On Tuesday, our eighth graders got to see and experience the exciting opportunities waiting for them in high school at our annual <u>Career and Technical Education</u> (CTE) Expo. With all seven high schools showcasing programs from Architectural Design to Digital Media and Agriculture and Natural Resources, students could explore the wide range of CTE pathways available to them.

Students didn't just walk through the Expo. They asked questions, tried out activities, and saw firsthand how each program brings learning to life. At the Information & Communication Technology booth, high school students guided some of the middle schoolers through programming Edison robots, giving them a chance to try coding themselves and see how technology can bring ideas to life. At one of the Building & Construction Trades booths, students donned hard hats and picked up tools to explore the fundamentals of construction, practicing safety and teamwork while getting hands-on experience with building materials and construction techniques. Throughout the Expo, there was laughter, curiosity, and discovery as students connected with their future peers and teachers.

Our district has **7,664** students in grades **9–12** enrolled in CTE—**555** are English learners and **301** are students with disabilities. We have <u>31 CTE pathways in 11 industry sectors</u> at our high schools. These programs are designed to be accessible to all students, supporting learning and growth while helping each discover a pathway that aligns with their interests and strengths.

The Expo gave our eighth graders a head start in thinking about their futures. Events like this demonstrate how our district not only prepares students for high school but also helps them develop skills and confidence to grow as learners and thrive in high school and beyond.
