9.2 2025-26 Grade Nine Math Course Enrollment

In accordance with Senate Bill 359, annually, the Board and the Superintendent or designee shall review student data related to placement and advancement in the mathematics courses offered at District high schools to ensure that ninth-grade students who are qualified to progress in mathematics courses based on their performance on objective academic measures are not held back in a disproportionate manner on the basis of their race, ethnicity, gender, or socioeconomic background. This report provides the Board with information about 2025-26 current ninth-grade enrollment, class size, and associated trends in mathematics courses. This report is based on data from sixth week in the school year. **Recommendation:** For Information.
