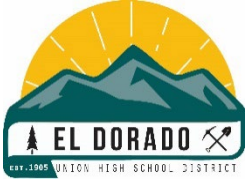

The area includes about 40 communities along the Highway 50 corridor, including the towns of Placerville, El Dorado Hills, Cameron Park, Shingle Springs, Diamond Springs, Camino, and Pollock Pines. A variety of new and existing homes, many with acreage, are available at reasonable prices within the District. Agriculture, tourism, and light industry are the area's primary industries. The community is served by Los Rios Community College District, Sierra Community College District, Cosumnes River Community College, California State University at Sacramento, and U.C. Davis.
