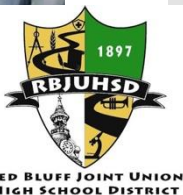
"Helping our community by serving your students"

- Red Bluff High School opened its doors to students in 1907.
- Today, the District serves approximately 1,700 students in grades 9–12.
- Home to Red Bluff High School and Salisbury High School.
- Longstanding agriculture and Career Technical Education programs connect students with the region's workforce.



What is Measure H?

- On July 16, 2026 the Board of Trustees unanimously placed Measure H, the Red Bluff Joint Union High School District Career Preparation/Repairs Measure, on the November 2026 ballot for voter consideration.
- Measure H is a local education bond to help support high-quality first responder training and critical health and safety repairs at Red Bluff High School.
- By law, all Measure H funds would be required to be spent to benefit our students and high schools.



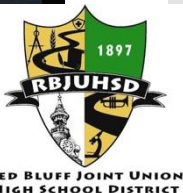
Measure H helps prepare your students for good-paying local jobs

- Red Bluff High School has a successful partnership with CAL FIRE and Red Bluff City Fire to train dozens of future local firefighters to keep your community safe.
- Provided that the Red Bluff community approves Measure H, our District could qualify for up to \$16 million in our fair share of matching funds from Sacramento.
- This funding helps prepare local students for good-paying jobs as EMTs, firefighters, and nurses.



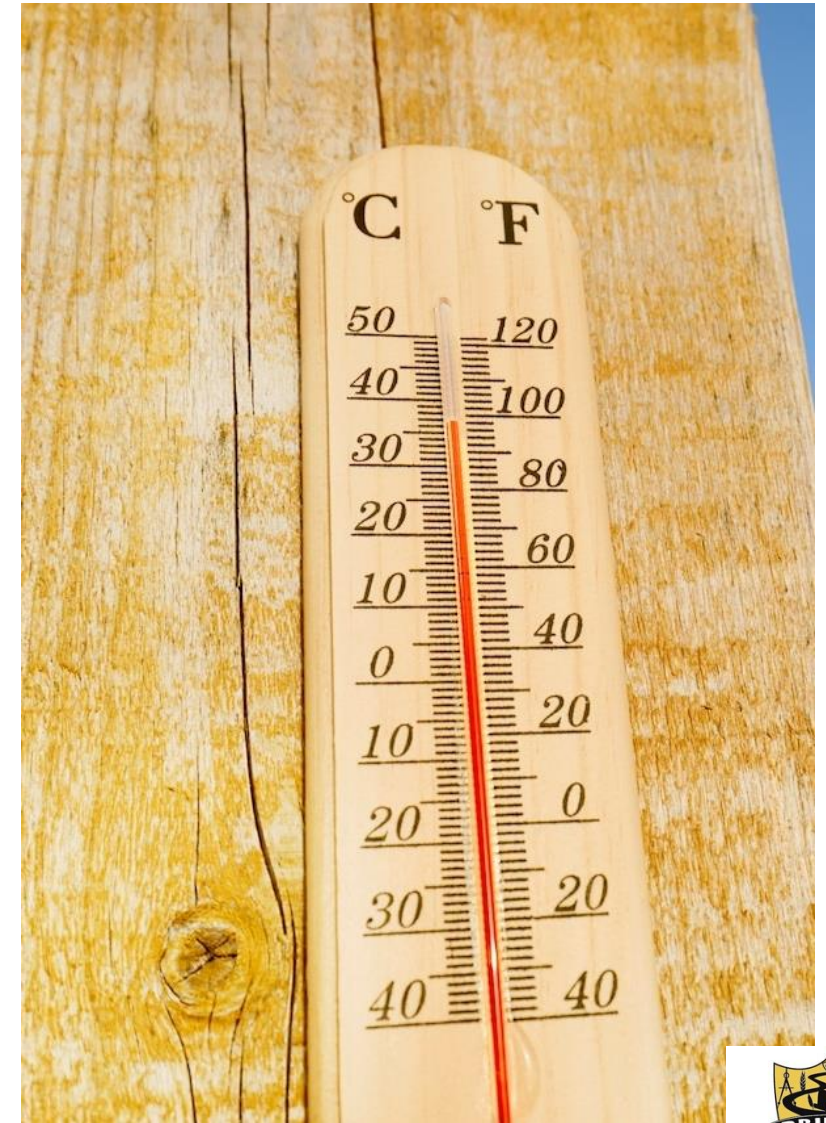
Getting our fair share from Sacramento provides Healthy High Schools and a Healthy Community

- Red Bluff High's Ag Career Training programs were only made possible by getting our fair share of state matching funds.
- If approved, Measure H helps secure our fair share of state money in 2027, specifically to train our kids for careers as First Responders (paramedics, nurses, firefighters).



Measure H helps address classrooms that are too hot

- The average summer temperature in Red Bluff is nearly 100 degrees, and our older classrooms get dangerously hot.
- Sometimes, this has forced us to temporarily relocate students.
- Old air conditioning systems must be replaced to keep classrooms at safe temperatures – cool in the summers and warm in our winters.



What additional repairs does Red Bluff High need?

If enacted, funds from Measure H also help:

- Improve campus safety and security
- Ensure clean drinking water



Red Bluff Joint Union High School District Career Preparation/ Repairs Measure. To provide career/ technical education facilities training students for local jobs as nurses, EMTs, firefighters, others; repair/ upgrade deteriorating classrooms and buildings; maintain clean drinking water; improve campus safety, shall Red Bluff Joint Union High School District's measure authorizing \$19,000,000 of bonds at legal rates, raising \$1,600,000 annually via levying \$19 per \$100,000 of assessed value while bonds are outstanding, requiring local control, citizen oversight, audits, public spending disclosure, no money for administrator salaries, be adopted?

Measure H Accountability Requirements & Cost

- Measure H includes accountability requirements:
 - Annual independent audits
 - Review of all expenditures by a citizens' oversight committee
 - Public disclosure of all spending
- By law, every dime of Measure H is for our local high schools, and no money can be taken by Sacramento or used for administrator salaries or benefits.
- If adopted by voters, Measure H would issue \$19 million in bonds, that would cost homeowners \$19 per \$100,000 of assessed, not market, value.
