
On Ramps

Dual Credit

Students must apply, test and pre-qualify for Dual Credit. Credit is earned through San Antonio College.

College Ready	Meet Texas Success Initiative (TSI) criteria in ELAR and Math SAT, ACT, TSIA or College Prep Course
	Meet AP/IB criteria <i>Earn a 3 on AP exam any subject or 4 on IB exam any subject</i>
	Earn Dual Course Credits <i>Earn credit for at least three credit hours in ELA or mathematics or at least nine credit hours in any subject.</i>
	Complete OnRamps Dual Enrollment Course <i>Complete dual enrollment course qualifying for at least 3 hours of college credit in any subject</i>
	Earn an Associate Degree <i>Degree must be completed prior to graduation from high school</i>
	Earn a Level I or Level II Certificate <i>Level I or Level II certificate in any workforce education area</i>
Career Ready	Complete CTE Program of Study and earn an aligned and approved Industry Based Certification (IBC)
	Graduate with completed IEP and Workforce Readiness <i>A graduate that has completed their IEP and has either demonstrated self-employment with self-help skills to maintain employment or has demonstrated mastery of specific employability and self-help skills that do not require public school services</i>
Military Ready	Graduate under Advanced Degree Plan <i>A graduate who is identified as receiving special education services during the year of graduation and whose graduation plan type is identified as a Recommended High School Plan (RHSP), Distinguished Achievement Plan (DAP), Foundation High School Plan with an Endorsement (FHSP-E), or Foundation High School Plan with a Distinguished Level of Achievement (FHSP-DLA).</i>
Military Ready	Enlist in the US Armed Forces or Texas National Guard <i>A graduate must enlist and submit a completed DD Form 4 "Enlistment/Reenlistment Document-Armed Forces of the United States" to the district</i>
