# Supporting Early Literacy: A Message from Our Reading Specialist

#### BEGINNING OF YEAR

At the beginning of the year, we use a combination of iReady diagnostics, fluency scores, and SIPPS placement assessments to gain a clear picture of each student's current reading abilities. These tools help us identify strengths and areas of need in foundational skills, comprehension, and overall fluency. Students are placed into SIPPS groups based on the highest levels of need, meaning not all students will be placed. This allows us to prioritize targeted support and ensure that those who need the most intensive instruction receive it.

#### DYSLEXIA SCREENING

Beginning in October, we will launch dyslexia screening for students in grades K–2 as part of our early identification process. The purpose of this screening is to catch potential reading difficulties as soon as possible, allowing us to provide timely support and intervention. The screening will focus on key foundational skills such as phonological awareness, rapid naming, and letter-sound knowledge. This proactive approach ensures we can better meet the needs of our youngest learners and set them on a strong path toward reading success. More details to follow.
