
Why Are We Here Today?




What is Title 1

Part A?

Title 1 funds can be used to supplement a schools existing programs. How NEISD uses Title 1 Part A...

- **Purchasing supplemental: staff, programs, materials, and supplies**
- **Identifying students experiencing academic difficulties and providing support and assistance to help students meet the State's challenging content standards.**
- **Support learning through Parent and Family Engagement, meetings, trainings, and other activities linked to learning.**



Supplemental funding for resources to support schools with high concentrations of students from low-income families to provide a high-quality education that will enable all children to meet the state's student performance standards.



State Compensatory Education (SCE)



What is the purpose of State Compensatory Education (SCE)?

The Texas Education Code (TEC) §29.081, defines SCE as programs and services designed to supplement the regular education program for students identified as at risk of dropping out of school.

The purpose is to increase the academic achievement and reduce the dropout rate of these students.

The SCE program provides a challenging and meaningful instructional program to close the achievement gap between students at risk of dropping out of school and their peers.

SCE funds must be used ***to provide support programs and/or services that supplement the regular education program*** so that the intended beneficiaries, defined by statute, can succeed in school.


Decreasing the achievement gap between at-risk students, educationally disadvantaged students, and their peers and correlating the dropout rate are primary goals of this program.

*Students are identified as *at-risk* if they meet one or more state indicators as per [Texas Education Code 29.081](#).



Title and State Compensatory Education Program Evaluation




- **District and Campus Instructional Improvement Plans support state and federal expenditures**
- **Comprehensive Needs Assessments (CNA) is used to identify strengths and weaknesses of existing supplemental programs, activities, practices, procedures, and personnel funded out of these resources**
- **Timelines for monitoring programs and strategies are listed through summative and formative checks on the CIIPs and DIIP**
- **Formative evaluation and summative evaluation criteria are developed to support appropriate expenditures and successful implementation of all supplemental resources**
