School and Community

Edgewood High School is a public high school that serves students in grades 9-12. In addition to Edgewood High School, the Buckeye Local School District includes 2 elementary schools (K-5), and one middle school (6-8). BLSD is located about an hour east of Cleveland in a rural area along the coast of Lake Erie.

Class Ranking

Class Rank is determined by cumulative weighted GPA. The Valedictorian, Salutatorian, and Top Ten Students from the class are calculated as follows: 1) Cumulative Weighted Grade Point Average, 2) total number of upper level classes taken, and 3) total number of total credits earned.

D = 60 – 69 **F** = 59 and below

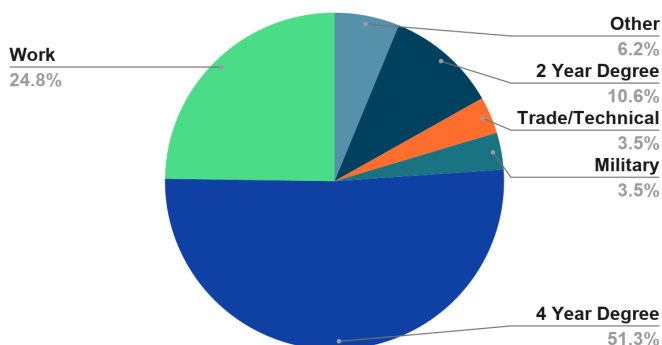

Academics

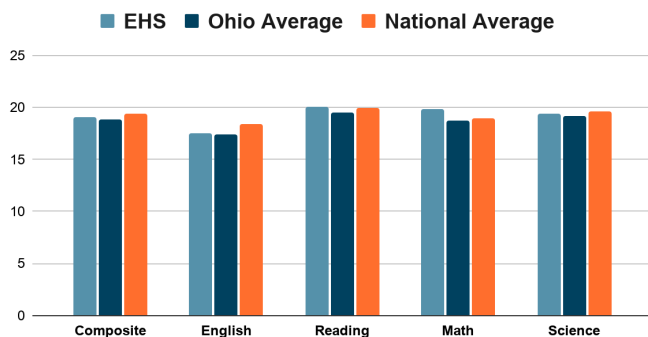

College Credit Plus

Students in grades 7-12 who meet college readiness benchmarks are able to take college classes that count for both high school and college credit. Edgewood High School averages about 30-40 students per year who participate in this program. For the 2025-26 school year, we are offering College Writing I, College Writing II, Stories that Built the World, Stories that Saved the World, and Introductory to Statistics; taught in the building through Kent State University —Ashtabula Campus.

Ashtabula County Career & Technical Campus

Serves 7 public school districts and 1 private school in Ashtabula County. Students have the opportunity to earn industry recognized credentials that will assist in gaining employment after graduation. In addition, most programs have an articulation agreement with Lakeland Community College, Kent State University, or the University of Akron.
