2025 LEAF PICKUP PROGRAM

Chico, CA – The City of Chico Public Works Department will begin the annual leaf collection program on **November 10, 2025.** The last collection route through the City will begin on **January 1, 2026.** After the last pickup on your street in January, no more leaves may be placed in the street.

The City does not maintain a set schedule to collect residential leaves. The leaf collection route begins in the southwest section of the city and progresses northerly in a clockwise direction until the entire City is serviced. The process is then repeated. The route can take up to 6 weeks to complete.

The purpose of the program is to provide residents with a convenient disposal solution for their leaves, as well as prevent flooding and reduce organic loading to creeks. City residents are advised:

- Keep piles under 4 feet high, away from the gutter, out of bicycle lanes, and away from storm drain inlets.
- Try not to park on top of, or too close to leaf piles as the loader operator will not be able to pick them up safely.
- Make piles of leaves only no branches, prunings, bags, or trash.
- Routine, scheduled street sweeping is suspended from November through January each year.

As required by the Chico Municipal Code, property owners of commercial, multifamily properties larger than a triplex, and landscape companies servicing these properties shall not place leaves in the public right-of-way. For these properties, the City encourages the use of curbside yard waste containers, or the City's compost facility (free for loads of leaves only through December 31, 2025) located at 4441 Cohasset Road, open Tuesday through Saturday from 8:00 AM – 4:00 PM.
