Regulation 3542: School Bus Drivers

Status: DRAFT

Original Adopted Date: 05/24/2005 | Last Reviewed Date: 03/10/2026

In order to provide a safe and efficient student transportation service, the district may employ its own school bus or student activity bus drivers or may contract with an agency that provides such transportation service. Such school bus or student activity bus drivers shall be required to comply with Board Policy 3540 - Transportation and other applicable district policies and regulations.

Qualifications

All drivers employed to operate a school bus or student activity bus shall: (Education Code 39877, 39878)

1. Hold a valid California driver's license for the appropriate class of vehicle with a P and S endorsement.
2. Register with Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) Clearinghouse
3. Have and carry a California Special Drivers Certificate (DL-45)
4. Have and carry a valid medical examination certificate (DL51a)
5. Have and carry a current 1st aid card.
6. Complete a minimum of 20 hrs of classroom instruction given by a State certified instructor
7. Pass a written CHP test
8. Complete a minimum of 20 hours of behind the wheel instruction given by a State certified instructor.
9. Pass a CHP drive test
10. Be at least 18 years of age
11. Pass a criminal background check, including fingerprint clearance consistent with Education Code 45125 for district employees and Education Code 45125.1 for all other compensated drivers
12. Have a satisfactory driving record with both California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) and FMCSA that does not include any of the following:
 - a. Within three years, has committed any violation that results in a conviction assigned a violation point count of two or more, as defined in Vehicle Code 12810 and 12810.5 (or a similar violation found through FMCSA)
 - b. Within three years, has had driving privilege suspended, revoked, or on probation for any reason involving the unsafe operation of a motor vehicle
 - c. Has been determined by the DMV or FMCSA to be a negligent or incompetent operator
13. Not have demonstrated irrational behavior to the extent that a reasonable and prudent person would have reasonable cause to believe that the driver's ability to perform the duties of a driver may be impaired
14. Not have been convicted of an offense listed in Vehicle Code 13370(a)(1), (a)(5) or (b)
15. Provide the district or the private entity contracting with the district a report showing the driver's current public record as recorded by the DMV and participate in the DMV's pull-notice system
16. Comply with the district's drug and alcohol testing in accordance with Administrative Regulation 4112.42 - Drug and Alcohol Testing for School Bus Drivers, subject to the cannabis discrimination limitations specified in Government Code 12954
17. Complete a medical examination not more than two years prior to the driver performing student transportation by a qualified health professional. The driver shall provide a copy of the medical certificate to the district or the private entity contracting with the district
 - a. The driver shall provide a copy of the medical certificate to the district or the private entity contracting with the district
 - b. The driver shall complete a medical examination pursuant to this paragraph every two years after the initial examination and provide a copy of the medical examiner's certificate of clearance to the district or the private entity contracting with the district
 - c. Within the same month of reaching age 65 years, and annually thereafter, the driver shall undergo a medical

examination and provide a copy of the medical examiner's certificate of clearance to the district or the private entity contracting with the district

18. Submit and clear a tuberculosis risk assessment pursuant to Education Code 49406

Additionally, all drivers employed to operate school buses or student activity buses shall possess, and retain in their immediate possession while operating the bus, a certificate issued by the California Highway Patrol (CHP) which permits the operation of school buses or student activity buses, as applicable. (Vehicle Code 12517, 12517.4)

The Superintendent or designee may use an electronic fingerprinting system, managed by the California Department of Justice, to fingerprint an applicant for an initial certificate to drive a school bus or student activity bus. (Vehicle Code 12517.3)

When initially applying for or renewing a license or certificate to drive a school bus or student activity bus, and annually upon reaching age 65 years, the driver shall submit to the DMV and to the Superintendent or designee a report of a medical examination conducted in accordance with the timelines and procedures specified in Vehicle Code 12517.2. (13 CCR 1234)

The Superintendent or designee shall notify each driver of the expiration date of the individual's driver's license, certificate, and medical certificate, and shall ensure each document is renewed prior to expiration. (13 CCR 1234)

The Superintendent or designee shall notify the DMV within five days whenever any driver refuses, fails to comply, or receives a positive test result on a drug or alcohol test; is dismissed for a cause related to student transportation safety; or is reinstated after being dismissed for a cause related to student transportation safety. (Vehicle Code 1808.8, 13376)

Training

In addition to any other training required to obtain or renew the certificate authorizing operation of a school bus or student activity bus, drivers shall receive training which includes, but is not limited to:

1. The proper installation of mobile seating devices in the bus securement systems (Education Code 56195.8)
2. The proper actions to be taken in the event that a school bus is hijacked (Education Code 39831)
3. The District's Transportation Safety Plan

All drivers employed to operate school buses or student activity buses shall complete training at least equivalent to the American Red Cross first aid training program, or hold a valid and current first aid certificate issued by the American Red Cross or equivalent. Additionally, all drivers shall complete training sufficient to gain proficiency in all of the following: (Education Code 39877, 39878)

- a. Pre-trip vehicle inspections
- b. Safe loading and unloading of passengers
- c. Proper use of seatbelts and child safety restraints
- d. Handling accidents, incidents, and emergency situations
- e. Providing proper accommodations for students with disabilities
- f. Defensive driving
- g. Operations in inclement weather
- h. Operations at night or under impaired visibility conditions

To determine any other needs for professional development, the Superintendent or designee shall periodically review accident reports involving district drivers and may seek input from drivers, district and school administrators, students, and/or other stakeholders on desired topics for professional development.

Authority

Students transported in a school bus or student activity bus shall be under the authority of, and responsible directly to, the driver of the bus. The driver shall be held responsible for the orderly conduct of the students while they are on the bus or being escorted across a street, highway, or road. (5 CCR 14103)

The driver shall have the authority to discontinue the operation of a school bus or student activity bus whenever the driver determines that it is unsafe to continue.

This regulation and Administrative Regulation 5131.1 - Bus Conduct shall be made available to parents/guardians, students, teachers, and other interested parties. (5 CCR 14103)

Responsibilities

The driver's primary responsibility is to safely transport students to and from school and school activities. The driver shall follow procedures contained in district plans and regulations pertaining to transportation safety.

The driver shall stop to load or unload students only at school bus stops designated by the Superintendent or designee, or authorized by the Superintendent or designee for school activity trips. (Vehicle Code 22112)

The driver shall activate the amber warning light system, flashing red signal lights, and stop arm signal and shall escort students in accordance with Vehicle Code 22112.

The driver shall not require any student to leave the bus en route between home and school or other destinations. (5 CCR 14103)

The driver shall not drive a school bus or student activity bus while using a wireless telephone or using a wireless communications device for text-based communication, except when otherwise authorized by law and Administrative Regulation 3543 - Transportation Safety and Emergencies.

All drivers employed to operate school buses or student activity buses shall not drive for more than 10 hours within a work period, or after the end of the 16th hour after coming on duty following eight consecutive hours off duty. Additionally, drivers shall maintain a daily log sheet and complete the daily pre-trip inspection of the vehicle before the vehicle is driven. The pre-trip inspection shall include a check of the vehicle for fluid leaks and the operability of all lights and the brakes, each of which shall be initialed by the driver. (Education Code 39877, 39878)

The driver shall report all of the following to the Superintendent or designee, at the completion of each day's work on each vehicle operated by the driver:

1. The condition of the driver's bus at the completion of each work day (13 CCR 1215; 49 CFR 396.11, 396.13)
2. The driver's duty status for each 24-hour period, including, but not limited to, the number of hours on and off duty (13 CCR 1213)
3. Any traffic accident involving the driver's bus (13 CCR 1219) In addition to notifying the Superintendent or designee, the driver shall immediately notify the CHP of any traffic accident and, if the bus is operated under contract, the driver's employer. (13 CCR 1219)
4. Traffic violations by the driver
5. Consistently late school dismissals which cause transportation delays for the driver's bus
6. Overload runs by the driver
7. Recurring and serious student misbehavior on the driver's bus
8. Parent/guardian and student complaints regarding the driver or related to the driver's bus

Vehicle Idling

The driver of a school bus or student activity bus shall do both of the following: (13 CCR 2480)

1. Turn off the bus engine upon stopping at a school or within 100 feet of a school and not restart the engine more than 30 seconds before beginning to depart
2. Not cause or allow the bus to idle at any location greater than 100 feet from a school for more than five consecutive minutes or for an aggregated period of more than five minutes in any one hour

However, vehicle idling may be allowed under limited conditions, including, but not limited to, all of the following occasions when idling is necessary to: (13 CCR 2480)

1. Stop for an official traffic control signal or device, for traffic conditions under which the driver has no control, or at the direction of law enforcement
2. Ascertain that the bus is in safe operating condition and properly equipped
3. Operate equipment designed to safely load, unload, or transport students with disabilities
4. Operate a heater, air conditioner, defroster, or other equipment as necessary to ensure the safety or health of passengers
5. Cool down a turbo-charged diesel engine before turning off the engine
6. Recharge a battery or other energy storage unit of a hybrid electric bus or vehicle

The Superintendent or designee shall notify all drivers, upon employment and at least once per year thereafter, of the requirements specified above and the potential legal and employment consequences of failure to comply. All complaints of noncompliance shall be reviewed and remedial action taken as necessary. The Superintendent or designee shall retain records of the training and of any complaints and enforcement actions for at least three years. (13 CCR 2480)

Reports

The Superintendent or designee shall retain records of all of the following: (13 CCR 1234)

1. Each driver's duty status and supporting documents provided pursuant to 13 CCR 1201 and 1213. Such records shall be retained for six months and made available to the CHP upon request.
2. The different types of vehicles and vehicle combinations each driver has demonstrated capability to operate
3. Records of each driver's license, certificate, medical certificate, first aid certificate, and training as specified in 13 CCR 1234
4. Daily vehicle inspection reports prepared by drivers pursuant to 13 CCR 1215
5. School bus accident reports

A report of each accident that occurred on public or private property involving a school bus with students aboard, including pertinent details of the accident, shall be retained for 12 months from the date of the accident. If the accident was not investigated by CHP, the Superintendent or designee shall forward a copy of the report to the local CHP within five business days of the date of the accident.

