8. New Business (45 min.)	Approve Safety Plan	Chair/Principal	<p>Safety Plan:- Dr. Latteri reviewed/presented the safety plan. He went over the student safety survey data and responses regarding how safe students feel at school.</p> <p>Changing the safety survey data to become mandatory this year</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Goal 1: Safe Physical Environment - Use of Minga has increased a lot and helps ensure student safety by being able to identify students. Will provide prevention and intervention programs for Tobacco use and Vaping such as TUPE and YVAPE. - Goal 2: Safe School Culture - Students: Proving a safe school climate and culture by promoting all support programs on campus and the 3 P's (Positive, Productive and professional). - Goal 3: Safe School through MTSS and Staff Training - Provide professional growth opportunities for all staff. Increase social-emotional wellness of students and positive reinforcement for students displaying the 3 P's. <p>Greta had a question about what the “No party Groups” are in Minga.
