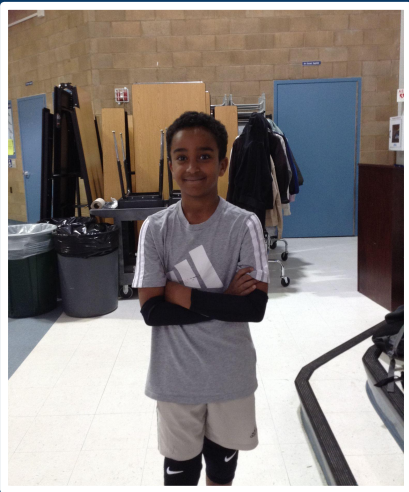


# VOLLEYBALL!

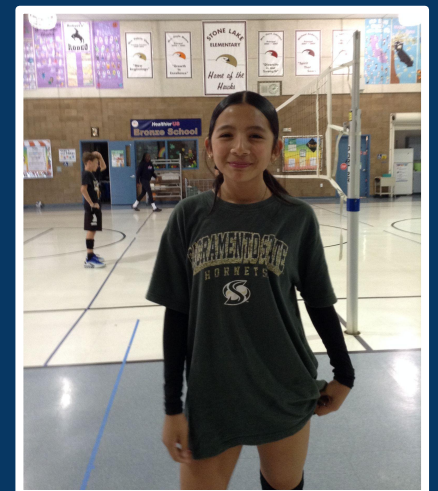
