

Lampasas County Livestock Association Scholarship

Deadline: March 19, 2026

The Lampasas County Youth Livestock Association Scholarships are awarded annually to deserving students who have been participants in the Lampasas County Youth Livestock Show and are intending on pursuing secondary education from an accredited college, university, technical or trade school, or an equivalent path of continued higher education. The Lampasas County Youth Livestock Association Scholarships are funded by memorial donations, and individuals and businesses which share a strong commitment to furthering the education of the participants of the annual Lampasas County Youth Livestock Show.

ELIGIBILITY

To apply for a Lampasas County Youth Livestock Association Scholarship an applicant must, as a minimum meet the following criteria:

- Be an active participant and exhibitor in three of the past five Lampasas County Youth Livestock Shows.
- Be a Texas resident and scheduled to graduate from a Texas high school or equivalent during the 2024-2025 school year.
- Have made formal application to enroll with intent to attend a college/university or accredited technical school and have met the entrance requirements for that college/university or technical school.
- Passed all required (as applicable) state standardized tests to graduate from high school and enter a college/university or accredited technical school.
- Is an active member in good standing, participating in the Lampasas County 4-H, Lampasas FFA, and/or Lometa FFA programs.
- Have taken the SAT, ACT, or equivalent exams. appropriate for the desired course of study and college attending
- Have submitted a current, complete, and official Lampasas County Youth Livestock Association. Scholarship Application, containing all the required documentation.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Scholarship awards funded through the Lampasas County Youth Livestock Association Scholarship cannot be used for any purpose other than to help cover educational expenses.
- Funds will be dispersed to scholarship recipients when the recipient provides proof of enrollment in a college/university, or accredited technical or trade school.
- Special arrangements for early disbursement may be made for hardship cases. However, these arrangements must be made a minimum of 30 days in advance and be made only through the Lampasas County Youth Livestock Association Scholarship Committee.
- It is mandatory that the scholarship recipient attend a college/university or accredited trade or technical school the fall semester immediately following selection and receiving of a Lampasas County Youth Livestock Association Scholarship. Only with special permission from the Lampasas County Youth Livestock Association Scholarship Committee may the use of the scholarship funds be deferred a semester or the following year.
- The Lampasas County Youth Livestock Association Scholarship Committee reserves the right not to award the scholarship every year or may award multiple scholarships if deemed appropriate.
- Members of the Lampasas County Youth Livestock Association who have children of their immediate family applying for a Lampasas County Youth Livestock Association Scholarship are not eligible to be members of the scholarship selection committee.

HOW TO PROCEED

Applications may be picked up from the Lampasas or Lometa ISD high school guidance counselor's office, or from the Lampasas County Agri-Life Extension Service Office.

- Applications should be typed or printed legibly.
- Applications must contain all appropriate signatures.
- Applications must be accompanied by:
 1. A copy of the applicant's high school academic achievement record (transcript) for the past 3.5 years of high school. Transcript must be signed by a school official (principal or guidance counselor). Transcripts must also include a copy of the college/university or technical or trade school's entrance Exam's official Report of Scores Label, which should contain the student's ACT, SAT, or other test scores appropriate for the desired course of study. If more than one page is submitted, each page should contain an official school seal.
 2. An essay (250 words or more) highlighting Lampasas County Youth Livestock Show participation and how it will help you in the future. Also include experiences, community service involvement, academic achievements, involvement in related organizations or activities (4-H, FFA, etc.), future career and life plans, and why you should be selected above other applicants.
 3. Two letters of recommendation from accredited and recognized sources: teachers, church officials, community leaders, etc.

All applications are due in the Lampasas or Lometa ISD high school counselor's office, or the Lampasas County Agri-Life Extension Service office by **March 19, 2026**.

Failure to meet all the requirements or include all the requested information and documentation will result in non-consideration of your application by the Lampasas County Youth Livestock Association.

Selection Criteria

The following set of criteria will be used in the selection of Lampasas County Youth Livestock Association Scholarship recipients.

- Lampasas County Youth Livestock Show participation
- Community Service
Involvement
- ACT, SAT, or equivalent test scores(if your school requires...if not, please let us know)
Academic Achievement
- Participation in other organizations (4-H, FFA, etc.) and extracurricular activities
- Moral
Character