Authority

Students transported in a school bus or in a student activity bus shall be under the authority of, and responsible directly to, the driver of the bus. The driver shall be held responsible for the orderly conduct of the students while they are on the bus or being escorted across a street, highway or road. (5 CCR 14103)

The driver shall have the authority to discontinue the operation of a school bus whenever he/she determines that it is unsafe to continue.

Administrative regulations related to bus driver authority shall be made available to parents/guardians, students, teachers and other interested parties. (5 CCR 14103)

Qualifications, Training and Monitoring

All drivers employed to operate school buses or student activity buses shall possess, at a minimum, both of the following documents issued by the state Department of Motor Vehicles: (Education Code 39830.1; Vehicle Code 12517)

1. A valid driver's license for the appropriate class of vehicle to be driven
2. A certificate which permits the driver to operate either school buses or student activity buses, as applicable

The Superintendent or designee may use an electronic fingerprinting system, managed by the California Department of Justice, to fingerprint an applicant for an original certificate to drive a school bus or student activity bus. (Vehicle Code 12517.3)

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that school bus drivers receive training which includes:

1. First aid practices (Vehicle Code 12522)
2. The proper actions to be taken in the event that a school bus is hijacked (Education Code 39831)
3. The proper installation of mobile seating devices in the bus securement systems (Education Code 56195.8)

School bus drivers shall be subject to drug and alcohol testing in accordance with Governing Board policy and the requirements of federal law.

The Superintendent or designee shall notify the Department of Motor Vehicles within five days whenever any school bus driver has tested positive for drugs or alcohol, is dismissed for a cause related to student transportation safety, or whenever a driver so dismissed has been reinstated. (Vehicle Code 1808.8, 13376)

Responsibilities

The driver's primary responsibility is to safely transport students to and from school and school activities. The driver shall follow procedures contained in the district's transportation safety plan.

The driver shall not require any student to leave the bus en route between home and school or other destinations. (5 CCR 14103)

The driver shall stop to load or unload students only at school bus stops designated by the Superintendent or designee, or authorized by the Superintendent or designee for school activity trips. (Vehicle Code 22112)

The driver shall activate the amber warning light system, flashing red signal lights and stop arm signal and shall escort students in accordance with Vehicle Code 22112.

The driver shall immediately report all school bus accidents to the California Highway Patrol, the Superintendent or designee, and the driver's employer. (13 CCR 1219)

Use of Animals for Instructional Purposes

Before any student or employee brings an animal to school for an instructional purpose, he/she shall receive written permission from the principal or designee. The principal or designee shall give such permission only after he/she has provided written notification to all parents/guardians of students in the affected class, asking them to verify whether their child has any known allergies, asthma, or other health condition that may be aggravated by the animal's presence. When a parent/guardian has provided notification that his/her child has an allergy, asthma, or other health condition that may be aggravated by the animal, the principal shall take appropriate measures to protect the student from exposure to the animal.

All animals brought to school must be in good physical condition and must be appropriately immunized. The teacher shall ensure that the species of animal is appropriate for the instructional purpose and age and maturity of the students.

All animals brought to school shall be adequately fed, effectively controlled, humanely treated, and properly housed in cages or containers suitable for the species. The teacher shall ensure that cages and containers are cleaned regularly and that waste materials are removed and disposed of in an appropriate manner.

The teacher shall ensure that students receive instructions regarding the proper handling of and personal hygiene around animals.

Except for service animals, as defined below, all animals are prohibited on school transportation services. (Education Code 39839; 13 CCR 1216)

Use of Service Animals by Individuals with Disabilities

For an individual with a disability, service animal means any dog that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks related to the individual's disability and for his/her benefit. For example, for an individual who is blind or has low vision, a service animal would mean a dog that helps him/her with vision, navigation, and other tasks; for an individual who is deaf or hard of hearing, a service animal would mean a dog that alerts him/her to the presence of people or sounds; and for an individual with psychiatric or neurological disabilities, a service animal would mean a dog that assists him/her by preventing or interrupting impulsive or destructive behaviors. (28 CFR 35.104)

Individuals with disabilities may be accompanied on school premises and on school transportation by service animals, including specially trained guide dogs, signal dogs, or service dogs. (Education Code 39839; Civil Code 54.2; 28 CFR 35.136)

The Superintendent or designee may ask any individual with a disability to remove his/her service animal from school premises or transportation if the animal is out of an individual's service animal is excluded, he/she shall be given an opportunity to participate in the service, program, or activity without having the service animal pre

Use of Therapy Animals

Therapy animals, particularly dogs, can be used in California classrooms and schools to improve student mental health, reduce stress/anxiety, increase engagement, calming presence, assist with behavioral issues, and facilitate reading programs. Unlike service dogs (protected by ADA for disability tasks) therapy animal (providing designee.

Emotional Support Animals

Rescue Union School District does not support the presence of emotional support animals.

The District does not generally support the presence of emotional support animals (ESAs) that have not received specialized training and certification.

ESAs are not recognized as service animals under the ADA and do not have the same access rights.

Classroom Pets and Other Animal Requirements

Classroom Pets:

Must be approved by the School's Principal (or designee).

Teachers responsible for classroom pets must develop a basic care and maintenance plan, including feeding, cleaning, appropriate housing, and any other measures ventilation, temperature control, and prevents escape.

Students may interact with classroom pets only under direct adult supervision. The teacher shall ensure that interaction does not create a health hazard (e.g., requiring

Classroom pets are generally not to be sent home with students. If an exception is considered (e.g., over a school break), principal approval is required and parent/gu

During holidays and extended school breaks, classroom pets must be taken home by the teacher unless prior approval for an alternative arrangement has been gran

Individual student or teacher personal pets are not permitted as classroom pets unless they fully comply with this policy, including principal approval and demonstrati

The teacher must check for student or staff allergies or sensitivities before introducing a classroom pet and work with the principal to provide reasonable accommoda

Other Animals

Anyone seeking to bring an animal (other than a classroom pet, service animal, or approved therapy dog) on school campuses must request approval through the Su

Policy 6163.2: Animals At School

The Governing Board recognizes that animals can contribute to the district's instructional program by being effective teaching aids to students and by assisting individuals with disabilities to access district programs and activities. In addition, instruction related to the care and treatment of animals teaches students a sense of responsibility and promotes the humane treatment of living creatures.

Animals may be brought to school for educational purposes, subject to rules and precautions specified in administrative regulations related to health, safety and sanitation. The Superintendent or designee may develop rules and procedures to ensure that when animals are brought to school, the health, safety, and welfare of students, staff, and the animals are protected. Teachers shall ensure that these rules and precautions are observed so as to protect both the students and animals.

Seeing-eye dogs and service dogs may accompany students and staff at school as needed.

The district assumes no liability for the safety of animals voluntarily brought to school.

The Board of Education recognizes circumstances exist when the presence of an animal in the school setting is legally required to address student and/or employee accommodations (i.e., ADA or IDEA or Section 504), or situations when a service animal (i.e., a dog that has been trained to perform tasks for an individual with a disability) accompanies an individual on a school campus event open to the public.

The Board of Education also recognizes other situations where an animal in school may include but is not limited to: as part of the curriculum; as a therapy animal; as a service dog, as a Guide Dog for the Blind in Training, accompanying a patron on a school field or campus, or functioning as a classroom pet.

The Board of Education is committed to providing policy guidance to students, parents, and the broader community regarding animals in schools, including when animals are not appropriate or allowable in accordance with federal and state law and District guidelines.

The Board of Education authorizes the Superintendent and District Administration to develop rules and regulations consistent with this policy.



Comprehensive School Safety Plan Purpose

Effective January 1, 2019, Assembly Bill 1747 (Rodriguez), School Safety Plans, became law. This bill requires that during the writing and development of the comprehensive school safety plan (CSSP), the school site council or safety committee consult with a fire department and other first responder entities in addition to currently required entities. It requires the CSSP and any updates made to the plan to be shared with the law enforcement agency, the fire department, and the other first responder entities.

The California Education Code (sections 32280-32288) outlines the requirements of all schools operating any kindergarten and any grades 1 to 12, inclusive, to write and develop a school safety plan relevant to the needs and resources of that particular school.

In 2004, the Legislature and Governor recast and renumbered the Comprehensive School Safety Plan provisions in SB 719 and AB 115. It is the intent of the Legislature in enacting the provisions to support California public schools as they develop their mandated comprehensive safety plans that are the result of a systematic planning process, that include strategies aimed at the prevention of, and education about, potential incidents involving crime and violence on school campuses.

The historical requirement of the Comprehensive School Safety Plan was presented in Senate Bill 187, which was approved by the Governor and chaptered in 1997. This legislation contained a sunset clause that stated that this legislation would remain in effect only until January 1, 2000. Senate Bill 334 was approved and chaptered in 1999 and perpetuated this legislation under the requirement of the initial legislation.

Comprehensive School Safety Plans are required under SB 719 & AB 115 and contains the following elements:

Assessment of school crime committed on school campuses and at school-related functions

- Child abuse reporting procedures
- Disaster procedures
- Suspension and expulsion policies
- Procedures to notify teachers of dangerous pupils
- Discrimination and harassment policies
- School wide dress code policies
- Procedures for safe ingress and egress
- Policies enacted to maintain a safe and orderly environment
- Rules and procedures on school discipline
- Hate crime reporting procedures

The Comprehensive School Safety Plan will be reviewed and updated by March 1st every year. In July of every year, the school will report on the status of its school safety plan including a description of its key elements in the annual school accountability report card.

