PREP YOUR CART FIRST

• TACKLE TASKS IN ORDER


SAFETY TIP OF THE MONTH:PROPER GLOVE USAGE

■ TOOL SPOTLIGHT: BATTERY CHARGING & CARE TIPS DID YOU KNOW...

- 1. CHARGE AFTER EACH SHIFT
- 2. DON'T WAIT UNTIL THE BATTERY RUNS DOWN TO 0%. REGULAR CHARGING HELPS EXTEND BATTERY LIFE.
- 3. AVOID OVERCHARGING
- 4. UNPLUG THE CHARGER ONCE IT'S FULL. CONSTANT OVERCHARGING CAN REDUCE BATTERY HEALTH OVER TIME.
- 5. COOL DOWN FIRST
- 6. LET THE BATTERY-POWERED TOOL COOL BEFORE CHARGING—CHARGING A HOT BATTERY CAN CAUSE DAMAGE.
- 7.STORE IN A DRY AREA
- 8. KEEP BATTERIES AND CHARGERS AWAY FROM MOISTURE AND EXTREME TEMPERATURES.
- 9.INSPECT FOR DAMAGE
- 10. FRAYED CORDS OR SWELLING BATTERIES? REPORT AND REPLACE IMMEDIATELY— DON'T RISK IT.
- 11.LABEL & ROTATE BATTERIES
- 12. IF YOU HAVE MULTIPLE BATTERIES, LABEL THEM AND ROTATE USE SO THEY WEAR EVENLY.
- 13. CLEAN EQUIPMENT AFTER EVERY USE OR END OF THE DAY TO KEEP CLEAN AND LONG LASTING
