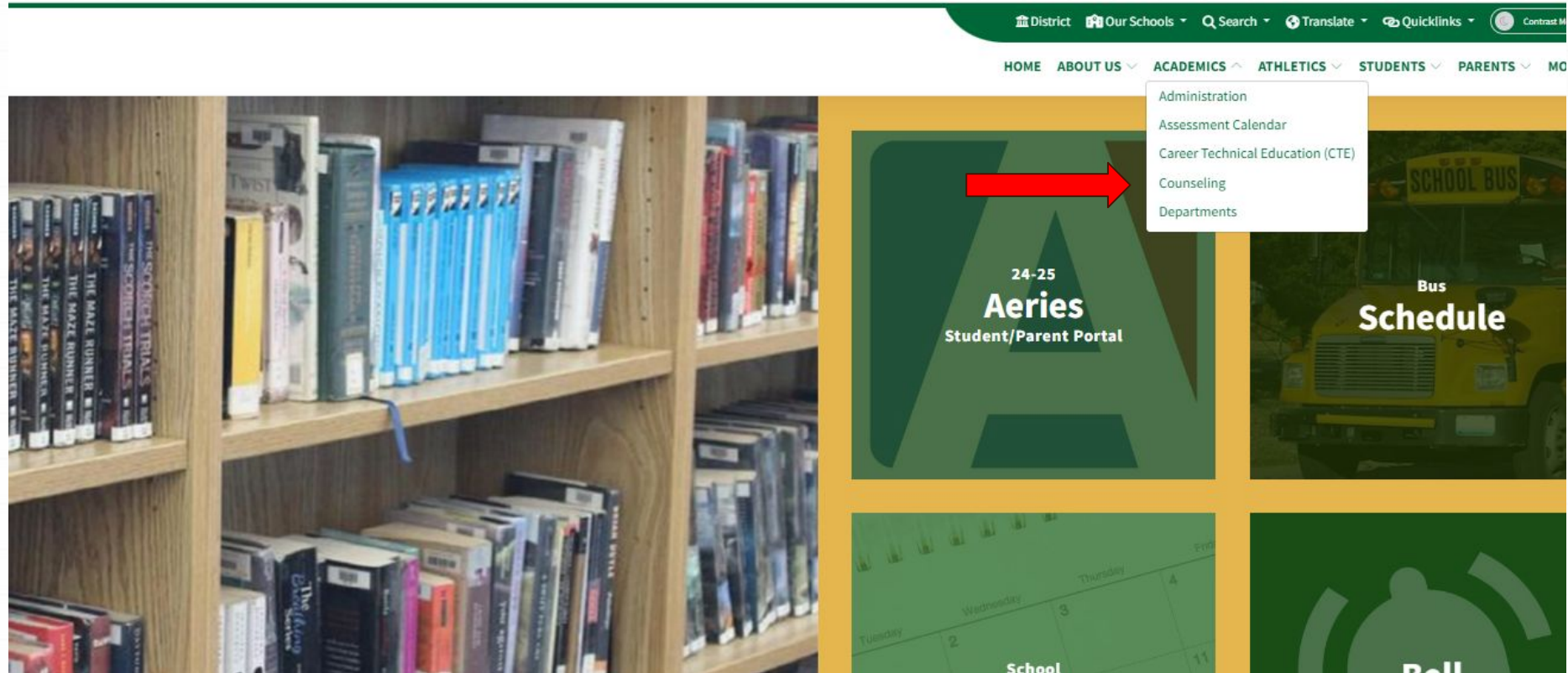

Counseling

Welcome! Our primary focus for school counseling is to help students have a positive experience in high school and to prepare them for college, career, and life. Students who would like help in planning their academic program to fit college or career goals or who need to discuss a personal matter can meet with their counselor. Counselors are usually available on a drop-in basis before and after school and break. Students can also initiate a meeting with their counselor by making an appointment in the Counseling Center. Counselors will respond to their request as soon as possible.

Important note about signing up for an appointment:

Seniors need to make sure.....

Have a driver's license or official photo ID by the end of senior year.

Know their **social security number** for college applications, job applications, financial aid.

All official school records are under their legal name.
Use legal name for all official applications.

Is your student going to apply to a university?

