1. Narrative description of the Prop 28 arts education program(s) funded. In the 2024-25 school year, Butte County Office of Education spent \$2,519.05 of its \$53,877.80 remaining 23/24 annual allocation from Proposition 28. BCCS spent a portion of their funds on a teaching artist residency. While, TMS spent a portion of their funds on both a photography project and a screenprint workshop. Mesa Vista, BASES, and Early Education Programs and Services (EEPS) did not spend any of their Prop 28 funds. The remaining 23/24 funds, as well as 100% of the \$55,276.49 24/25 allocation, will be rolled over into the 2025-26 school year. Given that
