## Suggested Supply List Droelle/May

## PLEASE PUT YOUR CHILD'S NAME ON ALL ITEMS.

- **PENCIL/SUPPLY BAG:** Bags work better than boxes. Boxes open up and spill when dropped. However, either will work.
- 6 POCKET FOLDERS WITH HOLES -
  - 5 SOLID COLOR folders with holes (to put in a binder)...the cheap 25-cent variety will work, but break down quickly. Your money is better spent on THE PLASTIC variety if you can. These last all year.
  - o YELLOW, RED, GREEN, BLUE, PURPLE, and another color you choose.
    - We are color-coding folders for subjects. (Note: If you can't find these colors, we will make it work!)

## 2-inch 3-ring binder

- Students will put their folders and planner in this binder. It helps them keep everything organized, and it is easier to carry
- <u>2 COMPOSITION NOTEBOOKS</u> (1 for reading/ 1 for writing) These are designed for writers. They
  usually have a <u>black and white cover</u>. Target usually has them in their dollar bins around the start of
  school, and the Dollar Store usually carries them as well. (We will use these for Reader's and Writer's
  Workshop.)
- **PENCILS** if you choose mechanical pencils, <u>make sure you have some regular pencils as backups</u>

  <u>AND YOUR OWN LEAD © We discourage the use of mechanical pencils for many reasons.</u>
- COLORED PENCILS or CRAYONS— a pack of 24 or more works best.
   NOTE: Markers will not be permitted for most coloring projects.
- **GLUE STICKS** the large ones work best, or multiple small ones
- CHECKING PENS (ballpoint pens) blue and red are best, milky pens are not acceptable for checking
- YELLOW HIGHLIGHTER
- SCISSORS
- DRY ERASE MARKERS We will be using these in math to practice our math problems.
