Social Vocational Services' Folsom Inclusion Center is a day-program site offering support to adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Participants receive individualized support, including transportation in agency vehicles. The center also provides opportunities for creative expression and real-world experiences—all tailored to help each person grow toward their personal goals
