

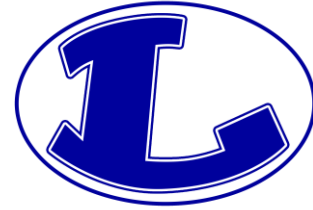

### **Krista Ellis, School Health updates**

#### **Energy Drink Policy Discussion**

Krista Ellis presented a proposed policy to ban energy drinks on campus due to health and liability concerns, noting they are not recommended for children under 18. Parents expressed support for the ban and shared concerns about students bringing energy drinks and energy sticks to school. The group agreed to move forward with banning energy drinks on campus. Krista also discussed providing student education through classes and informational flyers. It was noted that other schools in West Texas and across the state have already implemented similar bans.

#### **Campus Coordinated School Health Team Updates**

##### **KWE: Dana Tatum**

Nurse Tatum provided education on water safety, poison safety, summer safety, oral health, puberty education for 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade boys and girls, and the Ask, Listen, and Learn program for fifth graders. BSW representatives also visited and spoke with students. PreK–Kinder Round-Up was held with 18 attendees. Student immunizations remain up to date, with 30 affidavits on file.

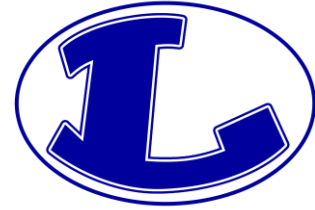
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Health office visits totaled 2,390. Reported illnesses included GI-related symptoms, 6 flu cases in the last three months, 4 RSV cases, and 7 strep throat cases. One major on-campus injury involving a fracture was reported, along with 4 TCHATT referrals.

**Coach Roberts:** Competition of Marathon runs, Heart challenge completed, Field Day is Friday, and coach has backup plans for rainy weather.

### **HSE: Billie Shifflett**

Nurse Billie reported that student immunizations are up to date, with 37 affidavits on file and reminder letters sent home. Puberty education was completed for 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade boys and girls, and reminders were also sent for failed vision screenings, with 6 students utilizing Lions Club services.

The nurse's office recorded 983 visits since last SHAC and a yearly send home of 9% out of all visits. Reported health concerns included a GI bug and one confirmed fracture. No Goodside Health or TCHATT referrals were reported.

### **TCE: Leslie Anderson**

Nurse Leslie reported that hearing and vision screenings were completed, along with scoliosis screenings for 5th grade girls. Puberty education was completed for both boys and girls. Two vaccines were administered as part of the catch-up schedule, and six affidavits were prepared and sent to the middle school. New reminder letters were also sent home.

The nurse's office recorded 1,234 visits since the last SHAC meeting. Reported health concerns included GI-related issues. No Goodside Health visits were reported, and TCHATT services were discussed. Field Day preparations and the upcoming event were also noted as they moved to May 13<sup>th</sup> from this week due to rain.

**Coach Robinson:** Reports all PFAI is submitted.

### **LMS: Brittany Kite**

Nurse Kite reported completion of CPR and Stop the Bleed training for 300 eighth grade students as part of the graduation requirement, with all students completing the training except for one student who refused. The campus also completed EKG screenings for 35 students, with only one abnormal result reported for a student with preexisting health

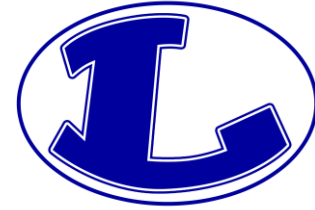
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conditions and 1 abnormal for a staff member. Health concerns included two confirmed cases of mononucleosis, weather-related injuries, and three fractures involving one cheek and two ankles. One affidavit expired during the reporting period and parents are planning to provide an updated one. The nurse's office recorded 3,608 visits since this time last year, which is down from previous year. Clinic visits of 1,166 since last SHAC meeting. All incoming 7<sup>th</sup> grader immunization requirement letters have been sent home, and all expiring affidavit notices have been sent home as well.

### **LHS: Audrey Coffman**

Nurse Coffman reported that student immunizations are up to date, with 60 affidavits on file. EKG screenings were conducted for 19 students and 2 staff, no abnormal results. CPR requirements have been completed for seniors to graduate, and the campus recently hosted its last blood drive. The nurse's office recorded 4,057 visits this year, 1000 over last year's numbers, noting 1,239 since last SHAC meeting. Many Energy drink symptoms resulting in dizziness and anxiety.

### **Nutrition Department (Mr. Pittman)**

Not present. Mr. Pittman is retiring at end of the year, and replacement hasn't been announced.

### **Agency Updates**

Karen reported that AG life for Friday for Hanna Springs is cancelled due to weather for all 5<sup>th</sup> graders. She provided information regarding Alzheimer's and the mental health class that will be for LISD staff at the Annex for the summer.

### **Parent questions/concern**

Parents expressed appreciation for the EKG screenings. Questions were raised regarding water availability at Field Day; students are encouraged to bring their own water bottles, though additional water will be provided. Parents also shared concerns related to a past Field Day incident regarding head laceration at Turner's Field and Heat Exhaustion and concerns of medical staff presence, and those concerns were addressed and reassured by staff with a plan in place for medical staff presence this year for field days at Turner Field. Majority of events due to weather will remain on campus of HSE.
