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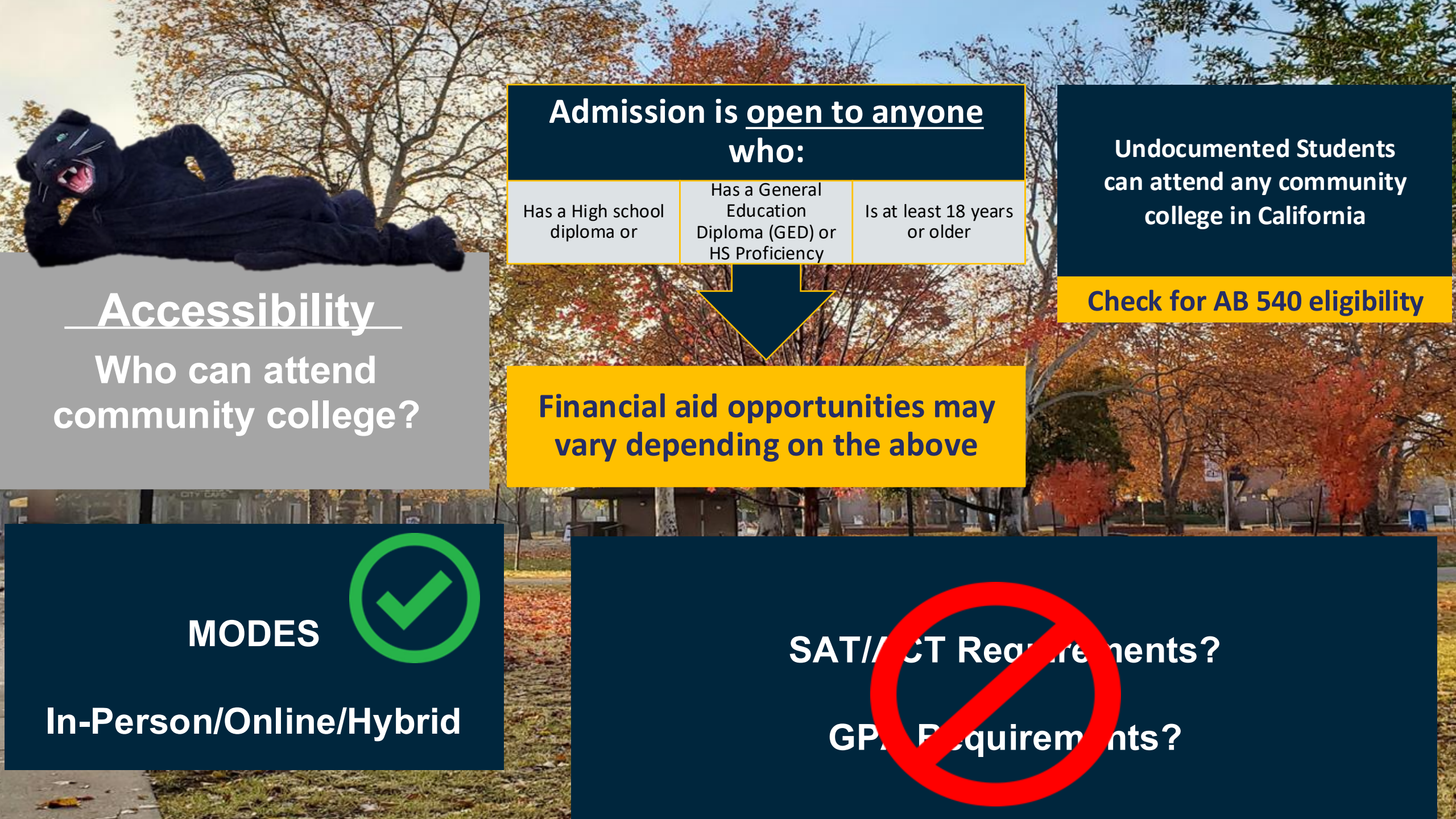

