

Pre-K and K-12 Tuberculosis
Screening Requirements (AB 1667) Algorithm
(Effective January 1, 2015)

New Hire not screened for TB within the past 60 days or
Current Employee due for four (4) year TB screening

CDPH/CTCA TB Risk Assessment Questionnaire
completed by a physician, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, or
registered nurse

No Risk Factors Identified

No TB test required;
Certificate of Completion issued;
New Hire may start employment or Current
Employee may continue employment; TB Risk
Assessment Questionnaire completed again in
4 years

Risk Factors Identified

TB examination, including a TB test, conducted
by a physician, surgeon, physician assistant or
nurse practitioner

TB test negative

Certificate of Completion issued; New
Hire may start employment or Current
Employee may continue employment; TB Risk
Assessment Questionnaire completed again
in 4 years

TB test positive

Chest X-Ray
with TB related abnormality

Seek treatment from personal physician;
physician reports to Public Health as required
Certificate of Completion issued; physician
certifies that employee is free of infectious
TB

Chest X-Ray
without TB related abnormality
Certificate of Completion issued

New Hire may start employment or Current Employee
may continue employment; No required 4 year TB
screening

Will need to self-report if becomes symptomatic with
signs of TB (i.e. prolonged cough, coughing up blood,
fever, night sweats, weight loss, excessive fatigue)
