Purpose of the Overview

The *Every Student Succeeds Act* requires that each Title I School hold an Annual Meeting of Title I parents for the purpose of...

- Informing you of your school's participation in Title I
- Explaining the requirements of Title I
- Explaining your rights as parents to be involved

What is Title 1?

“...is to provide all children significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps.”

- Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)

Title I, Part A provides supplemental federal funds to help meet the educational needs of low-achieving students in the highest-poverty schools.

Schools deliver supplemental services through a schoolwide program (SWP) model.

What does it mean to be a Title 1 School?

Being a Title I school means receiving federal funding to supplement the school's existing programs.

These dollars are used for...

- Identifying students experiencing academic difficulties and providing timely assistance to help these students meet the State's challenging content standards.
- Provide supplemental staff/programs/materials/supplies
- Conducting parental Involvement meetings/trainings/activities
- Recruiting/Hiring/Retaining Highly Qualified Teachers

What are Supplemental Funds?

Additional monies above the general funds districts and schools receive to support the regular program.

Granted to districts and to schools for specific program purposes and must be used only to support and enhance the school's regular program.

May not be used to replace or supplant the funds and programs the district provides to all schools.

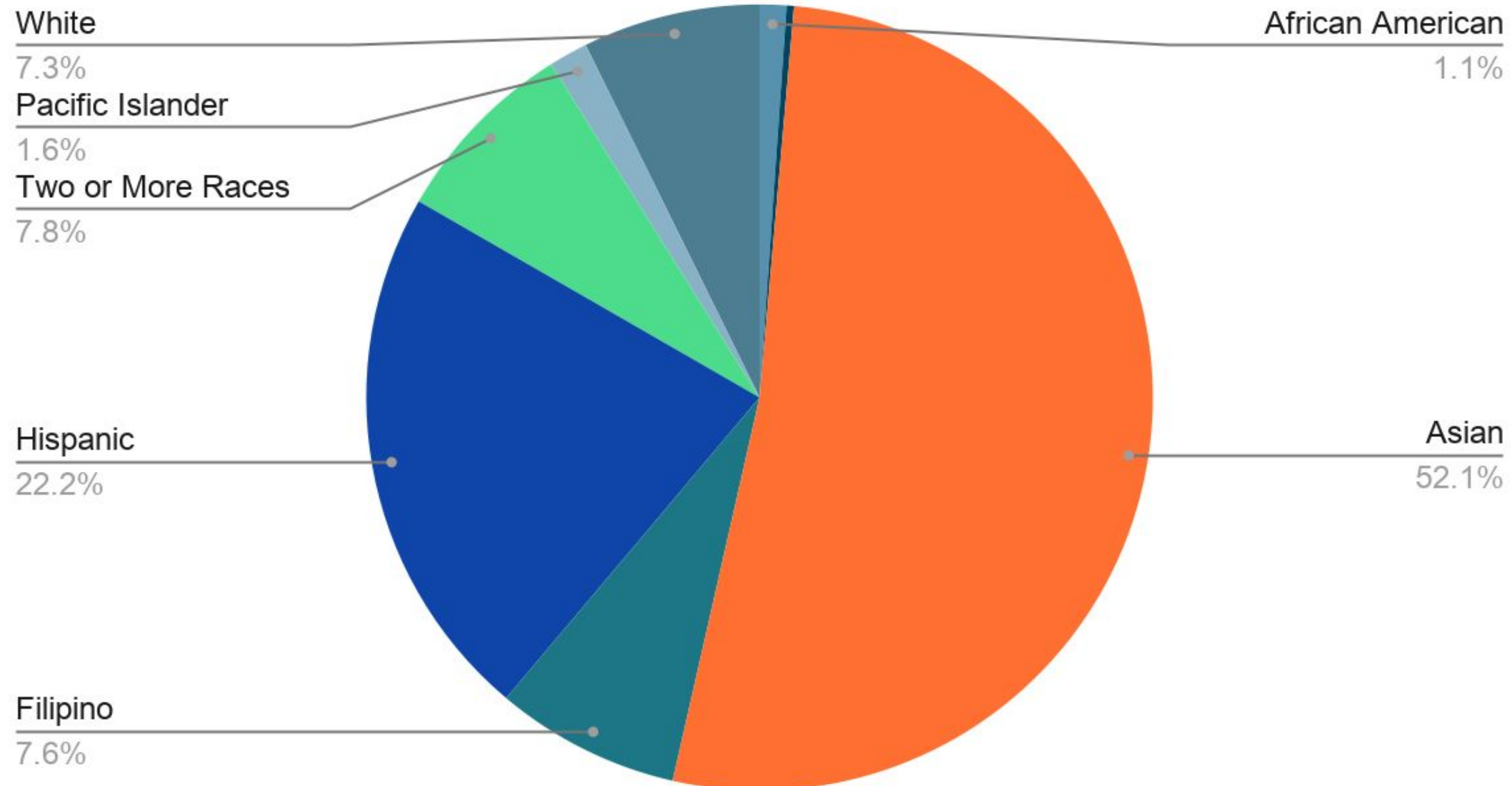

- **Communication & Information:** Provides timely information on curriculum, academic assessments, achievement standards, and progress monitoring.

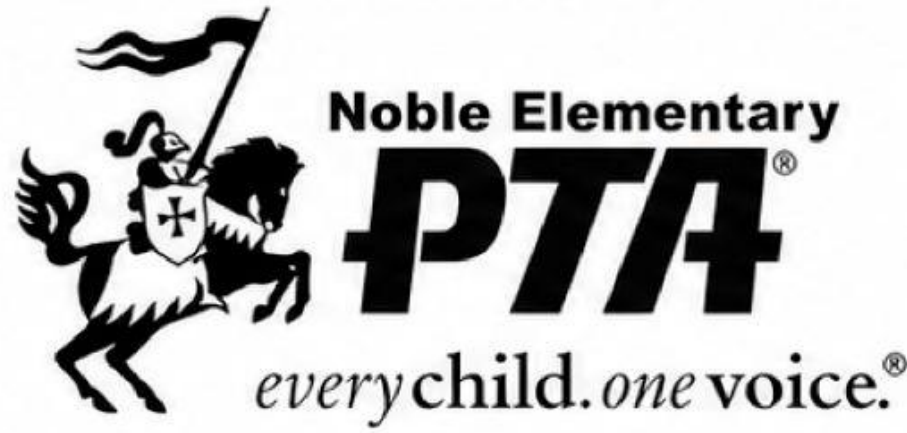