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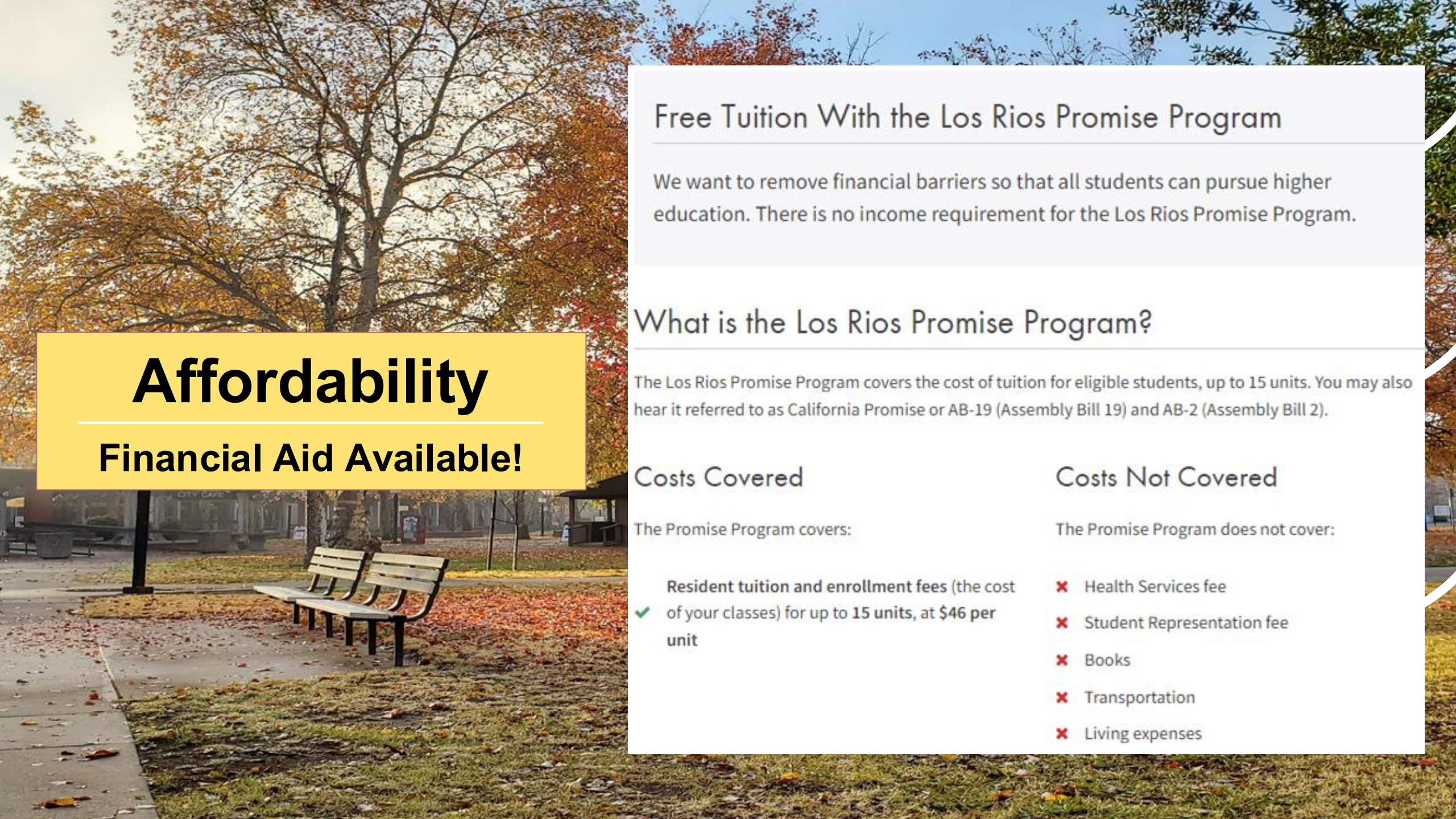

Free Tuition With the Los Rios Promise Program

We want to remove financial barriers so that all students can pursue higher education. There is no income requirement for the Los Rios Promise Program.

What is the Los Rios Promise Program?

The Los Rios Promise Program covers the cost of tuition for eligible students, up to 15 units. You may also hear it referred to as California Promise or AB-19 (Assembly Bill 19) and AB-2 (Assembly Bill 2).

