Definition:

Under the direction of the Maintenance Lead and the general supervision of the Supervisor of Operations and Director of Facilities, performs skilled and semi-skilled and preventative maintenance; major and minor construction and repair work on school buildings, grounds, and equipment.

Distinguishing Characteristics:

The duties of the Maintenance IV are distinguished from those of Maintenance III in that the Maintenance IV is assigned a variety of skilled and semi-skilled maintenance tasks including all those covered in Maintenance III and performs specialized assignments in one or more of the following trades: painter, locksmith, or glazier.

Essential Job Duties:

The following tasks are essential for this position. Incumbents in this classification may not perform all of these tasks, or may perform similar related tasks not listed here:

- 1. May perform all work covered under Maintenance III description.
- 2. Performs special assignments from one or more of the following trades: painter, locksmith, plumber, electrician, carpenter or air conditioning.
- 3. Performs other related duties as assigned.

Minimum Knowledge, Skill and Ability

Knowledge of:

- Tools, materials, and terminology used in several of the building trades
- Fundamentals of most of these crafts: painting, locksmith, and glazier and associated shop practices
- Principles, methods, materials, and equipment used in one or more of these trades: painting, locksmith, plumber, electrician, carpenter, or air conditioning
- Safety principles
- Preventative maintenance fundamentals

Skill and Ability to:

- Apply the principles, methods, materials, and equipment used in a qualified craft
- Safely use a wide variety of hand and power tools involved in general maintenance and the qualified craft
- Work from sketches, drawings, and blueprints
- Use all equipment related to his/her specific assignment
- Perform heaving manual labor and lift heavy loads properly and safely
- Work independently without constant supervision
- Maintain professional confidentiality
- Maintain effective and cooperative working relationships with those contacted in the course of the work

Training and Experience:

Any combination equivalent to training and experience that could like provide the required knowledge; skills and abilities would be qualifying. A typical way to obtain the knowledge, skills and abilities would be: high school diploma or equivalent. Trade school graduate desired and minimum of two years experience in general building maintenance work and three years in the specific trade.

Licenses and Certificates:

Possession of a valid California Driver's License and be insurable.

Physical Requirements and Working Conditions:

- Require vision which may be corrected to read small print.
- Require the mobility to stand, stoop, reach, and bend. Require mobility of arms to reach and dexterity of hands to grasp and manipulate small objects.
- Perform lifting, pushing and/or pulling which does not exceed 100 pounds and is an infrequent aspect of the job.
- May be required to work in inclement weather without effective protection from the sun, cold and rain.
- May be required to work with harsh and toxic substances.
- May be required to wear protective apparel including goggles, face protectors, aprons, and shoes.
- May be required to work within enclosed spaces or at heights above ground level.
- May be required to work around loud noise.
- May be required to work around moving mechanical parts.
- May be required to work around electrical current.
- Is subject to inside and outside environmental conditions.
- May be required to take and pass a physical examination.
- Will be required to have live scan fingerprinting completed and cleared prior to beginning work.
