Tab 10-Scholarship for Graduating Seniors of Veterans

A. Administration of the Scholarship

- 1. The Ashtabula Veterans Service Commission (AVSC) is committed to building, maintaining, and collaborating positive relationships with the local businesses, other agencies, veterans, and their families. Inserting funds back into the community in support of veteran families is one means of achieving these positive relationships.
- 2. As part of its outreach and advertising initiative to promote awareness of veteran services, the AVSC may annually award one scholarship to a graduating senior, who is a dependent of an eligible veteran, from each of the nine high schools within Ashtabula County. Those schools are as follows:

NOTE: Dependent children of employees of the AVSC are not eligible to receive this scholarship, as their application would be considered a conflict of interest to the program.

B. Scholarship Requirements

- 1. Graduate/Applicant must be a biological, adopted, or step child of the veteran (parent)
- 2. Veteran must be an eligible veteran in accordance with Ohio Revised Code and the Ohio Attorney General's definition of a veteran, and verified as a veteran within the AVSC office.
 - a) Eligibility requirements
 - Character of Discharge is Honorable or Under Honorable Conditions

- Veteran is a resident of Ashtabula County
- Reservists and National Guardsmen must have served for purposes other than training, under federal orders and have a DD Form 214 from that period of service with a character of discharge that is Honorable or Under Honorable Conditions
- AVSC must have proof of dependency on file. This can be achieved by providing a birth certificate or legal adoption documents. For step children, marriage documents and birth certificates shall be on file with the AVSC.
- 3. Current report card showing a grade point average of 3.0 or higher
- 4. Recommendation letter by school faculty member on school letterhead
- 5. Applicant is required to write a 500-word essay on a topic specified by the AVSC during the year of the award.
 - a) Essay will be typed and signed by the graduate for legibility.
 - b) Essay must be original in content. The use of AI technology will be grounds for termination of eligibility for the scholarship.
- 6. Proof of higher education (traditional or trade school) shall be provided to the AVSC prior to distribution of the scholarship.
 - a) Recipient may provide one of the following items as proof of higher education:
 - Enrollment Verification Letter
 - Tuition Receipt or Bill
 - Class Schedule
 - Student ID Card
- 7. All eligibilities and documents in support of the scholarship must be submitted to the Attention of the AVSC Executive Director no later than the first business day of April.

C. Scholarship Selection

- 1. AVSC will verify applicant meets eligibility criteria prior to bringing the application before the Board of Commissioners. Any applicant not meeting eligibility for the scholarship will be notified by phone in case more documentation is required.
- 2. AVSC Board of Commissioners will review all eligible applicants during Work Session prior to the second Board Meeting of April (third Wednesday). The Board will vote on one scholarship recipient per school during that meeting.
- 3. Scholarship amount will be determined based on the following considerations:
 - a) AVSC will set aside \$4,500 in a scholarship fund each year as part of the annual advertising budget. The minimum award will be \$500 per recipient.
 - b) AVSC will accept donations from the Ashtabula community to be applied to the scholarship fund each year. These donations will increase the total scholarship value per student.
 - c) The scholarship fund will be divided by nine schools. If the AVSC does not receive applications from each of the nine eligible schools, the fund will be divided by the number of schools represented in that year's applicant pool.
- 4. AVSC representatives will attend each school's Senior Award Night to deliver a check to the named recipient.

Essay Guidelines:

- Length: No more than 500 words
- Content:
 - Your essay <u>must incorporate personal experience(s)</u> that illustrate your understanding or expression of patriotism.
 - These experiences may include family traditions, community service, military connections, civic engagement, or moments that inspired pride in your country.
- Originality:
 - O <u>Do not use artificial intelligence (AI)</u> or automated writing tools to generate or assist with your essay.
 - O Your submission must be entirely your own work, written in your own voice.

Submission Instructions:

- Type your essay and print a physical copy.
- Include your full name and date at the top of the page.
- Submit your completed essay in person along with all other required application materials.