1. You need to know when and where to apply. **Make your list of 4-7 campuses. Look up the programs that they offer on the college website. Do some research.**
2. **Make an appointment** with your counselor if you are going to apply so you can get tips/hints.

College Timelines

Community College (Shasta/Butte)-no hard deadline but ideal to apply before Christmas break.

California State University applications (CSU)- October 1- Nov. 30

University of California applications (UC)-October 1- Nov. 30

Private Colleges/Universities-deadlines vary. Check the campus website.

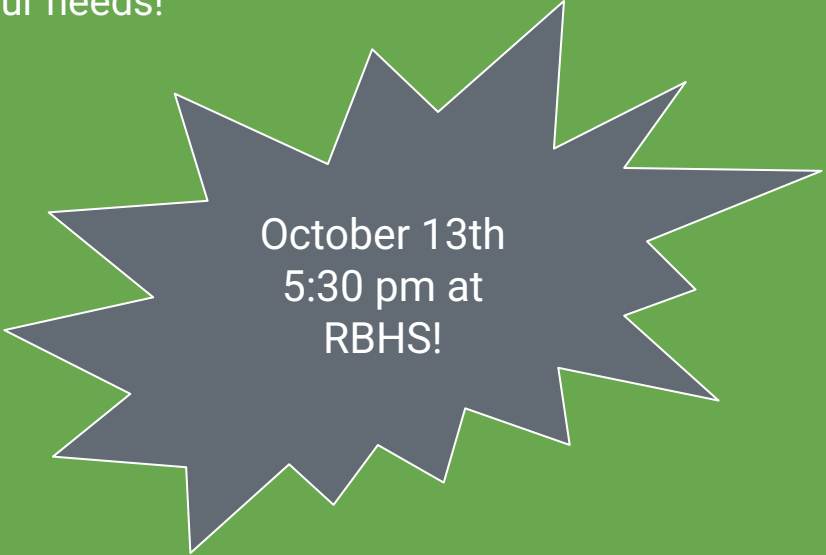

Who needs money for college?



FREE Application for Federal Student Aid

- ❑ FAFSA is the government application that seniors and college students fill out every year to see if they are eligible for money to fund their educational goals.
- ❑ You find the form online and you fill it out anytime between Oct. 1-March 2nd (priority).
- ❑ **Most students** will need their parents help since it requires parent tax income information....

California Dream Act Application (CADAA)

Allows students without a social security number to apply for state financial aid.

Who is include on the FAFSA/CADAA?

Legal parents (biological or adoptive) that are married or are not married and live together.

What can I get from the FAFSA?

Grant money from the federal government and/or grant money from the state of California.
(You don't have to pay back grants-it is a gift!)

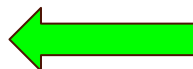
Senior Scholarships

DON'T DELAY.....SCHOLARSHIPS ARE AVAILABLE NOW!

- Go for the local scholarships first (all are listed in the senior scholarship handbook-see the link below)
- Community Scholarship—fill it out and turn it in by March 3rd (the application will be available mid-January)
- Search for scholarships at the specific campuses where you are applying—check the college webpages
- Search on large scholarship banks (several are listed in the **Other Scholarships** link)

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

Eligibility and Award Amounts

Students

➔ Eligibility:

Student eligibility is determined by the California Department of Education (CDE). To be considered for eligibility, a student must have been enrolled on Fall Census Day and must also be identified as an English learner or low-income by the Local Control Funding Formula.

There are two groups of California public school students who may be eligible to claim a CalKIDS Scholarship:

- Students enrolled in **grades 1-12** during the **2021-2022** academic year.
- Students enrolled in 1st grade during the **2022-2023** academic year and every school year after, with the ability to claim their account when they reach 2nd grade or later.

➔ Scholarship Award Amounts:

\$500: Eligible low-income or English Learner public school students will have a CalKIDS Scholarship Account created in their name with an initial scholarship of **\$500**.

+ \$500: Eligible students identified as foster youth will receive an additional one-time **\$500** contribution deposited into their account.

+ \$500: Eligible students identified as homeless will receive an additional one-time **\$500** contribution deposited into their account.

= Up to \$1,500: That's up to **\$1,500** in scholarship money for students!
