

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Can I enroll my child in preschool right now?

A: Yes, you can submit an application online now for this current school year, however we are full at MOST of our sites, therefore you will be placed on a waiting list.

Q: How long will my child be on the waiting list for?

A: Unfortunately, we do not have an exact time frame as a student currently enrolled would need to "drop" from the program.

Q: When can I enroll my child for the 2026-2027 school year?

A: Open enrollment for the next school year will start at the beginning of May

Q: What program can I enroll my child in?

A: Enrollment is based on your child's age:

Preschool- Turn 3 by December 1, 2026

TK- Turn 4 by September 1, 2026

Kindergarten- Turn 5 by September 1, 2026

Q: If I am currently on the wait list will my application be rollover for the next school year?

A: No. You will need to reapply and update documents once open enrollment begins in May.

Q: Can I enroll my child at a preschool location that isn't my school of residence?

A: For preschool only families can enroll at any MJUSD preschool location by providing a proof of address within Yuba County.

Q: Is preschool enrollment first come first served?

A: No. We are a state funded preschool program which means we have to abide by the California Department of Education regulations regarding enrollment priorities.
