TK-5, TK-5 would require rezoning of our district into two zones. This process is costly and takes at least a year to do the study and then a year to put it in place. \$40,000 to \$80,000 plus consultant costs (@\$100-\$300 an hour) and people would still be unhappy with the zones.
