Fruit of the Month: Blood Oranges

Blood oranges are orangey red on the outside, but dark red on the inside. They get their red color from an antioxidant called anthocyanin which reduces the risk of cardiovascular disease. They are less tangy than a navel orange and have a floral tart taste. They are full of Vitamin C, fiber and other antioxidants that help boost your immune system, improve digestion and has anti-inflammatory properties




The blood oranges that are being served in our schools are grown and harvested at the Yanez Farm in Davis, California. The Yanez Farm is a multigenerational family-owned farm currently run by Saul Yanez. You can find their fresh fruits and berries at local farmers markets in Davis and Sacramento. We remain committed to supporting local farmers and serving California grown produce whenever possible.

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- **Fever:** If your child has a fever they are required to stay home until they are fever free for at least 24 hours without fever reducing medication (tylenol, motrin, etc).
 - **Vomiting and/or Diarrhea:** Please keep your student home until they have at least one full day of normal health (no vomiting and/or diarrhea).
 - **For Colds and Flu's:** If your child must be fever free for at least 24 hours (without fever reducing medications) and the cold/flu symptoms must be resolved or improving to return to school.



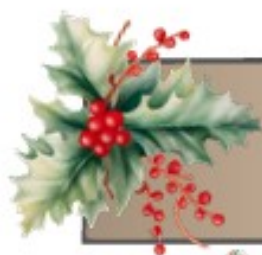

Rescue Elementary Mural

1. **Pleasant Grove House Barn and Stables:** 1850, Served as a Pony Express relay station.



2. **Green Valley School House:** 1862-1947, Original school house built on the Skinner Winery property.



3. **Wing House and Barn:** 1853, served as a store, voting place, boarding house.



4. **Hunter/Carpenter Store:** 1894, Served as the store, post office, and also a gas station.



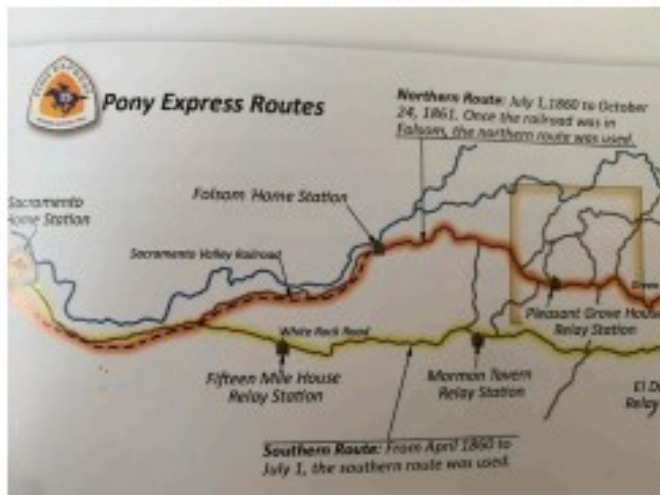
5. **Rose Springs Literary Society Hall:** 1896, Originally served as a community meeting place, it now houses the current post office and Fire Department.



6. **Pyramid Mine:** 1858, This was the largest mine in Rescue. The Pyramid had multiple gold veins on the property.



7. **Pony Express:** 1860, The Pony Express route went down Green Valley Road to connect Placerville to Folsom.



8. **Rescue Volunteer Fireman's Association:** 1960 The first volunteer group that began the long history of the rescue Fire Department.

- The school does not provide transportation to games. Families are responsible for getting their child to/from all games.
