Graduation Requirements: Students must earn 220 credits to graduate (five credits per semester for courses completed with a grade of "D" or better). Credits must include: four years of English, two years of math, two years of science, three and a half years of social science, two years of physical education, one semester of health, and one year from two of the following: foreign language/technical/visual-performing arts. Up to 40 credits of non-district course work can be placed on the transcript.
