RE-ENROLLMENT for the 2026-27 School Year. ACTION REQUIRED.

Re-enrollment for the **2026–27 school year** is now open and will run from **December 19, 2025 through January 30, 2026**.

All current Gateway International School families who wish to return must complete the re-enrollment process **online through the Aeries Parent Portal**. This online process is required because it includes **important information beyond the Intent to Return form**, such as updated student and family details.

📄 What must be completed in Aeries:

- **Intent to Return form**
- **Required insurance information** (new requirement)

Review and update of student and parent/guardian information

Please note that while a hard copy form exists, hard copies should only be used in emergency situations. To ensure accuracy and timely processing, families are expected to complete **all re-enrollment steps digitally in Aeries**.

📄 Important Reminder:

If the Intent to Return form is **not submitted in Aeries by January 30, 2026**, the student's spot at Gateway International School for the 2026–27 school year will be forfeited.

OPEN ENROLLMENT for the 2026-27 School Year



The Open Enrollment for the next 2026-2027 school year is now open **for all NEW students** until March 6th, 2026.

All new families and students interested in applying for 2026-27 must submit an online application before the end of Open Enrollment **HERE**.

- If there are more applicants than available space, admission will be decided by a random public drawing to be held on March 20, 2026.
- Preference is given to applicants according to specifications in the NEW charter document.

Waitlist from the current year (2025-26) does not carry over to the following year (2026-27). Students on the current waitlist must reapply during the open enrollment period if they want to be considered for the following year.
