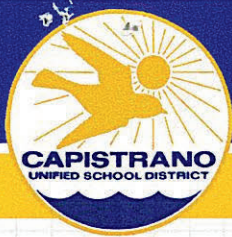

MINIMUM OF **2**
YEARS

Two years of history including one year of world history, cultures & historical geography and one year of U.S. history or one-half year of U.S. history and one-half year of government or civics.

ENGLISH "B"

MINIMUM OF **4**
YEARS

Four years of college preparatory English that integrates reading of classic and modern literature, frequent and regular writing, and practice listening and speaking.

MATHEMATICS "C"

MINIMUM OF **3**
YEARS

Three years of college-preparatory math, including or integrating the topics covered in elementary and advanced algebra and two- and three-dimensional geometry.

LABORATORY SCIENCE "D"

MINIMUM OF **2**
YEARS

Two years of laboratory science providing fundamental knowledge in at least two of the three disciplines of biology, chemistry and physics

LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH "E"

MINIMUM OF **2**
YEARS

Two years of the same language other than English or equivalent to the second level of high school instruction.

VISUAL & PERFORMING ARTS "F"

MINIMUM OF **1**
YEAR

One year chosen from dance, music, theater or the visual arts. This is also often referred to as visual and performing arts or fine arts.

COLLEGE PREPARATORY ELECTIVE "G"

MINIMUM OF **1**
YEAR

One year chosen from the "a-f" courses beyond those used to satisfy the requirements above, or courses that have been approved solely in the elective area.

ACADEMIC RECOGNITION



San Clemente High School recognizes students for academic achievement. Students with a GPA of 4.0 or higher are designated as **Valedictorians** at graduation. The **Scholar of Scholars** designation is awarded to the student with the top academic GPA. Students graduate with **Academic Distinction** by earning a 3.5 cumulative academic GPA. Each spring, teachers nominate the top students in each department for **Achievement Awards**. In addition, students may earn **Academic Letters** and the designation of **Scholar Athlete**. Membership in **National Honor Society** and **California Scholastic Federation** is available for high achieving students. In 2025, 40 students were members of NHS and demonstrated outstanding performance in all four criteria of scholarship, leadership, service, and character. There were 483 members of CSF; 170 of those were **Gold Seal Bearers**. Based on the semester eligibility GPA, students qualify for **Principal's Honor Roll** with a 3.5 or above, and for **Superintendent's Honor Roll** with a 3.85 or above.

SPECIAL PROGRAM OFFERINGS

San Clemente offers the **International Baccalaureate (IB) Program**, a comprehensive and rigorous two-year curriculum leading to examinations and diplomas for academically-prepared, highly motivated students. Students in the IB Program demonstrate a strong commitment to learning, both in terms of mastery of subject content and the development of discipline. In addition to the course curriculum, diploma candidates write an independent research paper, enroll in the IB Theory of Knowledge class, and participate in programs that involve creativity, activity, and service. **Please contact Caroline Dutton for more information: ckdutton@capousd.org.**

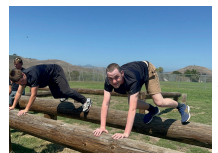
Two-Way Immersion (TWI) students have the opportunity to enroll in a rigorous TWI program at San Clemente High School, which offers students the diverse experience of learning collaboratively in classes with native Spanish and native English speakers. Students in the TWI program develop positive cross-cultural attitudes and gain a greater appreciation for international cultures. San Clemente is also a National Demonstration **AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination)** school, a highly successful four-year program that strives to close the opportunity gap for all students and prepare them for college and career success in a global society. These students have academic potential with the goal of attending a 4-year college. This past year, every AVID senior was accepted into three or more 4-year colleges. The **College and Career Advantage (CCA)** program serves the technical and career needs of students by offering course credit for classes and community based on-the-job training. Our campus features a state of the art Culinary Arts kitchen and multiple tech classrooms. ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY

- The Capistrano Unified School District's policy states that the student-athlete must have a minimum of a 2.0 grade point average at the end of each semester.
- The California Interscholastic Federation states that the student-athlete must pass at least four classes at the end of each grading period.

