Student Internet Safety Policy and Acceptable Use Agreement for Technology

Purpose and Scope

The Las Lomas Elementary School District authorizes students to use district-owned or district-provided technology for instructional purposes. Use of district technology is a privilege, not a right, and may be suspended or revoked at any time, without notice, for violations of Board policy, administrative regulation, or this Acceptable Use Agreement.

The district expects students to use technology responsibly and may impose reasonable restrictions on accessible sites, materials, and information.

District technology includes, but is not limited to, computers; networks (including servers and Wi-Fi); internet access; email; storage devices; tablets; smartphones; smart and wearable devices; telephones and cellular phones; wireless communication devices; videoconferencing platforms; and future technologies, whether accessed on or off campus and whether using district-owned or personally owned devices.

No Expectation of Privacy

Because district technology is provided for educational purposes, the district may monitor and review its use as permitted by law. Students should not expect that use of district technology will be private.

Passwords used to access district technology are provided for student use and must be kept confidential. Students may not share passwords with other students. Parents/guardians may request access credentials or account information consistent with student safety, supervision, and applicable law.

Recording Prohibited

Students may not use electronic listening or recording devices in a classroom or school-related activity without prior consent of the teacher, and when required by law, the principal, consistent with Education Code section 51512. This prohibition does not apply

where recording is expressly authorized for an educational purpose or required by a student's IEP, Section 504 plan, or other legal requirement.

Personally Owned Devices

When a personally owned device is used to access district networks or systems, the student must comply with all applicable Board policies and this Agreement. Communications transmitted through district systems may be subject to access, monitoring, or disclosure as permitted by law.

Reporting Misuse

Students must immediately report security concerns (including compromised logins or accounts) or misuse of district technology to a teacher or other district staff member.

Videoconferencing

Videoconferencing tools are provided to support instruction, communication, and professional learning. All Acceptable Use requirements apply to videoconferencing, whether used at school or at home.

Prohibited Conduct

The following are strictly prohibited and may result in loss of access, disciplinary action, and/or legal consequences:

1. **Vandalism:** Reckless or malicious acts that damage, disrupt, or degrade systems, data, or equipment, including creation or distribution of viruses, malware, spyware, keyloggers, or similar tools.
2. **Unauthorized Access:** Hacking; attempting to bypass security; accessing, altering, or using another person's account, files, or passwords without permission; or circumventing content filters, monitoring, or logging systems.
3. **Harassment and Cyberbullying:** Using technology to bully, harass, threaten, or harm others.
4. **Plagiarism and Academic Dishonesty:** Presenting others' work as one's own, failing to cite sources, or engaging in unauthorized collaboration using technology.

5. Piracy: Unauthorized duplication, downloading, or distribution of copyrighted materials, including music, movies, or software.

Artificial Intelligence and Academic Integrity

Students shall comply with all Board policies related to academic honesty and the appropriate use of emerging technologies, including artificial intelligence (see Board Policy 0441 - Artificial Intelligence and Board Policy 5131.9 - Academic Honesty). Misuse of technology in violation of these policies may result in disciplinary action and loss of technology privileges.

Student Internet Safety and Acceptable Use

To comply with the Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA), students must have a completed Student Internet Safety and Acceptable Use Agreement.

The district provides instruction and resources on digital citizenship and cyber safety. Parents/guardians are encouraged to review expectations with their student.

Student Expectations:

1. Technology access is a privilege for educational purposes only.
2. Students are responsible for their online behavior.
3. Students will use technology only for curriculum-related or teacher-directed activities.
4. Students will not damage equipment, waste resources, or use technology to harm others.
5. Real-time chatting, social media, blogging, or external email use is permitted only when teacher-directed and supervised.
6. Students must protect personal information and never share addresses, phone numbers, financial information, or account credentials.

District Rights and Internet Filtering

The district may access, review, modify, or delete student files and accounts as needed for security, maintenance, or legitimate educational purposes.

In accordance with CIPA and the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act, the district uses internet filtering and monitoring systems. These systems are not foolproof. The district is not responsible for content accessed through non-district networks or devices.

Parents/guardians are responsible for supervising student technology use outside the district network.

Liability and Consequences

Violations of this Agreement may result in loss of access, disciplinary action, suspension, and/or legal consequences.

To the extent permitted by law, the district is not responsible for loss or damage arising from student use of district technology.

Parent/Guardian Consent

As part of annual registration, parents/guardians must review this information with their student and indicate acceptance or non-acceptance of this Agreement. Electronic signatures are legally binding under the Federal E-SIGN Act.

- **Acceptance:** The student may use district technology subject to this Agreement.
- **Non-Acceptance:** The student will not be permitted to use district technology resources.