A copy of the Comprehensive School Safety Plan is available for review at Lakeview Elementary.

Safety Plan Vision

Lakeview Elementary will provide a learning environment in which students acquire high levels of knowledge, skills, and understanding that will open doors of opportunity and prepare them for thought and action in the wider world. Each student will be known as a person and a learner who will experience the joy and challenge education brings as individuals in a community. Each student will develop the skills, attitudes, and behaviors to become principled, ethical citizens who give and receive support in the process of learning.

Assessment of School Safety

Each year, Lakeview Elementary conducts a comprehensive assessment of school safety. This process includes a review of data from the Rescue Union School District Culture and Climate Survey, the district parent survey, as well as discipline and attendance data collected through our student information system and the California School Dashboard.

Additional feedback and perspectives are gathered from school staff and members of the Lakeview Elementary School Site Council to ensure a well-rounded evaluation of our school's safety and overall climate.

Strategies and Programs to Provide and Maintain a High Level of Safety (EC 32281(a)1, items A-J)

Lakeview Elementary School is committed to providing a safe and supportive learning environment that promotes student well-being and academic success. The school actively implements practices and procedures designed to prevent injury and minimize potential risks to students.

These efforts include maintaining safe school facilities and equipment, ensuring the safety of the outdoor environment, and promoting safe behaviors through educational programs and school-sponsored activities.

(A) Child Abuse Reporting Procedures (EC 35294.2 [a] [2]; PC 11166)

All school employees who are mandated reporters under California law are legally required to report known or reasonably suspected cases of child abuse or neglect to appropriate child protective agencies. Failure to report as required by law may result in criminal and civil liability.

Definition of a Mandated Reporter

Mandated reporters include all school personnel, including but not limited to:

- Teachers and administrators
- Classified staff (e.g., instructional aides, custodians, clerical staff)
- Coaches, counselors, nurses, and psychologists
- Volunteers, if they supervise students on a regular basis

Types of Reportable Abuse

Mandated reporters must report any known or reasonable suspicion of:

- Physical abuse
- Sexual abuse or exploitation
- Emotional or psychological abuse
- Neglect (including willful failure to provide food, clothing, shelter, or medical care)
- Willful cruelty or unjustifiable punishment
- Witnessing domestic violence (when affecting the child's welfare)

Reporting Procedures

1. Immediate Verbal Report

- The mandated reporter must immediately or as soon as practically possible make a verbal report to:

* Child Protective Services (CPS) or

* Local law enforcement agency (police or sheriff's department)

- Contact information for local reporting agencies is posted in the main office and staff areas.

2. Written Report

- Within 36 hours of the verbal report, the mandated reporter must complete and submit a written Suspected Child Abuse Report (SCAR) on form BCIA 8572 to the same agency.
- The form may be submitted via fax, mail, or electronically, if allowed.

3. Notification Within School

- The mandated reporter may inform the site administrator or supervisor after making the report, but administrators may not impede or alter the reporting process.
- The identity of the reporter is confidential and should not be shared except as required by law.

4. No Internal Investigation

- School staff should not attempt to investigate or validate the abuse prior to reporting.
- Do not interview the child or contact the suspected abuser beyond what is required to determine if a reasonable suspicion exists.

Training and Acknowledgment

- All employees must complete annual training on child abuse identification and reporting, as required by AB 1432.
- Upon hire and annually thereafter, employees must sign an acknowledgment form stating they understand their reporting obligations under the law.

Documentation and Confidentiality

- A copy of the written report should be retained in a confidential file (not in the student's cumulative record), per district policy.
- Information related to the report must be kept strictly confidential and shared only with authorized officials or investigators.
- Retaliation against a mandated reporter who reports in good faith is strictly prohibited.

Resources and Support

- School counselors, psychologists, and social workers are available to support affected students.
- The school maintains contact information for:
 - Local CPS agency
 - Law enforcement
 - Community mental health and victim support resources

(B) Disaster Procedures (EC 35295-35297; GC 8607 and 3100)

Disaster Plan (See Appendix C-F)

1. All-Hazards Approach

The Disaster Plan should address:

- Natural Disasters: Earthquake, wildfire, flooding, extreme weather
- Technological Hazards: Utility failure, hazardous materials release
- Human-Caused Events: Bomb threat, terrorism, civil unrest, mass casualty incidents
- Health Emergencies: Pandemic, biological threats

2. Key Components of the School Disaster Plan

A. Preparedness

- Maintain updated site-specific Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) and Incident Command System (ICS) chart
- Conduct regular drills: fire, earthquake, lockdown, shelter-in-place, and evacuation
- Stock emergency supplies: food, water, first aid, radios, student rosters, etc.
- Assign and train staff in ICS roles: Incident Commander, Operations, Logistics, Planning, Finance

B. Mitigation

- Identify hazards in and around campus (e.g., gas lines, flood zones)
- Ensure non-structural hazard mitigation: secure bookshelves, emergency shutoffs labeled

- Partner with local emergency services to assess and improve site safety

C. Response

- Activate the Incident Command System (ICS)
- Use appropriate emergency response protocols:
- Evacuation for fire, gas leak, bomb threat
- Shelter-in-Place for air quality concerns, chemical release

o Lockdown for intruder or active assailant

- Account for all students and staff
- Provide first aid and care for injured persons
- Coordinate with first responders and district officials

D. Recovery

- Restore safe operations (building inspections, utility checks)
- Provide mental health and counseling services
- Assess and repair damage
- Debrief with staff and district for after-action review
- Update procedures and training based on lessons learned

3. Communication During a Disaster

- Use multiple communication channels: PA system, radios, phones, emergency text/email platforms
- Communicate clearly and calmly with:
- Staff (via ICS structure)
- Students (via classroom teachers or PA)
- Parents/guardians (via district-approved systems)
- Designate a Public Information Officer (PIO) to coordinate with media and community

Adaptations for Students with Disabilities

Students with disabilities that are not cognitively or physically able to follow safety plans, details regarding assistance, such as aide or wheelchair assistance, will be identified in the student's Individualized Education Plan.

Maintain a list of:

- * Students with disabilities
- * Students with medical needs (e.g., medication, mobility)

Ensure accommodations in evacuation and shelter procedures

Include support staff in all planning (e.g., nurses, aides)

Public Agency Use of School Buildings for Emergency Shelters

Policy Statement

In the event of a natural disaster, public health emergency, or other declared crisis, this school site may be designated for temporary use by public agencies to provide emergency shelter, medical services, food distribution, or other community relief services.

The school will cooperate fully with:

- Local law enforcement
- Fire and rescue services
- County Office of Emergency Services (OES)
- California Department of Public Health (CDPH)
- American Red Cross and/or Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)

Such use shall be coordinated to prioritize the safety of students, staff, and school property, and to allow for the continuity of educational operations when feasible.

Procedures

1. Activation and Authorization

- Use of school facilities shall be authorized by the district superintendent or designee in consultation with emergency authorities.

- Public agency partners must present proper identification and written authorization when requesting access to the campus for emergency shelter purposes.

2. Site Coordination

- The school site administrator or designee will:
- Serve as the primary point of contact for coordination
- Provide building access and site maps to authorized personnel
- Ensure the protection of school records, equipment, and instructional materials not needed for shelter operations
- A joint use plan or Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) may be established between the district and the public agency to clarify responsibilities, including liability, security, and cleanup. The Assistant Superintendent of Business Services shall be responsible for establishing the MOU.

3. Safety and Security

- All shelter operations shall maintain compliance with applicable health, fire, and safety codes.
- Public safety personnel will assist in maintaining site security.
- Any areas of campus used for shelter must be clearly separated from instructional or student-only zones (if school is still in session or partially operating).

4. Communication

- The district will inform staff and families of shelter operations on school grounds as appropriate.
- Signage and barriers may be used to guide shelter clients and restrict unauthorized access to school areas.

5. Restoration and Recovery

- Upon conclusion of shelter use, the public agency will:
- Coordinate site cleanup and restoration
- Assess damages and provide appropriate reimbursement or repairs
- Notify the district when the site is fully restored for educational use

Preparedness and Planning

- The school site shall maintain:
- Copies of joint-use agreements or MOUs (if applicable)
- Facility condition assessments and maps
- Updated contact information for local emergency services
- Disaster drills and tabletop exercises should consider scenarios involving emergency shelter use.

(C) School Suspension, Expulsion and Mandatory Expulsion Guidelines

The Governing Board desires to provide district students access to educational opportunities in an orderly school environment that protects their safety and security, ensures their welfare and well-being, and promotes their learning and development. The Board shall develop rules and regulations setting the standards of behavior expected of district students and the disciplinary processes and procedures for addressing violations of those standards, including suspension and/or expulsion.

(cf. 5131 - Conduct)

(cf. 5131.1 - Bus Conduct)

(cf. 5131.2 - Bullying)

The grounds for suspension and expulsion and the procedures for considering, recommending, and/or implementing suspension and expulsion shall be only those specified in law, in this policy, and in the accompanying administrative regulation.

Except when otherwise permitted by law, a student may be suspended or expelled only when his/her behavior is related to a school activity or school attendance occurring within any district school or another school district, regardless of when it occurs, including, but not limited to, the following: (Education Code 48900(s))

1. While on school grounds

2. While going to or coming from school

3. During the lunch period, whether on or off the school campus

(cf. 5112.5 - Open/Closed Campus)

4. During, going to, or coming from a school-sponsored activity

District staff shall enforce the rules concerning suspension and expulsion of students fairly, consistently, equally, and in accordance with the district's nondiscrimination policies.

