Kindergarten Orientation

Hartland Consolidated Schools 2026-27 Kindergarten orientation will be held on Saturday, January 31, 2026 from 10:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. at the Hartland Educational Support Service Center, 9525 E. Highland Rd. The orientation will provide parents an opportunity to hear from kindergarten teachers about a “typical” school day and the kindergarten curriculum.

In addition, administrators will be on hand to talk about school safety, bus transportation, school attendance areas, student nutrition, Junior Kindergarten, and answer any questions. Parents may begin the online pre-enrollment process beginning February 1st at www.hartlandschools.us/enrollment. The following documents are required and may be uploaded as part of the online process:

- Birth Certificate
- Immunization Records- with proof of DTP, Polio, MMR, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox vaccines (or proof of having illness)
- Vision screen and dental screen
- Proof of Residency- examples include: certificate of occupancy, purchase agreement, builder's permit, rent receipt or agreement, mortgage statement/receipt, voter registration card, utility bill, driver's license.

Children are eligible to enroll in kindergarten if they will have their fifth (5th) birthday on or before September 1, 2026. A child who turns five after September 1st and before December 1, 2026 may enroll if parent/legal guardian signs a waiver that is supported by the school district (waiver is included in the online pre-enrollment documents). A full-day Junior Kindergarten program may be offered. A minimum number of students are required for the program to be made available. Parents may need to provide transportation in order to participate. The age requirement for Junior Kindergarten is the same as the traditional Kindergarten program. Hartland DECA Career Technology Program (CTE) Success

The Hartland High School Eagles competed in the District 4 Competition at Eastern Michigan University last week. Students competed in the Role Play Simulations for Marketing, Management, Entrepreneurship, Hospitality, and Finance. The 70+ students walked away with 49 state qualifiers, 16 test medals, and 81 total medals. 

First Semester Chronic Absenteeism

It is important to note that educational research clearly shows that students who miss 10% of instructional days struggle in school. Below you can see the percentage of chronically absent students in the first semester. This equates to missing 15 or more days already (15 is the number for the year). If your child is experiencing issues with attendance, you will be notified by the school and potentially by Mrs. Mary Jo Ferris our attendance Dean of Students. Please keep an eye on your child's attendance as we want every child to be successful in school.




