Why Do I want to be in Dual Credit/On Ramps/AP?

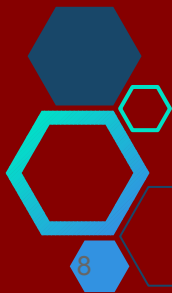
- Earns you college credit
- Saves your parents \$\$\$
- Challenging coursework prepares you for the rigor of college work!!
- Looks great on transcript when applying to college (If you make good grades!!)



On Ramps



- NEISD partners with The University of Texas at Austin to offer students the opportunity to earn college credit while in high school through an innovative Dual Enrollment program called On Ramps.
- Courses offered are: English 3, College Algebra, Pre-Cal, US History, and Eco
- Dual Enrollment students will have the opportunity to earn college credit from a UT faculty member and high school credit from their high school teacher. On Ramps courses will transfer to any public Texas college or university.
- OnRamps does not have a course equivalent, so there is no level change process for this course.




What's the difference?

AP Classes

- ◇ AP classes require taking the AP exam in May
- ◇ Most colleges and universities award college credit if you score a 3 or better on the AP exam
- ◇ AP exam(s) costs money
- ◇ AP classes are open

Dual Credit Classes: E3, E4, Ready, Set, Teach

- ◇ Once you pass the Dual Credit class, you will have a college transcript with grades to provide to the university that you attend
- ◇ Most colleges will accept the college transcript, but the colleges decide what credit that you will earn (For example, US History AP may be awarded a history elective instead of US History credit)
- ◇ Dual Credit costs nothing except the testing fee of the TSIA2 exam



GRADUATION PROGRAM



- Texas requires that all students work toward one of the following graduation programs:
 - Foundations Program with Endorsements – 26 credits (no Alg 2)
 - Foundations Program with Distinguished Level of Achievement (NEISD default graduation plan) – 26 credits



Foundation High School Program with Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLOA) with Endorsement

English 4.0 credits

Math 4.0 credits

Science 4.0 credits

Social Studies 4.0 credits

Foreign Languages 2.0 credits

Physical Education 1.0 credit

Health 0.5 credit

Fine Arts 1.0 credit

Electives 5.5 credits

Total credits= 26 credits + endorsement(s)

Texas High School Endorsements Options



- Multidisciplinary Studies
- Arts and Humanities
- STEM
- Public Service
- Business and Industry

Students will select at least one endorsement and 4 credits in the CTE program of study to meet graduation requirements.

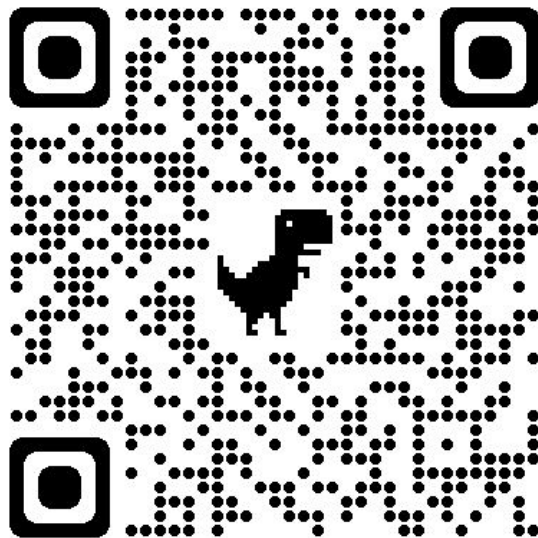

Promotion Standards



9 th Grade Classification	0 - 5.5 Credits
10 th Grade Classification	6 – 11.5 Credits
11 th Grade Classification	12 – 18.5 Credits
12 th Grade Classification	19 credits OR the student is able to enroll in all courses needed to graduate at the end of the current school year



Overall Grade Average / Honor Graduates

- It is based on the accumulation of 7 semesters of coursework by the time of graduation
- Honor graduate status is determined by the overall grade average for ALL courses taken in high school through the seventh semester and must be greater than or equal to 90
- Honor graduates meeting the criteria specified below shall be designated as follows:
 - Summa Cum Laude 100+ Average
 - Magna Cum Laude 95-99 Average
 - Cum Laude 90-94 Average

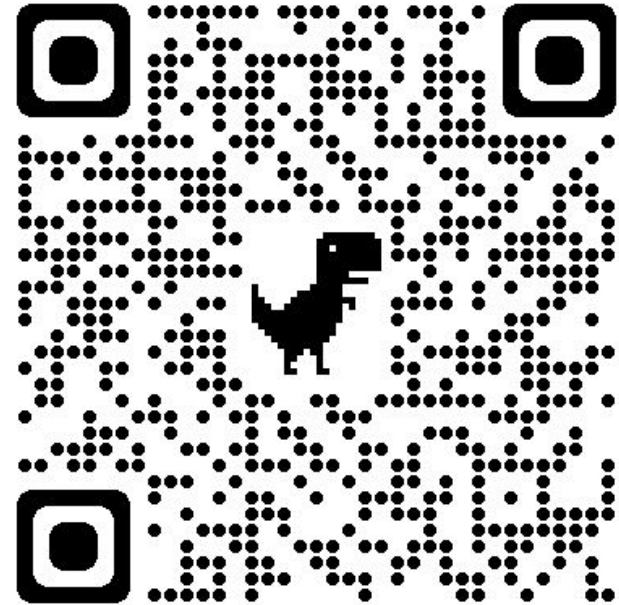