ATHLETIC CLEARANCE

Student Athletes **MUST** complete the following prior to tryouts for all sports (Athletic Clearance Packet)

Insurance: All student-athletes must show proof of insurance to be eligible to compete.

Physical Examination: All student-athletes are required to get a physical examination; results are accepted for a period of one year.

Code of Honor: All student-athletes (and parents) are required to sign a District "Athletic Code of Honor" form for standards of behavior.

Informed Consent: All student-athletes (and parents) are required to sign an SCHS "Informed Consent" form for awareness of sports injury risk.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Over 1,400 students participate on 78 different athletic teams in 30 sports. San Clemente Triton athletic teams are top contenders in the competitive Coast View Athletic Association of the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF).
- San Clemente is consistently ranked among the top overall athletic programs in Orange County and the CIF-SS!
- In school history (since 1964), Triton CIF-SS Athletic Teams have achieved over 260 league championships at the varsity level. This is all about continual improvement and sustained success!
- Since 2000, the Tritons have won over twenty-eight CIF Championships, eight State Championships; and nine National Championships (in Boys' Girls' Surfing).
- In 2023/2024, Boys' Cross Country won their 2nd consecutive CIF D1 Championship, were State CIF D1 Champions and finished 8th in the Nation (top school from California) in the Nike National Championships; Girls' Water Polo were State CIF Regional Champions; Boys' Wrestling were CIF-SS Finalists; Boys' Volleyball were CIF-SS Finalists & State Regional Semifinalists; Boys' & Girls' Surfing were NSSA State Champions (13th consecutive) & NSSA National Runner-Up; the Boys' Track & Field 4x800 Relay were State CIF D1 Champions (2nd consecutive); and, Nolan Rooker was the CIF-SS D1 Diving Champion.
- This past school year, 23 of our student-athletes signed National Letters of Intent (108 in the past four years) to continue their athletic endeavors at the four-year collegiate level including many of the most prestigious NCAA Athletic Programs in the Nation. This is a testament to our student-athletes and the reputation and the track record of success of our athletic program.
- Over 120 former Triton student-athletes were participating in athletics at the four-year collegiate level for the past school year.

- In recent years, some notable accomplishments by former Triton student-athletes include Dani Weatherholt who is in her 8th year playing in the NWSL for the North Carolina Courage; Sam Darnald who was the Orange County Athlete-of-the-Year, Rose Bowl MVP while at USC, a 1st round draft pick for the New York Jets, starting QB for the Minnesota Vikings, and currently playing for the Seattle Seahawks; Sean Harlow, Kyle Murphy & Cole Fotheringham all playing in the NFL; Kolby Allard is the starting pitcher for the Philadelphia Phillies; and both Andre Pallante and Michael McGreevey are starting pitchers for the St.Louis Cardinals – simply amazing.
- In the school year '23-'24, all 27 CIF sanctioned SCHS varsity athletic teams qualified for CIF-SS Academic Distinction Recognition and had a combined unweighted 3.61 GPA! 11 finished in the Top 10; 4 finished in the Top 5; and Girls' Track & Traditional Competitive Cheer finished as runners-up! Triton Athletics continues to raise the bar in furthering our culture of emphasizing what matters most in education, producing dedicated, hard-working **STUDENT**-Athletes!

In order to ensure a successful transition to SCHS, please reach out to our registrar, Bonita Perez (boperez@capousd.org), for questions regarding the enrollment process and our graduation requirements. The Counseling Department can also arrange for members of Link Crew to reach out to new transfer students and help guide them through life at San Clemente High School. Link Crew is composed of a selective group of juniors and seniors who are specially trained to help create a safe and supportive school environment for our new Tritons.

For our base families, there is a school bus that will take your child to and from school. Bus Pass Applications are accepted in person at the Transportation Office, not at the CUSD head office or at the school site.

FAQs for Incoming 9th Graders

How can I stay updated on what is happening at San Clemente?

Answer: You should regularly check the SCHS website, www.sctritons.org, for detailed information about school programs, upcoming events, school staff and academics. Please make sure the student and parent email addresses in your parent and student AERIES portals are correct. They will be used for important announcements throughout the year and the weekly edition of Triton News, an electronic newsletter with information and resources for all students and families.

