

The Importance of Having a Correct Address and Phone # on File

- Any returned mail received will cause a student's file to be flagged.

OnRamps FYI



- WC courses offered are:
 - English 3, College Algebra, Pre-Cal, US History, and Eco
- Dual Enrollment students will have the opportunity to earn college credit from a UT faculty member and high school credit from their high school teacher.
- On Ramps courses will transfer to any public Texas college or university.
- OnRamps does not have a course equivalent, so there is no level change process for this course.

GRADUATION PROGRAM



- Texas requires all students work toward one of the following graduation programs:
 - Foundations Program with Distinguished Level of Achievement (NEISD default graduation plan) – 26 credits
 - Foundations Program with Endorsements 26 credits (no Alg 2)



Foundation High School Program with Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLOA) with Endorsement

English 4.0 credits

Math 4.0 credits

Science 4.0 credits

Social Studies 4.0 credits

Foreign Languages 2.0 credits

Physical Education 1.0 credit

Health 0.5 credit

Fine Arts 1.0 credit

Electives 5.5 credits

Total credits = 26 credits + endorsement(s)

Promotion Standards



9th Grade Classification 0 - 5.5 Credits

10th Grade Classification 6 – 11.5 Credits

11th Grade Classification 12 – 18.5 Credits

12th Grade Classification 19 credits OR the student is able to enroll in all courses needed to graduate at the end of the Current school year

Rank*



NEISD does not rank*. Class rank (for top 10%) is calculated after six semesters. Final seventh-semester rank for top 10% (completed in December of senior year) is released to students in mid-January

How is Rank Determined?

- Required 26 credits, taken in grades 9-12, are multiplied by a rank factor (recognizes level of difficulty between AP/OnRamps/DC, Honors, and On-level coursework).
- Based on all courses required for graduation (ranked GPA on transcript)
- Each student's weighted cumulative grade point average is used to assign a rank position.
- Weights: Honors = 1.08 AP = 1.15 (OnRamps & DC, if AP equivalent)



Overall Grade Average / Honor Graduates

- *Honor graduate status* is determined by the <u>all-grades average</u> (not ranked GPA on transcript) for ALL courses taken in high school through the seventh semester and must be greater than or equal to 90 (does not round up)
- Honor graduates meeting the criteria specified below shall be designated as follows:
 - Summa Cum Laude 100+ Average
 - Magna Cum Laude 95-99 Average
 - Cum Laude 90-94 Average

Get College/Career/Military Ready

(It's never too early)

- Explore what you want to study
- Free SAT test for Juniors in March
- Get involved in extracurriculars both in and out of school
- Start your resume
- Take courses that challenge you with balance
- Develop good study habits



Most/All requirements met? Endorsement completed? Co-Op Options

- Non-Credited Courses
 - Senior release and/or office aide
 - Must have everything you need for graduation & endorsement on your schedule
 - No "N" Junior courses, EOC requirements met
 - Must turn in senior release form signed by parents and yourself by May 22
- Career Prep & Co-op (2-3 business elective credits)
 - Must have Career Prep in schedule
 - Can then have up to 3 periods of co-op (based on hours you work and credit status)
