82% of Churchill High School 504 graduates were accepted to a post-secondary institution: 54% planned to attend a 4-year institution and 36% planned to attend a 2-year program. Three percent planned to serve in the armed forces.

The Class of 2026 was offered a total of \$18,774 million in scholarships.

CURRICULUM

Our faculty provides a multi-level curriculum, including Advanced Placement, Dual Credit, ON-Ramps, Gifted/Talented, Honors, Regular, and Developmental courses that give students the opportunity to pursue unique programs that meet their individual needs. In addition to academics, a wide variety of extracurricular activities are available to our students in the areas of Athletics, Band, Choir, Dance, Debate, Journalism, Orchestra, ROTC, Spirit Groups, Theatre and Visual Arts.

Churchill offers 27 AP, 8 On-Ramps, 1 Dual Credit and 24 Honors courses in the areas of English, Math, Science, Social Studies, World Language, Fine Arts, and Computer Science.

A variety of Career & Technical courses are offered in the areas of Health Science, Human Services, Business, Technology, Engineering, and Video Technology. There are also opportunities for cooperative work programs, clinical rotations, automotive technology, welding, and HVAC programs.

Students must be considered College Ready

NEISD DOES NOT RANK

Required graduation courses, up to a maximum of 26 credits, taken in grades 9-12 through the end of the seventh semester will be used to calculate Class Rank for Top 10 % only.. *The following are excluded from rank/GPA: courses repeated/taken more than once, high school courses taken in middle school, pass/fail credit classes, courses completed through credit by exam, courses taken in summer foreign study, or with an ARD exemption.*

Certain courses are Weighted for GPA factors are used to calculate the rank points for each course

Regular: 1.00

Honor graduates are designated by using the student's 7th semester overall weighted grade point average. Students must be on the Foundation High School Program-Distinguished Level of Achievement to be an honor graduate.
