WHAT'S NEXT?

To better prepare students for post-secondary education, CUSD is bringing college to our campuses. A middle college partnership with Saddleback College will enable students to earn a diploma and college credit simultaneously. Cal Prep Academy will be adding this program with an AVID focus to provide students with the skills and support needed to help students reach their individual post-secondary goals. CUSD is also enrolling in the CSU Direct Admissions program, empowering students to earn admission through select criteria.











CUSD is always adapting and growing, in its strategies and practices, and its facilities and offerings. Developing new curriculum and courses, integrating emerging technologies, and updating and building new facilities keep CUSD on the cutting-edge of public education.

CUSD continues to make smart investments in facilities (leveraging state matching funds) while maintaining a budget that provides a healthy stability and long-term outlook. A brand new two-story classroom opened at Dana Hills High School in the fall of 2025, updated athletic facilities are in the works at Capistrano ValleyHigh School and San Clemente High School, and a brand new TK-8 school will service the Rienda community in Rancho Mission Viejo in 2027.
