Transitional Kindergarten Info Night

LLESD invites families to learn about our Transitional Kindergarten (TK) program. TK is the first year of a two-year kindergarten program for four and five-year-olds. It addresses language, literacy, and pre-math skills with emphasis on social-emotional development and learning through play.

Credentialed teachers with early childhood training teach the program 5 days a week from 8:15 AM-1:30 PM. Students explore, create, and learn through play-based activities that integrate social-emotional, fine motor, and academic skills to build a strong foundation for kindergarten. CA School Dashboard

The California Department of Education (CDE) is pleased to announce the public release of the 2025 California School Dashboard and DataQuest Reports.

We have strong positive feedback and two areas of improvement. There are five color bands, red to blue, with blue being the highest achievement and red being the lowest achievement.

Opportunities for Improvement



Chronic Absenteeism: Two student groups are in red (students with disabilities and socioeconomically disadvantaged) and two in yellow (white and English learners). Our new attendance monitoring system should reduce chronic absenteeism.



English Learner Progress: We experienced a decline of 7.3% of our ELs making progress towards English Proficiency. This is an area of focus for both sites.



LLESD's tenant at the Ladera site, Woodland School, has created a Ladera Neighborhood Portal on its website consolidating all school-related information for neighbors. This fall, three amazing volunteers—Justin Dust Zadeh, Christine Arnould, and Elena Strelchenko—stepped forward to support students by facilitating small French conversation groups of 2–4 students each week, bringing energy, authenticity, and joie de vivre to our French 2 program. Earlier this year, when our French teacher took a leave of absence, we shifted French 2 to online learning to maintain continuity. While effective, online learning can't fully replace conversation—the heart of language acquisition.

Thanks to these volunteers, students now speak, listen, and connect *en français* with real humans in real time.

Their support exemplifies what happens when a community rallies around learners: stronger skills, greater confidence, and meaningful connection. C'est magnifique.

Our Math Pathways Design Team has been working this fall to improve middle school math offerings and deepen engagement and differentiation—both support and extension—across elementary grades. As we shape the next phase of math instruction, your perspective is essential.

Fresh Water, Healthier Staff, Greener Schools

This fall, our MOT team installed water-filtration systems in staff lounges and nurses' offices at both schools, plus the District Office and Bus Yard/Shop kitchen areas.

Look for new placards above designated sinks marking where filtered drinking water is available. Why? To give staff easy access to clean, filtered water and eliminate plastic bottles on campus.
