



Loss of all quarterly extracurricular activities—including school dances and rallies—will result if the current quarter merit status falls below 100 merits.




Students who have lost merits may complete a **Merit Retrieval Contract**. Detailed information regarding merits can be found in the student handbook.

2. To provide an extra set of eyes and ears on campus.


