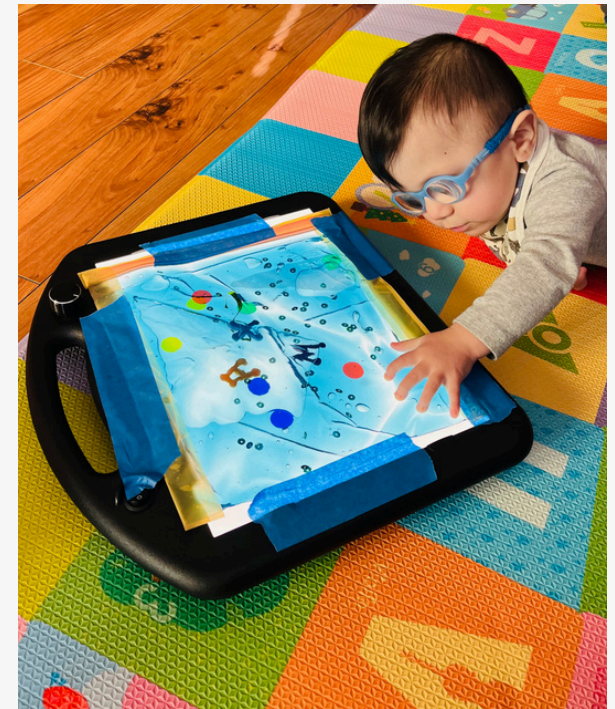

INFANT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM



ELIGIBILITY

After assessment, eligibility is determined by meeting at least one of the following criteria:

1. Infants and toddlers with a developmental delays in one or more of the following five areas of development: physical development, social or emotional development, adaptive development, vision and hearing or communication.
2. Infants and toddlers who are at high risk of having a substantial developmental disability due to a combination of risk factors as determined by the assessment team, and the parents.

OUR TEAMS

Our transdisciplinary teams bring together highly qualified professionals with advanced degrees, specialized credentials, and additional certifications—all working together around your child's unique needs. Based on eligibility and individual goals, your team may include:

RECOGNIZE

Each child and family is unique.

LISTEN

You are the expert. You know your child's likes, dislikes, strengths, and abilities. What are your concerns, hopes, and priorities?

EDUCATE

Learning for a young child happens within the context of their home and family. We help families become more aware of learning opportunities as they occur within daily routines.

SUPPORT

Opportunities to meet other families through community events and activities.

OUR SERVICES

After a child is determined to be eligible and IFSP is developed which will include the assessment, families concerns, priorities. Services will be based on the families needs and priorities, and include:

- **A relationship based approach**, includes using a strength based family centered approach to providing services.
- **Coaching strategies** to support parent and child relationships and use direct teaching, modeling, guided practice, caregiver practice, problem solving and reflection.
- **Primary home visitor model**
- **Provided in natural environments**, including the home and community settings. (IDEA Part C)
- **Embedded in natural learning opportunities, routines and environments**, such as car rides, trips to the playground, putting on a coat or shoes, singing songs, interactions with friends and family or preparing meals.