What is the AERIES Parent Portal and AERIES Student Portal?

Answer: AERIES has two different portals to help students and parents. The AERIES Student Portal is the only method students have for course selection throughout high school. It also allows the student to see transcripts, test scores, and other permanent data. Every student **MUST** have an account. This website also has some help sheets and video support. Current CUSD 8th grade students will receive help from their middle school for the necessary information to create their AERIES Student Portal. Non-CUSD students will receive this information during their enrollment with our registrar, Bonita Perez, email: boperez@capousd.org. All parents **MUST** also have their own AERIES Parent Portal to complete the annual registration process at Walk-Through Registration every summer.

What is Canvas?

Answer: Canvas is a course management system that supports instruction and learning. It allows teachers to post grades, assignments, announcements and serves as a communication tool. Parents will create an observer account in Canvas once their Triton starts the new school year. Parents will be able to monitor their student's progress and stay current with their student's courses. It also allows the parent and student to send written messages to each of the student's teachers.

My child attended a non-CUSD school during the current school year. When/how do we enroll?

Answer: Non-CUSD student enrollment for the 2026-2027 school year will open January 5th, 2026. You will need to submit the online enrollment form, and then submit the required supporting documents to our registrar, Bonita Perez, through email, boperez@capousd.org, or in person. Upon receiving and verifying all documents, a meeting will be set for you and your student to speak with their Counselor later in our spring semester to discuss their Fall 2026 schedule of classes.

How many classes will my student take during their freshman year?

Answer: We want to give every student a full schedule to successfully complete their 4-year plan. We have a wide range of college prep and advanced courses that achieve graduation requirements, a-g requirements, college credit and career pathways. Freshmen will be enrolled in 6 courses. If a student would like an additional course, they may have an option for a "0" period and will choose "0 period request" when time to choose course requests.

Can my student take Honors courses?

Answer: Yes, we offer a variety of Honors courses for our students. Honors courses in Science, English, Math, and Social Science have specific CUSD placement criteria that can be found on the Future Tritons website. Have your student continue to work hard the remainder of the year as final 4th quarter grades will be taken into consideration. Some weighted elective courses are also available for freshmen.

When can my student take AP or IB courses?

Answer: Select AP courses are available as early as sophomore year. IB courses become available in the junior year. Our IB program meets with potential students during their freshman and sophomore year to help build a well-rounded pathway for success.

Is there summer school for incoming 9th graders?

Answer: Summer school information will be available mid-February for incoming 9th grade students. CUSD 8th graders will enroll with their MIDDLE SCHOOL counselors.

Will my child take Health as a 9th grader?

Answer: All 9th graders will be enrolled in a year long combination of Health and College/Career Planning (CCP) as part of their full 6 course schedule. This is a very valuable combination of courses that we have seen students benefit from. If a student wants to choose a different elective course in lieu of the Health/CCP combo, they will need to select an elective course in their AERIES Student Portal during the course request window and speak to their 8th grade Counselor to register for Health during summer (when it is open). *Non-CUSD students will be able to register when they meet with their SCHS Counselor to select their Fall schedule.

What world languages are offered at SCHS?

Answer: We offer Spanish, French and Sign Language. Please note: There is very limited availability in Sign Language, so you will need to select a second choice as well. Also, Sign Language does NOT offer any AP or IB levels.

Can my student request a specific teacher or specific periods?

Answer: No, we do not honor teacher requests, teacher changes or period requests.

If my student took a world language in middle school, do they have to go into an advanced level of that language as a freshman?

Answer: If the student has developed a strong foundation of the language in middle school, they may select a higher level of the language in the Aeries Student Portal. However, the vast majority of freshmen choose to enroll in the lowest level of their chosen language, even if they took the language in middle school. This can help the student build a strong foundation. If requested during the first couple weeks of the semester, our world language teachers can assess a student for potential advancement into the next level. Although Spanish taken at the middle school level can allow a student to advance into the next level of the language, it will not count as credit towards high school graduation.

My student is part of the Two-Way Immersion program. What elective courses should be selected?