(cf. 0410 - Nondiscrimination in District Programs and Activities)

Appropriate Use of Suspension Authority

Except when a student's act violates Education Code 48900(a)-(e), as listed in items #1-5 under "Grounds for Suspension and Expulsion: Grades K-8" of the accompanying administrative regulation, or when his/her presence causes a danger to others, suspension shall be used only when other means of correction have failed to bring about proper conduct. (Education Code 48900.5, 48900.6)

(cf. 5138 - Conflict Resolution/Peer Mediation)

(cf. 5144 - Discipline)

(cf. 6142.4 - Service Learning/Community Service Classes)

(cf. 6164.2 - Guidance/Counseling Services)

(cf. 6164.5 - Student Success Teams)

A student's parents/guardians shall be notified as soon as possible when there is an escalating pattern of misbehavior that could lead to on-campus or off-campus suspension.

No student in grades K-3 may be suspended for disruption or willful defiance, except by a teacher pursuant to Education Code 48910. (Education Code 48900)

Students shall not be suspended or expelled for truancy, tardiness, or absenteeism from assigned school activities.

(cf. 5113 - Absences and Excuses)

(cf. 5113.1 - Chronic Absence and Truancy)

Authority to Expel

A student may be expelled only by the Board. (Education Code 48918(j))

As required by law, the Superintendent or principal shall recommend expulsion and the Board shall expel any student found to have committed any of the following "mandatory recommendation and mandatory expulsion" acts at school or at a school activity off school grounds: (Education Code 48915)

1. Possessing a firearm which is not an imitation firearm, as verified by a certificated employee, unless the student had obtained prior written permission to possess the item from a certificated school employee, with the principal or designee's concurrence

(cf. 5131.7 - Weapons and Dangerous Instruments)

2. Selling or otherwise furnishing a firearm

3. Brandishing a knife at another person

4. Unlawfully selling a controlled substance listed in Health and Safety Code 11053-11058

5. Committing or attempting to commit a sexual assault as defined in Penal Code 261, 266c, 286, 288, 288a, or 289, or committing a sexual battery as defined in Penal Code 243.4

6. Possessing an explosive as defined in 18 USC 921

For all other violations listed in the accompanying administrative regulation under "Grounds for Suspension and Expulsion: Grades K-8" and "Additional Grounds for Suspension and Expulsion: Grades 4-8," the Superintendent or principal shall have the discretion to recommend expulsion of a student. If expulsion is recommended, the Board shall order the student expelled only if it makes a finding of either or both of the following: (Education Code 48915(b) and (e))

1. That other means of correction are not feasible or have repeatedly failed to bring about proper conduct
2. That due to the nature of the violation, the presence of the student causes a continuing danger to the physical safety of the student or others

A vote to expel a student shall be taken in an open session of a Board meeting.

The Board may vote to suspend the enforcement of the expulsion order pursuant to the requirements of law and the accompanying administrative regulation. (Education Code 48917)

No student shall be expelled for disruption or willful defiance. (Education Code 48900)

No child enrolled in a preschool program shall be expelled except under limited circumstances as specified in AR 5148.3 - Preschool/Early Childhood Education.

(cf. 5148.3 - Preschool/Early Childhood Education)

Due Process

The Board shall provide for the fair and equitable treatment of students facing suspension and/or expulsion by affording them their due process rights under the law. The Superintendent or designee shall comply with procedures for notices, hearings, and appeals as specified in law and administrative regulation. (Education Code 48911, 48915, 48915.5, 48918)

(cf. 5119 - Students Expelled from Other Districts)

(cf. 5144.2 - Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process (Students with Disabilities))

Maintenance and Monitoring of Outcome Data

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain outcome data related to student suspensions and expulsions in accordance with Education Code 48900.8 and 48916.1, including, but not limited to, the number of students recommended for expulsion, the grounds for each recommended expulsion, the actions taken by the Board, the types of referral made after each expulsion, and the disposition of the students after the expulsion period. For any expulsion that involves the possession of a firearm, such data shall include the name of the school and the type of firearm involved, as required pursuant to 20 USC 7961. Suspension and expulsion data shall be reported to the Board annually and to the California Department of Education when so required.

In presenting the report to the Board, the Superintendent or designee shall disaggregate data on suspensions and expulsions by school and by numerically significant student subgroups, including, but not limited to, ethnic subgroups, socioeconomically disadvantaged students, English learners, students with disabilities, foster youth, and homeless students. Based on the data, the Board shall address any identified disparities in the imposition of student discipline and shall determine whether and how the district is meeting its goals for improving school climate as specified in its local control and accountability plan.

(D) Procedures to Notify Teachers of Dangerous Pupils (EC 49079)

The student information system will include data regarding dangerous students that teachers will have access to for three years from the date of the incident. Site administrators and site secretaries will be trained on how to include the information in the student information system and teachers will be trained on where the data will be located.

(E) Sexual Harassment Policies (EC 212.6 [b])

Prohibited sexual harassment includes, but is not limited to, unwelcome sexual advances, unwanted requests for sexual favors, or other unwanted verbal, visual, or physical conduct of a sexual nature made against another person of the same or opposite sex in the educational setting, when made on the basis of sex and under any of the following conditions: (Education Code 212.5; 5 CCR 4916)

1. Submission to the conduct is explicitly or implicitly made a term or condition of a student's academic status or progress.
2. Submission to or rejection of the conduct by a student is used as the basis for academic decisions affecting the student.
3. The conduct has the purpose or effect of having a negative impact on the student's academic performance or of creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive educational environment.
4. Submission to or rejection of the conduct by the student is used as the basis for any decision affecting the student regarding benefits and services, honors, programs, or activities available at or through any district program or activity.

(cf. 5131 - Conduct)

(cf. 5131.2 - Bullying)

(cf. 5137 - Positive School Climate)

(cf. 5145.3 - Nondiscrimination/ Harassment)

(cf. 6142.1 - Sexual Health and HIV/ AIDS Prevention Instruction)

Examples of types of conduct which are prohibited in the district and which may constitute sexual harassment include, but are not limited to:

1. Unwelcome leering, sexual flirtations, or propositions
2. Unwelcome sexual slurs, epithets, threats, verbal abuse, derogatory comments, or sexually degrading descriptions
3. Graphic verbal comments about an individual's body or overly personal conversation
4. Sexual jokes, derogatory posters, notes, stories, cartoons, drawings, pictures, obscene gestures, or computer-generated images of a sexual nature
5. Spreading sexual rumors
6. Teasing or sexual remarks about students enrolled in a predominantly single-sex class
7. Massaging, grabbing, fondling, stroking, or brushing the body
8. Touching an individual's body or clothes in a sexual way
9. Impeding or blocking movements or any physical interference with school activities when directed at an individual on the basis of sex
10. Displaying sexually suggestive objects
11. Sexual assault, sexual battery, or sexual coercion

School-Level Complaint Process/ Grievance Procedure

Complaints of sexual harassment, or any behavior prohibited by the district's Nondiscrimination/ Harassment policy - BP 5145.3, shall be handled in accordance with the following procedure:

1. Notice and Receipt of Complaint: Any student who believes he/ she has been subjected to sexual harassment or who has witnessed sexual harassment may file a complaint with any school employee. Within 24 hours of receiving a complaint, the school employee shall report it to the district Coordinator for Nondiscrimination/ Principal. In addition, any school employee who observes any incident of sexual harassment involving a student shall, within 24 hours, report this observation to the Coordinator/ Principal, whether or not the victim files a complaint. In any case of sexual harassment involving the Coordinator/ Principal to whom the complaint would ordinarily be made, the employee who receives the student's report or who observes the incident shall instead report to the Superintendent or designee.
2. Initiation of Investigation: The Coordinator/ Principal shall initiate an impartial investigation of an allegation of sexual harassment within five school days of receiving notice of the harassing behavior, regardless of whether a formal complaint has been filed. The district shall be considered to have "notice" of the need for an investigation upon receipt of information from a student who believes he/ she has been subjected to harassment, the student's parent/guardian, an employee who received a complaint from a student, or any employee or student who witnessed the behavior. If the Coordinator/ Principal receives an anonymous complaint or media report about alleged sexual harassment, he/ she shall determine whether it is reasonable to pursue an investigation considering the specificity and reliability of the information, the seriousness of the alleged incident, and whether any individuals can be identified who were subjected to the alleged harassment.
3. Initial Interview with Student: When a student or parent/guardian has complained or provided information about sexual harassment, the Coordinator/ Principal shall describe the district's grievance procedure and discuss what actions are being sought by the student in response to the complaint. The student who is complaining shall have an opportunity to describe the incident,

identify witnesses who may have relevant information, provide other evidence of the harassment, and put his/ her complaint in writing. If the student requests confidentiality, he/ she shall be informed that such a request may limit the district's ability to investigate.

4. Investigation Process: The Coordinator/ Principal shall keep the complaint and allegation confidential, except as necessary to carry out the investigation or take other subsequent necessary action. (5 CCR 4964) The Coordinator/ Principal shall interview individuals who are relevant to the investigation, including, but not limited to, the student who is complaining, the person accused of harassment, anyone who witnessed the reported harassment, and anyone mentioned as having relevant information. The Coordinator/ Principal may take other steps such as reviewing any records, notes, or statements related to the harassment or visiting the location where the harassment is alleged to have taken place. When necessary to carry out his/ her investigation or to protect student safety, the Coordinator/ Principal also may discuss the complaint with the Superintendent or designee, the parent/guardian of the student who complained, the parent/guardian of the alleged harasser if the alleged harasser is a student, a teacher or staff member whose knowledge of the students involved may help in determining who is telling the truth, law enforcement and/ or child protective services, and district legal counsel or the district's risk manager. (cf. 5141.4 - Child Abuse Prevention and Reporting)

5. Interim Measures: The Coordinator/ Principal shall determine whether interim measures are necessary during and pending the results of the investigation, such as placing students in separate classes or transferring a student to a class taught by a different teacher.

