Please make an initial math selection. We strongly encourage students and parents to review the Integrated Math A and Integrated Math A Honors Course Profiles (link) to guide your decision. A Mathematics Diagnostic Testing Project (MDTP) assessment of preparedness for 7th-grade mathematics will be administered to all incoming students at your child's elementary school. MDTP score reports will be sent to students and parents in the Spring with a recommendation on your child's next course enrollment for mathematics, including instructions detailing how to change your initial selection.

Students planning to take the Integrated Math B Honors Readiness Test ([IMBHRT](#)) must still make an initial math selection. Information regarding the IMBHRT and registration can be located on the SDUHSD Mathematics website. Students who pass the IMBHRT will have their schedule adjusted to reflect enrollment in the Math B Honor Readiness course.

Scheduling Guidelines		
1. Students are required to take English, Math, History, Science, PE, and one elective. We do our best to honor 1st, 2nd, or 3rd ranked elective choices.		
2. Please give careful consideration to course requests, as they inform what classes will be offered and staffing for the school year. It is the responsibility of the student/guardian to review all course selection materials, including course descriptions.		
3. Students are requesting courses only, not teachers or periods. No schedule changes will be made to accommodate off-campus, extracurricular, or athletic activities.		
4. SDUHSD Board Policy sets a four-week limit at the beginning of each semester to add or drop a class without it reflecting on the transcript. Level changes (ex. from honors) may be requested during this period only if there is space available.
