all RLA assessments

Combined reading and

Transition to Online
Assessments

Allows students to receive
accommodations like they
get in the classroom and
provides faster results to
support accelerated learning

Incorporation of cross-

This design has produced ratings that are not strongly correlated with poverty.





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
Closing the Gaps Super Groups