6. Optional Mediation: In cases of student-on-student harassment, when the student who complained and the alleged harasser so agree, the Coordinator/ Principal may arrange for them to resolve the complaint informally with the help of a counselor, teacher, administrator, or trained mediator. The student who complained shall never be asked to work out the problem directly with the accused person unless such help is provided and both parties agree, and he/ she shall be advised of the right to end the informal process at any time. (cf. 5138 - Conflict Resolution)

7. Factors in Reaching a Determination: In reaching a decision about the complaint, the Coordinator/ Principal may take into account:

- a. Statements made by the persons identified above
 - b. The details and consistency of each person's account
 - c. Evidence of how the complaining student reacted to the incident
 - d. Evidence of any past instances of harassment by the alleged harasser
 - e. Evidence of any past harassment complaints that were found to be untrue
- To judge the severity of the harassment, the Coordinator/Principal may take into consideration:

- a. How the misconduct affected one or more students' education
- b. The type, frequency, and duration of the misconduct
- c. The identity, age, and sex of the harasser and the student who complained, and the relationship between them
- d. The number of persons engaged in the harassing conduct and at whom the harassment was directed
- e. The size of the school, location of the incidents, and context in which they occurred
- f. Other incidents at the school involving different students

8. Written Report on Findings and Follow-Up: No more than 30 days after receiving the complaint, the Coordinator/Principal shall conclude the investigation and prepare a written report of his/ her findings. This timeline may be extended for good cause. If an extension is needed, the Coordinator/ Principal shall notify the student who complained and explain the reasons for the extension.

The report shall include the decision and the reasons for the decision and shall summarize the steps taken during the investigation. If it is determined that harassment occurred, the report shall also include any corrective actions that have or will be taken to address the harassment and prevent any retaliation or further harassment. This report shall be presented to the student who complained, the person accused, the parents/ guardians of the student who complained and the student who was accused, and the Superintendent or designee.

In addition, the Coordinator/ Principal shall ensure that the harassed student and his/her parent/guardian are informed of the procedures for reporting any subsequent problems. The Coordinator/ Principal shall make follow-up inquiries to see if there have been any new incidents or retaliation and shall keep a record of this information.

Enforcement of District Policy

The Superintendent or designee shall take appropriate actions to reinforce the district's sexual harassment policy. As needed, these actions may include any of the following:

1. Removing vulgar or offending graffiti
2. Providing training to students, staff, and parents/ guardians about how to recognize harassment and how to respond

3. Disseminating and/ or summarizing the district's policy and regulation regarding sexual harassment
4. Consistent with the laws regarding the confidentiality of student and personnel records, communicating the school's response to parents/ guardians and the community
5. Taking appropriate disciplinary action

In addition, disciplinary measures may be taken against any person who is found to have made a complaint of sexual harassment which he/ she knew was not true.

Notifications

A copy of the district's sexual harassment policy and regulation shall :

1. Be included in the notifications that are sent to parents/ guardians at the beginning of each school year (Education Code 48980; 5 CCR 4917)
2. Be displayed in a prominent location in the main administrative building or other area where notices of district rules, regulations, procedures, and standards of conduct are posted, including school web sites (Education Code 231.5)
3. Be provided as part of any orientation program conducted for new students at the beginning of each quarter, semester, or summer session (Education Code 231.5)
4. Appear in any school or district publication that sets forth the school's or district's comprehensive rules, regulations, procedures, and standards of conduct (Education Code 231.5)
5. Be included in the student handbook
6. Be provided to employees and employee organizations

(F) School-wide Dress Code Relating to Gang-Related Apparel (EC 35183)

In cooperation with teachers, students, and parents/guardians, the principal or designee may establish school rules governing student dress and grooming which are consistent with law, Board policy, and administrative regulations. These school dress codes shall be regularly reviewed.

The following guidelines shall apply to all regular school activities:

1. Clothing, jewelry, and personal items shall be free of writing, pictures, or any other insignia which is vulgar, lewd, obscene, profane, or sexually suggestive or which promotes the use of alcohol, drugs, tobacco, or other illegal activity.
2. Appropriate shoes must be worn at all times.
3. Hats, caps, and other head coverings shall not be worn indoors.
4. Clothes shall be sufficient to conceal undergarments. See-through tops and bare abdomens are prohibited.

The dress code shall be modified as appropriate to accommodate a student's religious or cultural observance, health condition, or other circumstance deemed necessary by the principal or designee. In addition, the principal or designee may impose dress requirements to accommodate the needs of special school activities, physical education classes, athletic activities, and other extracurricular and cocurricular activities.

No grade of a student participating in a physical education class shall be adversely affected if the student does not wear standardized physical education apparel because of circumstances beyond the student's control. (Education Code 49066)

Students shall be allowed to wear sun-protective clothing, including but not limited to hats, for outdoor use during the school day. (Education Code 35183.5)

Gang-Related Apparel

At individual schools that have a dress code prohibiting gang-related apparel at school or school activities, the principal, staff, and parents/guardians participating in the development of the school safety plan shall define "gang-related apparel" and shall limit this definition to apparel that reasonably could be determined to threaten the health and safety of the school environment if it were worn or displayed on a school campus. (Education Code 32282)

Because gang-related symbols are constantly changing, definitions of gang-related apparel shall be reviewed at least once each semester and updated whenever related information is received. As necessary, the school shall collaborate with law enforcement agencies to update definitions of gang-related apparel.

(G) Procedure for Safe Ingress and Egress of Pupils, Parents, and Staff to and from School (EC 35294.2)

This school site shall implement secure ingress (entry) and egress (exit) procedures to maintain campus safety, account for all individuals on school property, and provide rapid response capabilities in the event of an emergency or threat. These procedures are reviewed annually and revised as needed based on drills, safety audits, and collaboration with local law enforcement and emergency personnel.

1. Daily Campus Access Procedures

- All campus entrances and exits shall be clearly marked and monitored.
- Single Point of Entry: During school hours, access to the campus shall be limited to one monitored entrance, typically the main office or administration building.
- Visitor Check-In:
 - o All visitors must enter through the main entrance and sign in at the front office.
 - o Visitors will be required to present valid identification and wear a visitor badge at all times while on campus.
 - o Staff are trained to report any individual on campus without a visitor badge.
 - Student Arrival and Departure:
- o Designated drop-off and pick-up zones are supervised during arrival and dismissal times.
- o Staff are stationed to monitor crosswalks, loading zones, and pedestrian traffic.
- o Late arrivals and early dismissals must be processed through the front office and require verification by a parent/guardian or emergency contact.

2. Emergency Ingress and Egress Procedures

- Evacuation Routes:
 - o Each classroom and major area of campus has posted evacuation maps indicating primary and secondary egress routes.
 - o All evacuation routes are kept clear of obstructions and are accessible to individuals with disabilities.
 - o Drills are conducted regularly to ensure all students and staff can exit quickly and safely.
- Ingress During Emergency Response:
 - o In the event of a lockdown, shelter-in-place, or other emergency, all gates and doors will be secured to prevent unauthorized entry.
 - o Emergency personnel (e.g., law enforcement, fire department) will be granted access through a designated emergency access point, coordinated by the school's Incident Commander or designee.
 - Controlled Reentry:
 - o After an evacuation or lockdown, reentry will be permitted only after the "all clear" is given by emergency services and the school's Incident Commander.
 - o A sweep of all rooms and restrooms will be conducted prior to reentry.
 - o Student reunification will follow the site's Student Release and Reunification Plan.

3. Special Event and After-Hours Procedures

- For school events open to the public (e.g., performances, sports games, parent nights):
 - o Clearly designated entrances and exits will be used and monitored by staff or security.
 - o Signage and barriers will direct traffic flow.
 - o Emergency exits will be clearly illuminated and unobstructed.
 - o Additional staff or security personnel may be assigned for crowd management.

4. Coordination with Emergency Responders

- Local emergency services are provided with:
 - o Up-to-date campus maps with marked ingress and egress points
 - o Emergency gate keys or codes, as appropriate
 - o Periodic opportunities to participate in drills or site walkthroughs

5. Review and Maintenance

- Ingress and egress procedures are reviewed:
 - o At the beginning of each school year
 - o After each emergency drill or real incident
 - o As part of the school's annual CSSP update
- Facilities staff and site administrators regularly inspect:
 - o Gates, doors, locks, and signage
 - o ADA accessibility of evacuation paths
 - o Emergency lighting and alarms along exit routes

(H) A Safe and Orderly School Environment Conducive to Learning (EC 35294.2)

(I) School Discipline Rules and Consequences (EC 35291 and EC 35291.5)

Lakeview Elementary School Student Conduct Code

Conduct Code Procedures

The Governing Board believes that all students have the right to be educated in a safe and positive learning environment free from disruptions. Students shall be expected to exhibit appropriate conduct that does not infringe upon the rights of others or interfere with the school program while on school grounds, going to or coming from school, at school activities, or using district transportation.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that each school develops standards of conduct and discipline consistent with Board policies and administrative regulations. Students and parents/guardians shall be notified of district and school rules related to conduct.