Costs Covered

The Promise Program covers:

✓ Resident tuition and enrollment fees (the cost of your classes) for up to 15 units, at \$46 per unit

Costs Not Covered

The Promise Program does not cover:

- ✗ Health Services fee
- ✗ Student Representation fee
- ✗ Books
- ✗ Transportation
- ✗ Living expenses

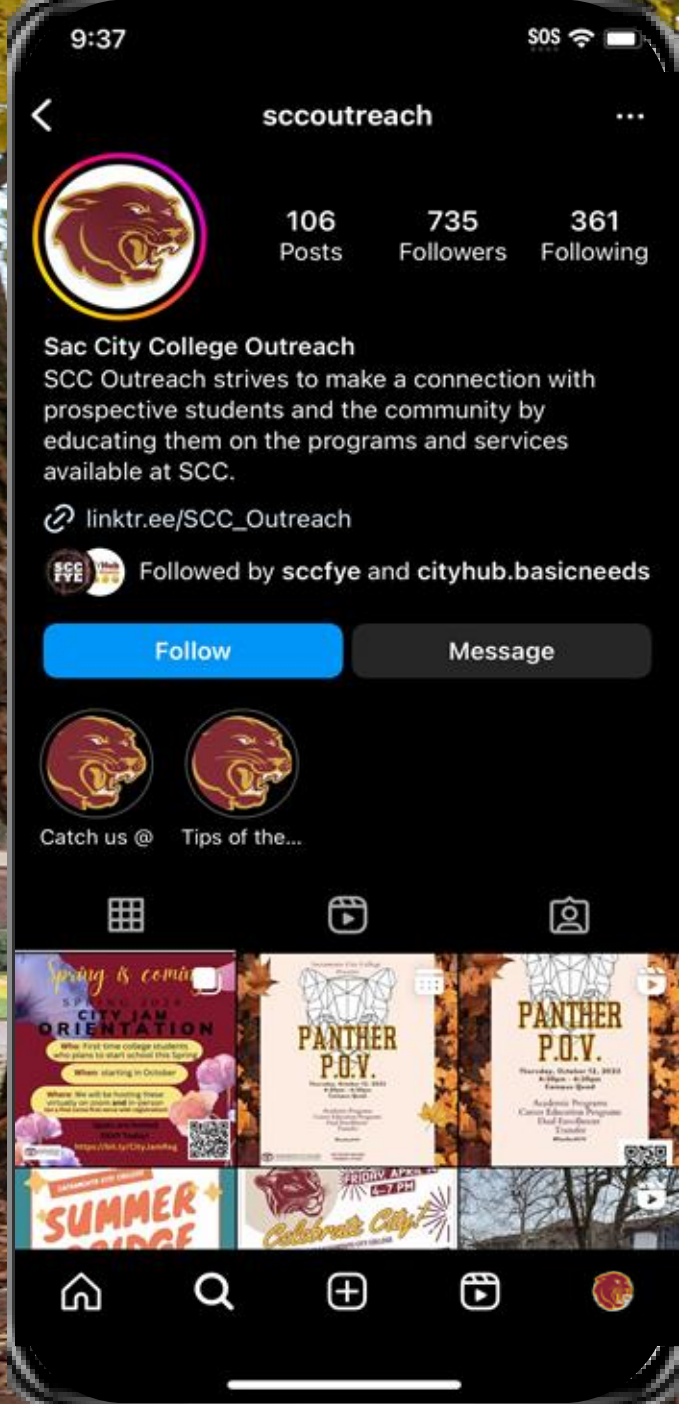

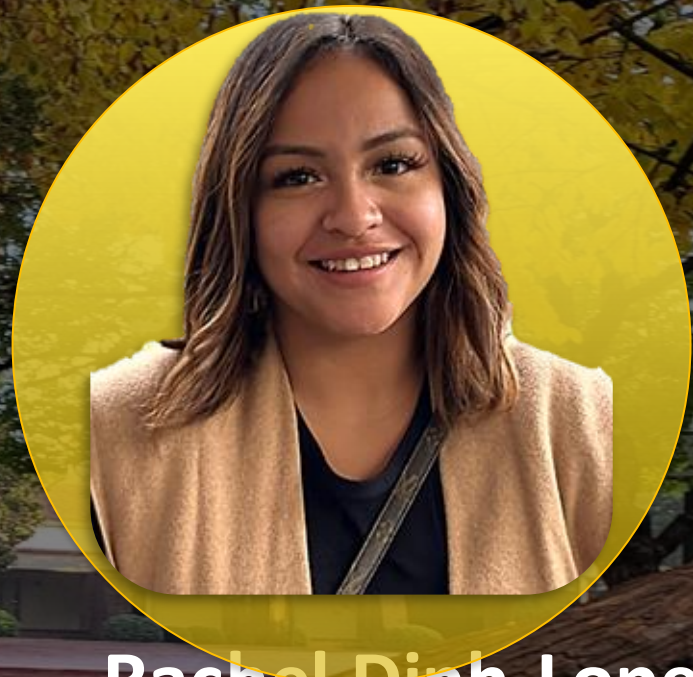
