Center High School Advanced Placement and honors courses are standards-based enriched programs designed to provide students the opportunity to think more analytically, participate in higher level discussions, and investigate the same course content and standards of the general education course but in much greater depth and with higher rigor. Students in these courses are expected to be “willing and academically prepared” (College Board), self-directed, have excellent study habits and attendance, and have an above average aptitude for the particular subject matter. Please read the following carefully and initial after each statement:

- ◆ I understand that AP and Honors courses are one full year in length and students are expected to complete the entire course per school policy. Student Initials _____
- ◆ AP courses are considered to be college level courses and students should expect one and a half (1½) to three (3) hours of homework or studying for every course. Student Initials _____
- ◆ In order for a student to earn potential college credit, the AP course test must be taken and passed in the spring. The test is not a requirement of the course. Student Initials _____
- ◆ Students who request three (3) or more AP and/or Honors courses are advised that an increased work load will occur and should thoroughly discuss this with parents/guardians. Requests to drop a class due to a heavy workload or homework will not be honored as this is a known expectation of these courses. Student Initials _____
- ◆ Some AP and Honors courses fulfill graduation requirements and are often taken in lieu of the general education course that meets the same requirement. Failing an AP or Honors course results in receiving no credit toward graduation requirements, and can affect graduation status. Most colleges do not accept grades of D or below for transfer credit.