Prohibited student conduct includes, but is not limited to:

1. Conduct that endangers students, staff, or others, including, but not limited to, physical violence, possession of a firearm or other weapon, and terrorist threats
2. Discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying of students or staff, including sexual harassment, hate-motivated behavior, cyberbullying, hazing or initiation activity, extortion, or any other verbal, written, or physical conduct that causes or threatens to cause violence, bodily harm, or substantial disruption
3. Conduct that disrupts the orderly classroom or school environment
4. Willful defiance of staff's authority
5. Damage to or theft of property belonging to students, staff, or the district.
6. Obscene acts or use of profane, vulgar, or abusive language
7. Possession, use, or being under the influence of tobacco, alcohol, or other prohibited substances
8. Possession or use of a laser pointer, unless for a valid instructional or other school-related purpose with prior permission of the principal or designee (Penal Code 417.27)
9. Use of a smartphone or other mobile communication device in an unauthorized manner
10. Plagiarism or dishonesty on school work or tests

11. Wearing of any attire that violates district or school dress codes, including gang-related apparel
12. Tardiness or unexcused absence from school
13. Failure to remain on school premises in accordance with school rules
14. Other conduct prohibited by Education Code 48900-48915-48915

Employees are expected to enforce standards of conduct and when they observe or receive a report of a violation of these standards, to appropriately intervene, or seek assistance. As necessary, the employee shall refer the matter to a supervisor or the principal or designee.

When a school employee suspects that a search of a student or a student's belongings will turn up evidence of the student's violation of the law or school rules, such a search shall be conducted in accordance with Board Policy and Administrative Regulation 5145.12 - Search and Seizure.

When a student uses any prohibited device, or uses a permitted device in an unauthorized manner, a district employee may confiscate the device. The employee shall store the device securely until it is returned to the student or turned over to the principal or designee, as appropriate.

Students who violate district or school rules and regulations may be subject to discipline including, but not limited to, suspension, expulsion, transfer to alternative programs, referral to a student success team or counseling services, or denial of participation in extracurricular or cocurricular activities or other privileges in accordance with Board policy and administrative regulation. The Superintendent or designee shall notify local law enforcement as appropriate.

Students also may be subject to discipline, in accordance with law, Board policy, or administrative regulation, for any off-campus conduct during nonschool hours which poses a threat or danger to the safety of students, staff, or district property, or substantially disrupts school activities.

(K) Hate Crime Reporting Procedures and Policies

The Governing Board is committed to providing a safe learning environment that protects students from discrimination, harassment, intimidation, bullying, and other behavior motivated by a person's hostility towards another person's real or perceived ethnicity, national origin, immigrant status, sex, gender, sexual orientation, religious belief, age, disability, or any other physical or cultural characteristic. The Superintendent or designee shall design strategies to promote harmonious relationships among students, prevent incidents of hate-motivated behavior to the extent possible, and address such incidents if they occur.

The Superintendent or designee shall collaborate with regional programs and community organizations to promote safe environments for youth. Such collaborative efforts shall focus on ensuring an efficient use of district and community resources, developing effective prevention strategies and response plans, providing assistance to students affected by hate-motivated behavior, and/or educating students who have perpetrated hate-motivated acts.

The district shall provide students with age-appropriate instruction that includes the development of social-emotional learning, promotes their understanding of and respect for human rights, diversity, and acceptance in a multicultural society, and provides strategies to manage conflicts constructively.

As necessary, the district shall provide counseling, guidance, and support to students who are victims of hate-motivated behavior and to students who exhibit such behavior.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the rules prohibiting hate-motivated behavior and procedures for reporting a hate-motivated incident are provided to students and parents/guardians.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide staff with training on recognizing and preventing hate-motivated behavior and on effectively enforcing rules for appropriate student conduct.

Complaint Process

A student or parent/guardian who believes the student is a victim of hate-motivated behavior is strongly encouraged to report the incident to a teacher, the principal, or other staff member.

Any staff member who is notified that hate-motivated behavior has occurred, observes such behavior, or otherwise becomes aware of an incident shall immediately contact the principal or the compliance officer responsible for coordinating the district's response to complaints and complying with state and federal civil rights laws. As appropriate, he/she shall also contact law enforcement.

Any complaint of hate-motivated behavior shall be investigated and, if determined to be discriminatory, shall be resolved in accordance with law and the district's uniform complaint procedures specified in AR 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures. If, during the investigation, it is determined that a complaint is about nondiscriminatory behavior, the principal or designee shall inform the complainant and shall take all necessary actions to resolve the complaint.

Anonymous reporting for hate crimes or any other crimes can be reported through the school We-Tip reporting portal that can be found on the District or school website.

(J) Procedures to Prepare for Active Shooters

1. Prevention and Awareness

- Promote a safe school climate through:
- Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS)
- School-wide anti-bullying efforts
- Mental health services and threat assessment procedures
- Encourage the use of anonymous reporting tools for students and staff to report threats or concerning behavior (e.g., see something, say something).
- Conduct behavioral threat assessments for students exhibiting concerning behaviors, in coordination with the district threat assessment team and law enforcement if necessary.

2. Staff and Student Training

- Provide annual training for all staff on:
- Recognizing warning signs of potential violence
- Emergency procedures and lockdown protocols
- Use of Run-Hide-Fight or SRP-based strategies
- Provide age-appropriate drills and education for students to ensure understanding without trauma or fear.
- Ensure training is trauma-informed and inclusive of students with disabilities, English learners, and other vulnerable populations.

3. Coordination with First Responders

- Maintain up-to-date campus maps, master keys, and emergency contact lists in the school's emergency kits.
- Work with local law enforcement and fire departments to:
- Develop and review tactical response plans
- Conduct joint drills or tabletop exercises
- Establish unified command procedures under ICS (Incident Command System)

Procedures for Preventing Acts of Bullying and Cyber-bullying

The school provides resources for parents, administrators, and students on how bullying can be prevented and addressed. Resources include publications, sample policies, and frequently asked questions.

Bullying is a form of violence. It can be physical, verbal, psychological, or sexual. Here are some examples of bullying:

- Physical: hitting, kicking, spitting, pushing
- Verbal: teasing, threatening, name-calling
- Psychological: excluding someone, spreading rumors, intimidating
- Sexual: touching, assault, exhibitionism, and many of the actions listed above

Bullying may also occur through the Internet or other forms of technology. This is known as cyberbullying. It is sending or posting hurtful material.

Bullying is common, but it should not be viewed as a normal part of growing up. It is more damaging to children than previously

thought. Bullying has a negative effect on a student's ability to learn.

Schools are responsible for creating safe environments for all students. They must work to prevent bullying, and they must respond to it when it happens.

The California Department of Education offers information and resources for parents, administrators, and students about bullying. A Community Responsibility

Bullying is such a long-established behavior in our society and schools that it has often been ignored as "a normal part of growing up." However, research has shown that there are severe long-term consequences for both the targets and the bullies. Further, severe reactions to bullying have been cited as one of the causes of the extremely violent incidents on school campuses that have received so much media attention in recent years.

Fortunately, well-documented research has been done which provides techniques for preventing bullying, responding to incidents of bullying, and dealing with its long term consequences. The key elements of a bullying prevention program are:

- Raising awareness of bullying through actions such as surveys of prevalence and role-playing events at assemblies.
- Formation of a bullying prevention committee which represents the entire school community and which is responsible for choosing and implementing a prevention program.
- Defining bullying and making it clear to all staff and students that it is unacceptable.
- Adapt and implement bullying prevention policies.
- Training all members of the school community in the appropriate responses to observed incidents of bullying.
- Providing counseling for persistent bullies, targets, and their parents/guardians.
- Regular review of effectiveness of the anti-bullying program.

There are a number of resources available which contain detailed information about comprehensive bullying prevention programs. These research-based programs describe the elements above, and also contain:

- Broadly conceived definitions of bullying, including behaviors such as social ostracism in addition to the traditionally-considered physical dominance behaviors.
- Bullying prevalence questionnaires.
- Appropriate interventions for bullying situations, and for chronic bullies and targets.

Opioid Prevention and Life-Saving Response Procedures

In response to the growing opioid crisis and the presence of synthetic opioids such as fentanyl in the community, this school recognizes the urgent need to prepare staff and students with the tools and knowledge to prevent overdose deaths. The school shall maintain naloxone (Narcan) on campus and ensure trained staff are available to administer it in case of a suspected opioid overdose. Prevention education will also be implemented as part of the health curriculum and student wellness efforts.

1. Prevention and Education

- Age-appropriate opioid prevention education shall be incorporated into middle school health instruction, in alignment with the California Health Education Framework.
- Instruction may include:

o Risks of prescription and synthetic opioids (e.g., fentanyl)

o Dangers of counterfeit pills

o The importance of seeking help for substance use

o Information on how to respond to an overdose

- The school may partner with community-based organizations, county health departments, or school resource officers (SROs) to support prevention programming and distribute educational materials.

2. Naloxone (Narcan) Availability

- The school shall maintain readily accessible naloxone kits on campus, located in:

o The health office or nurse's station

o AED (Automated External Defibrillator) boxes (if applicable)

o Other high-traffic or high-risk areas as designated by administration

- The district will ensure that:

- o Naloxone is stored properly per manufacturer guidelines
- o Expired doses are safely discarded and replaced
- o Inventory is tracked annually

3. Staff Training and Responsibilities

- Designated school personnel (e.g., nurses, administrators, security staff, select teachers) shall receive annual training in:
 - o Recognizing signs of opioid overdose (e.g., unresponsiveness, slow or no breathing, blue lips or fingernails, gurgling sounds)
 - o Proper storage, handling, and administration of naloxone
 - o Basic first aid and CPR procedures
 - o 911 activation and emergency reporting
- Training is provided in accordance with Education Code §49414.3 and includes hands-on or video-based instruction.

