- IUI Diagnostic Workup (Epigenetic Sperm Quality Testing + Results Consult) to determine if IUI is the most appropriate treatment plan
- Testicular Sperm Extraction (TESE) and Percutaneous Epididymal Sperm Aspiration (PESA) procedures

How to Get Started with Kindbody

- **3** Confirm eligibility by entering access code **KINDCSVEBA** and your unique user ID as follows:
 - Employee: First Name + Last Name + -E + last four digit of your social security number (Example: JaneDoe-E1234)
 - Spouse/domestic partner: First Name + Last Name + -D + last four digit of the spouse/domestic partner's social security number (Example: JonDoe-D5678)
