LCAP Goal 1: High-Quality Teaching and Learning. Instructional improvement and staff capacity-building remain a priority.

- Our Kindergarten & TK teachers attended the California Kindergarten Conference in Santa Rosa, strengthening Murdock's TK & Kindergarten. They came back energized, excited, and revitalized. It was wonderful listening to their feedback!
- **Elizabeth Hansen, Annie, Mascadri, & Bailey Payor** went to Redding to the California Curriculum Adoption math workshop. They attended with Michelle & 2 WIS teachers as well. They worked together using rubrics to help identify a quality math curriculum. They also reported great information and collaboration from this Math team!
- **ELD Huddle** with Kate and Nicole - ELPAC testing will begin Feb. 23rd. They have created a fresh system that ensures the best practices: settings, schedules, times, & protocols. Their students report that they are ready to take it. We have 82 students who will take the ELPAC!
- I attended many **Special Education staffing meetings, daily IEP meetings, & meet with Kile Taylor, the Program Specialist, weekly.** We review student services, supports, and individual needs to ensure appropriate alignment, compliance, & improvement.

LCAP Goal 2: Student Engagement, Support, and Wellness-Supporting the whole child remains central to our work.

- Yolanda and I created a new support for our teachers: **Pre-SST Intervention Plan & Meetings** to support teachers earlier & often. When teachers have concerns & students are struggling, we want to help strengthen Tier 1 in-class supports and plan interventions to collect data before moving to formal SST requests.
- **Behavior Support:** Reinforced clear systems for teachers to call for the behavior aide to help and ensured adult follow-through when students need support during the school day. This will also ensure we are improving response time, and ensure behavior data is captured consistently to drive support needs.

- **Solution Tree Coach Casey Ahner** spent the whole day meeting with each grade level and then again with our Murdock Coalition at the end of the day on January 22nd. This was an amazing opportunity, and every grade level was supported exactly where they needed to be successful with the work we are doing to ensure high levels of learning for all students. By the end of our Coalition meeting, we created our PURPOSE Statement: **The purpose of Murdock's Guiding Coalition is to lead our PLC toward consistent, purposeful collaboration by establishing clear expectations that ensure high levels of learning and success for all students.**