4. Emergency Response Procedures

If a Suspected Opioid Overdose Occurs:

1. Call 911 immediately
2. Administer naloxone (Narcan) as trained
 - o Follow dosage instructions (usually 1 spray into one nostril)
 - o If no improvement in 2–3 minutes, a second dose may be given
3. Begin CPR if the individual is not breathing or does not have a pulse
4. Stay with the person until emergency responders arrive
5. Notify the school administrator or designee immediately

After the Incident:

- Document the incident and naloxone usage as required by district policy
- Notify the parent/guardian if the individual is a student
- Offer referral to counseling or substance use resources

5. Coordination with Local Health and Emergency Services

- The school will coordinate with:
 - o Local public health departments for naloxone acquisition, education, and training resources
 - o Law enforcement and emergency medical services (EMS) for appropriate response protocols
- Schools may participate in opioid response networks or county overdose prevention coalitions

6. Confidentiality and Student Support

- Students involved in an opioid-related emergency or requesting help will be treated with compassion and confidentiality, and shall not face punitive discipline solely for a medical emergency.
- The school will offer connections to:
 - o Substance use counseling
 - o Mental health resources
 - o Community treatment programs

7. Legal Protection and Good Samaritan Laws

- Under California’s Good Samaritan laws (Health & Safety Code §1799.102), individuals who administer naloxone in good faith during a suspected overdose are protected from legal liability.
- Students and staff are also protected when seeking emergency medical help during an overdose, even if illegal substances are involved, under AB 472 – The 911 Good Samaritan Law.

Response Procedures for Dangerous, Violent, or Unlawful Activities

All school staff must report and respond to incidents involving threats to school safety, including but not limited to acts of violence, possession of weapons, criminal behavior, gang activity, and illegal substance use. School staff will follow these procedures in collaboration with law enforcement, site administrators, and district safety teams, consistent with legal obligations and student rights.

1. Types of Dangerous or Unlawful Activities Addressed

- Physical altercations or assaults
- Threats of violence, including written or verbal threats
- Weapons possession or use
- Drug or alcohol possession or distribution
- Vandalism or destruction of school property
- Gang-related activity or intimidation
- Hate crimes or bias-motivated threats
- Sexual harassment or misconduct
- Trespassing or unauthorized individuals on campus

2. Immediate Staff Response

- Ensure safety first: Call 911 if there is an immediate threat to life or serious injury.
- Notify the principal or site administrator immediately.
- Do not attempt to physically intervene in violent altercations unless trained and it is necessary to prevent harm.
- Use the school's emergency communication system (e.g., PA system, radio, phone) to alert others if appropriate.

3. Incident Containment and Student Protection

- Move bystanders and uninvolved students to a safe area.
- If needed, initiate:

o Lockdown (for armed or violent intruder situations)

o Shelter-in-Place (for threats in the surrounding community)

o Evacuation (for bomb threats, fires, or hazardous materials)

- Supervise all students under staff care until the all-clear is given.

4. Notification and Coordination

- Contact appropriate agencies:

o Law enforcement for criminal or violent activity

o District office safety coordinator or student services

o Child Protective Services (CPS) if child abuse is suspected

- Secure and preserve evidence (e.g., written threats, surveillance footage, contraband) without handling more than necessary.
- Complete an incident report within 24 hours of the event.

5. Investigation and Disciplinary Response

- The site administrator will initiate an investigation per district policy.
- Disciplinary action will be taken in accordance with:

o California Education Code §48900–48915

o District disciplinary guidelines

o Due process rights of students

- Law enforcement will handle any criminal charges or citations independently of school discipline.

6. Communication to Families and Community

- Parents/guardians of involved students will be notified as soon as appropriate.
- Broader communication to the school community will be coordinated by the district's Public Information Officer (PIO) to ensure accurate, lawful, and trauma-sensitive messaging.

7. Support Services

- Provide access to:

o School counselors or psychologists

o Crisis response or mental health teams

o Restorative justice or conflict resolution programs (as applicable)

- Offer debriefing and support for affected students, staff, and families.

8. Documentation and Review

- Maintain confidential records of:

- o The incident
- o Actions taken
- o Law enforcement involvement
- o Parent/guardian notifications
 - Each incident will be reviewed by the school safety committee to assess response effectiveness and update procedures if needed.

9. Prevention and Training

- Staff shall receive annual training in:
 - o De-escalation techniques
 - o Threat recognition and reporting
 - o Safe response to violent behavior
 - o Student rights and legal mandates
 - Schools shall implement:
 - o School-wide behavior expectations (e.g., PBIS)
 - o Anonymous reporting systems
 - o Early intervention protocols for students exhibiting concerning behavior

Instructional Continuity Plan

Lakeview Elementary will implement an Instructional Continuity Plan to ensure the ongoing delivery of instruction and student support during emergencies that disrupt normal school operations. The plan includes alternative instructional methods, clear communication systems, and equitable access to learning resources. Staff will collaborate to provide consistent instruction, maintain student engagement, and support academic and emotional well-being until normal operations resume.

Introduction and Purpose of the Instructional Continuity Plan (ICP)

Information about the Instructional Continuity Plan (ICP) requirements, revision and adoption dates.

This Instructional Continuity Plan (ICP) was last revised on June 4, 2025 and adopted by Lakeview Elementary School on June 10, 2025 to ensure all students have access to instruction during a natural disaster or emergency, as mandated by Senate Bill 153, Chapter 38, Statutes of 2024 (SB 153), which adds a provision to California Education Code (EC) Section 32282. This ICP will be included in the LEA’s Comprehensive School Safety Plan (CSSP) by July 1, 2025. Inclusion of this ICP in the CSSP will be required to obtain approval of a Form J-13A waiver request beginning in fiscal year 2026-27. This plan is intended to minimize disruptions to instruction and provide support for pupils’ social-emotional, mental health, and academic needs.

Engagement with Pupils and Families

Protocol for Engagement

Protocol for engagement with pupils and their families.

As required, Lakeview Elementary School will engage with pupils and their families as soon as practicable, but **no later than five calendar days** following an emergency.

Methods of Two-Way Communication

Methods for two-way engagement.

The protocol for engagement with pupils and their families is designed to establish two-way communication. Current existing methods include:

- Short messaging service (SMS)
- Phone Calls
- Email

School Portal
Social Media
Flyers

These communication strategies not only support emergency response efforts, but also strengthen ongoing collaboration between home and school. By prioritizing two-way communication, the Rescue Union School District ensures that families are informed, supported, and engaged—helping to foster student stability, emotional well-being, and continuity of learning throughout any disruption.

Plans for Unforeseen Events

Plans to address unforeseen events such as power outages and damage to infrastructure and how they may impact methods for two-way communication.

Lakeview Elementary School recognizes that unforeseen events—such as power outages, natural disasters, or damage to school or district infrastructure—can significantly impact our ability to maintain consistent two-way communication with students and families. As part of our Learning Continuity Plan, we have developed contingency strategies to ensure that communication remains as accessible and responsive as possible during these challenging times.

When digital communication methods such as email, SMS, and the district website may be temporarily unavailable due to technical disruptions, our staff will activate alternative approaches and prioritize methods that do not rely on internet access or electricity. These include:

Utilizing Mobile Networks for SMS and Phone Calls: In areas where mobile service remains intact, the district will continue to use text messages and phone calls as the primary means of communication with families.

Posting Information at Central Locations: Physical flyers and notices may be posted at key community locations such as school entrances, district offices, and local gathering places when safe to do so.

Radio or Local News Alerts: If applicable and feasible, important messages may be relayed through local radio stations or community news outlets to reach a broader audience.

Coordination with Emergency Services: The district may also work with local emergency management agencies to disseminate critical information and updates to families through established public communication channels.

Home Visits in Extreme Cases: In the event of prolonged outages and when other methods are inaccessible, site administrators or designated staff may conduct wellness checks or deliver printed information directly to homes, conditions permitting and with safety as the top priority.

Through these contingency measures, Rescue Union School District strives to maintain clear and compassionate communication—even under the most difficult circumstances. These efforts reflect our unwavering commitment to student safety, continuity of instruction, and maintaining strong family-school partnerships, no matter the situation.

Support for Special Needs

Plans designed to identify and provide support for pupils' social-emotional, mental health, and academic needs.

Lakeview Elementary School is deeply committed to nurturing the whole child by providing comprehensive support systems that address not only academic success, but also the social-emotional and mental health needs of every student. We understand that in order for students to thrive in their learning environments—whether in person or during periods of instructional disruption—they must feel safe, supported, and connected.

To ensure our students receive the care and guidance they need, we have a well-established network of professionals across all school sites, including:

School Counselors who deliver classroom lessons, individual support, and small group counseling to promote emotional regulation, social skills, conflict resolution, and healthy decision-making.

School Behaviorists who provide targeted behavioral interventions and collaborate with staff to implement positive behavior supports and response strategies.

School Psychologists who assess and support students' learning needs, provide mental health counseling, and contribute to individualized education plans and crisis intervention efforts.

School Nurses who offer health screenings, manage chronic conditions, respond to student health concerns, and serve as critical links in coordinating care and referrals to outside providers.

Special Education Teams including teachers, instructional aides, speech and language pathologists, occupational therapists, and other specialists who work collaboratively to provide individualized services and ensure access to curriculum for students with disabilities.

In addition to individual supports, the district utilizes evidence-based programs and initiatives to create safe and inclusive school climates. These include social-emotional learning (SEL) curricula, character education, and wellness initiatives designed to build resilience, empathy, and a positive sense of self in all students.