Answer: Students in the TWI program at BAMS can choose one of two pathways at SCHS. Full details can be seen on the TWI page of our website. We have a Standard Pathway - TWIS III in 9th grade, and wait until 10th grade to take TWI World History, and an Accelerated Pathway - Spanish 4 AND Honors TWI World History in 9th grade.

Do you have a homework/tutor center?

Answer: Yes, our San Clemente Educational Foundation sponsors free after-school tutoring services throughout the week (M-Th). Tutoring is offered by a rotation of SCHS teachers, as well as peer tutors. No sign-ups required; walk-ins welcome.

Can my child have a zero period?

Answer: A zero period may be granted to students with impacted schedules (more than 6 classes). We confirm these requests at Walk-Thru Registration.

Is it true that the school is too big and overcrowded?

Answer: Not true. We have the same class size as all other high schools within the Capistrano Unified School District. There may be a few more students in the halls during passing periods and an energized, packed student section at our school events, but the actual class sizes are the same. If a school has more students, it will have more teachers; if a school has less students, it will have less teachers. We have a large campus that affords us a large amount of support, programs and opportunities for all students.

Do sports/extracurricular activities require tryouts/auditions?

Answer: Most sports require a tryout, but wrestling and freshman football do not (see next section for specific athletic FAQs). Some programs such as AVID or yearbook require applications for incoming 9th graders. Also, our after-school theater and higher levels of performing arts require auditions. You can get more tryout information by contacting each program's director and/or coach.

Triton Athletics FAQs

I have heard that the Triton Athletic Program is too competitive & I may not have a place in it?

Answer: We have been successful across the board but that does not mean we don't have a place for you in our CIF competitive athletic program. We offer 28 sports and 72 individual teams (over 1400 student-athletes) and we are not in the business of excluding anyone. Yes, many sports do have tryouts, that is the nature of a competitive athletic program, but we have increased our opportunities for participation by adding sports and levels to accommodate as many athletes as we can; in fact, in some sports such as football, boys' wrestling and girls' wrestling, simple commitment, dedication and a strong work ethic will be enough to make it in those programs.

My student will be trying out for a sport for the second semester. Do they have to be in PE in the first semester?

Answer: Yes. All freshmen must be enrolled in either an approved PE course or athletic sport during both semesters. We only place students in set athletic periods (that require a tryout) after receiving approval from the specific head coach.

Why is the Triton Athletic Program so successful?

Answer: First of all, we have dedicated coaches that genuinely care about kids – many of whom have been at this for many years here at SCHS. They are not here for the money, many are educational professionals that have dedicated their lives to the profession, and most of our entire coaching staff actually live in San Clemente. Second, we have great student-athletes that understand that they are actually STUDENT-athletes; they clearly understand our culture of expecting our athletes to be committed students first. Dedicated, hard-working students carry over into dedicated, hard-working athletes.

Why is it important that so many coaches live within San Clemente?

Answer: We believe this is the one thing that sets us apart from all other high schools in the area. When a coach does not live close by, the connection to the program is often turned off when they go home to a distant community. Most of our coaching staff lives within San Clemente and the difference is in how they interact with their student-athletes; they become relationship-builders and transformational leaders rather than simply trying to win games on Friday nights which is the transactional part of the business of high school athletics. Yes, we want to be successful on the scoreboard, but coaches are more apt to treat kids with respect and love when they are going to see their athletes and parents within the community they live in, whether it be at the grocery store or at the beach. A coach that is purely transactional in their approach will not last long in this community. As a parent, this is probably the most important cultural difference within our Triton Athletic Program.

What about summer practice?

Answer: Many of our programs do have summer practice and/or competitions. They generally begin right after school gets out. More information will be forthcoming this Spring. All athletes will need to be cleared prior to summer (turning in their Athletic Clearance Paperwork online). Instructions for the athletic clearance process are located in the FAQs below and on the athletic website: www.sanclementeathletics.com.

I'm in! What do I need to do now to be a Triton Student-Athlete?

Answer: It's easy! You just need to fill out and turn in your Athletic Clearance Paperwork online by going to www.sctritions.org – click on Athletics – click on Athletic Clearance. Follow the directions and upload your physical examination and medical insurance card. Note: We begin to accept these starting in mid-May of the current school year (yes, while you are finishing up 8th grade).
