SELPA Administration

Through cooperation, collaboration, and a shared commitment to the families we serve, the Lassen County SELPA ensures that all students with disabilities receive high-quality education programs that prepare them to be productive global citizens. We achieve this by managing resources responsibly, ensuring compliance with all laws, and promoting equity by supporting students in the least restrictive environment. Our decisions are driven by evidence and data, with a focus on trust, transparency, and integrity in all processes. We provide high-quality, ongoing, strategic professional development to all staff. Additionally, we implement fiscally-sustainable programs to meet the evolving needs of our students.

Community Advisory Committee (CAC)

The CAC (Community Advisory Committee) advises the SELPA on the Special Education Local Plan to ensure a free and appropriate public education in the least restrictive environment. Open to parents, educators, and community members, CAC meetings foster collaboration and knowledge-sharing on special education issues.

Special Education Information System (SEIS)

Supporting an information system that houses almost all special education IEP data. The special education data for all districts within our Lassen County SELPA are updated, maintained, and supported by our County Office of Education/SELPA as a service to the districts.

Early Learning Prevention Program

The Infant/Toddler Program provides free services to children from birth to 36 months with significant developmental delays, offering educational opportunities in the home and community. We partner with families to build on strengths, address challenges, and create personalized plans to support each child's development through everyday routines and play. By providing resources, information, and guidance, we help families foster their child's growth in a natural and supportive environment.

High-Leverage Practices for Students with Disabilities Professional Learning

Equipping educators with essential strategies to enhance student outcomes through collaboration, data-driven planning, and targeted instruction. This series focuses on using assessment data to refine instructional practices and implementing specialized interventions to support both academic and behavioral needs.

Paraeducator Series Professional Learning

Providing essential skills and strategies to support student success through both high-leverage and evidence-based practices. This training covers instructional and behavioral supports, collaboration, and assessment while also offering practical tools like visual supports, self-management techniques, social skills training, and reinforcement strategies.

Transition Partnership Program

Promotes movement from school to post-school activities, including postsecondary education, vocational training, integrated employment, continuing and adult education, adult services, independent living, or community participation, ultimately resulting in gainful employment in an integrated environment.

WorkAbility I (WAI)

Providing pre-employment training, employment placement, and follow-up services for high school students with disabilities transitioning from school to work or further education. This program offers students with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) the opportunity to develop marketable job skills. Through partnerships with local businesses and state agencies, WAI helps students gain work experience and improve employability. The program's two-year follow-up support significantly increases the chances of employment success for participating students.