During times of crisis or remote learning, our staff remains in close contact with families and students to ensure continuity of services. Tele-counseling, virtual IEP meetings, home check-ins, and digital learning support are all strategies used to maintain strong, student-centered connections, regardless of setting.

Through these efforts, Rescue Union School District ensures that every child—no matter their circumstances—has access to a caring, capable team of professionals dedicated to their well-being and success.

Access to Instruction

Timeline for Access to Instruction

Timeline for access to instruction.

As required, Lakeview Elementary School will provide access to in-person or remote instruction as soon as practicable, but **no more than 10 instructional days** following the emergency.

Access to In-Person Instruction

Conditions under which in-person instruction will resume and any alternative sites or arrangements.

As required, Lakeview Elementary School will provide access to in-person or remote instruction as soon as practicable, but **no more than 10 instructional days** following the emergency.

Remote Instruction

Plans for remote instruction.

As required, Lakeview Elementary School remote instruction will align with EC sections 51747 and 51749.5, governing Independent Study instruction modalities. Remote instruction will be designed to meet instructional standards that are, at minimum, equivalent to those applicable in independent study programs.

Plans for remote learning will include:

- * Daily interaction with teachers for all students,
- * Synchronous and asynchronous learning activities,
- * Standards-aligned instruction delivered through digital platforms, and
- * Regular progress monitoring and feedback to students and families.

Access to Instructional Materials

Methods for distributing digital and non-digital materials.

As required, remote instruction offered will align with expectations of access and equity.

To ensure students can fully engage in learning, Rescue Union School District will provide both digital and non-digital instructional materials based on student needs. These materials may be distributed through:

- * On-site pickup or drive-through distribution events,
- * Delivery to homes when transportation is a barrier,
- * Downloadable resources through the district or school websites, and
- * Printed packets for families without reliable internet access.

Access to Schoolwork

Platforms and processes for accessing and submitting schoolwork.

As required, remote instruction offered will align with expectations of access and equity.

Students will access lessons and submit assignments using familiar digital platforms:

- * Google Classroom will serve as the primary platform for all grade levels to access instructional content, submit assignments, and communicate with teachers.
- * Jupiter Ed will also be utilized at the middle school level for assignment tracking, communication, and grading.
- * Teachers and staff will provide training and ongoing support to students and families on how to navigate these platforms.

Temporary Reassignment

Procedures and agreements for temporary reassignment with neighboring LEAs.

Lakeview Elementary School provides support to pupils and families to enroll in or be temporarily reassigned to another site, school district, county office of education, or charter school if an emergency or natural disaster disrupts in-person learning:

In the event that a school closure extends beyond the district's capacity to resume instruction, students may be temporarily reassigned to neighboring local education agencies (LEAs). This will be done in collaboration with the El Dorado County Office of Education and surrounding districts. Procedures for temporary reassignment will include:

- * Parent and guardian notification and consent,
- * Coordination of transportation and services,
- * Continuity of academic records and supports (including IEPs and 504 Plans), and
- * Transition back to the home school once conditions allow.

These plans reflect our district's strong commitment to maintaining educational continuity, minimizing learning loss, and supporting students and families during times of uncertainty.

Instructional Continuity

Communication Protocols

Communication protocols for families, students, staff and faculty, including how information will be made available and with what frequency including methods and timelines.

Timely and transparent communication is essential during any instructional transition. To keep students, families, staff, and faculty informed:

Communication Methods: The district will use a combination of SMS (text messages), phone calls, email, Google Classroom announcements, district and school websites, social media platforms, and printed flyers when needed.

Timelines and Frequency: Major updates will be communicated within 24–48 hours of any change in instructional delivery. Ongoing updates, resources, and instructions will be provided at least weekly, with immediate alerts issued for urgent matters.

Audience-Specific Outreach: Separate communication streams will be maintained for families, students, staff, and faculty to ensure that all stakeholders receive relevant and targeted information.

Tehnological Readiness

Technology readiness for educators and students to support a pivot from in-person to remote learning through independent study including early access to independent study program written agreements, online access to assignments and academic resources, assignment of devices, online instructional platform and access to internet and devices.

To support a rapid pivot from in-person to remote learning, the district has invested in tools, training, and infrastructure that prepare both students and educators for success in a digital environment.

Device Access: All students in grades 1–8 are assigned Chromebooks, while students in Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten have access to iPads. Devices are distributed at the start of the year and as needed during emergencies.

Internet Connectivity: The district provides support for families who lack internet access, including Wi-Fi hotspots or coordination with internet service providers for low-cost options.

Online Platforms: Students and teachers utilize Google Classroom for accessing assignments, instructional content, and class communication. Jupiter Ed is also used in middle schools for assignment tracking and communication.

Educator Readiness: Teachers receive regular professional development on digital tools, remote instructional strategies, and the implementation of Independent Study in alignment with California Education Code sections 51747 and 51749.5.

Instruction and Assessment

Prioritization of esesntial learning, making standards-aligned learning objectives, methods for monitoring progress and additional support whenever possible, including tutoring, check-ins, virtual office hours or other methods.

Access (Equity, Accessibility, and Inclusion)

Equity, Accessibility, and Inclusion

How all students, including those with disabilities, those experiencing homelessness, foster youth, or English learner (EL) students will continue to have equal access to instructional resources.

During a shift to remote instruction, the district ensures continuity of learning by prioritizing essential academic standards and maintaining rigorous expectations.

Essential Learning Prioritization: Grade-level and subject-area teams identify standards-aligned learning objectives that are most critical for student success and progression.

Monitoring Progress: Teachers use formative and summative assessments, assignment completion rates, and direct student feedback to monitor progress and adjust instruction accordingly.

Support Services: To support ongoing learning, the district offers:

- * Virtual office hours and drop-in help sessions,
- * Scheduled check-ins for students needing additional guidance,
- * Small group or one-on-one tutoring, and

- * Continued access to intervention programs and academic specialists.

Through these coordinated efforts, Rescue Union School District ensures that all students remain connected, supported, and engaged in their learning, regardless of the instructional format. Our instructional continuity planning reflects the district's deep commitment to equity, academic excellence, and the well-being of our students.

Individualized Education Plans (IEP)

How will IEPs continue to be provided and maintained.

In the event of an emergency or disaster that prevents in-person instruction, Lakeview Elementary School is committed to ensuring that all students, including students with disabilities, continue to have equal access to instructional resources and support. All students will transition to a robust distance learning model using district-provided Chromebooks for all students in grades 1–5 and iPads for all students in Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten. Online platforms such as Google Classroom, Benchmark Advance, Go Math, Twig Science, IXL, Reflex Math, and Accelerated Reader will be utilized to deliver standards-based instruction, maintain academic continuity, and differentiate support based on students' needs.

Students with disabilities will continue to receive services outlined in their Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) through virtual platforms. Special education teachers, aides, related service providers, and general education teachers will collaborate regularly via online meetings to ensure that accommodations, modifications, and direct services are maintained. IEP meetings will be held virtually to ensure ongoing compliance with IDEA requirements, and services such as speech therapy, counseling, and occupational therapy will be provided remotely when feasible.

English Learners (EL)

How will EL students continue to be supported in alignment with the California English Learner Roadmap Policy.

English learners (ELs) will continue to receive designated and integrated English Language Development (ELD) instruction through online small groups and individual sessions with credentialed teachers. Instruction will remain aligned to the California English Learner Roadmap Policy, ensuring students have full access to grade-level academic content, scaffolded supports to develop English proficiency, and culturally and linguistically sustaining practices. Regular monitoring of language acquisition progress will occur through formative assessments and ELPAC testing, with ongoing communication with families in their preferred languages. Through these comprehensive strategies, Lakeview Elementary School will ensure that all students continue to learn, grow, and stay connected during emergency or disaster closures, with special attention to our most vulnerable populations.

Professional Learning

Professional learning opportunities and resources utilized to if the need to pivot to remote instruction and assessment arises.

The district will offer ongoing professional development focused on essential areas such as:

- * **Effective Remote Instructional Strategies:** Training sessions on how to engage students in a virtual environment, including best practices for synchronous and asynchronous learning.
- * **Technology Tools and Platforms:** Workshops and tutorials on the effective use of Google Classroom, Jupiter Ed (for middle schools), Zoom, and other digital tools used for instruction, communication, and assessment.
- * **Independent Study Requirements:** Guidance on meeting California Education Code sections 51747 and 51749.5, including how to implement attendance documentation, daily engagement, and student participation requirements.
- * **Assessment in a Remote Environment:** Strategies for administering formative and summative assessments virtually, monitoring student progress, and providing feedback to support learning.
- * **Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) and Student Engagement:** Training on integrating SEL practices into remote instruction to maintain student connection, well-being, and motivation.

Professional development will be offered in multiple formats—including live virtual workshops, on-demand recorded sessions, and hands-on coaching—to meet the varied needs of our educators.

Resources for Staff

To support ongoing learning and immediate application of skills, the district will provide:

- * A digital resource library with tutorials, templates, and instructional guides,
- * Access to help desks and tech support teams during instructional hours,
- * Sample lesson plans and digital curriculum resources aligned to state standards, and
- * Collaboration opportunities through professional learning communities (PLCs) to share best practices and innovative solutions.

Through these comprehensive professional learning systems and supports, Rescue Union School District ensures that teachers and staff are well-equipped to maintain instructional excellence and student engagement, even during the challenges presented by an emergency or shift to remote learning.

Well-Being and Support Services

How the LEA will provide access to physical and mental health professionals, including those who speak languages other than English.

In the event of an emergency or natural disaster, Rescue Union School District is committed to maintaining the physical and mental health support systems that are essential to student and family well-being. The district has developed comprehensive plans to ensure ongoing access to critical health services, educational supports, and basic needs assistance—both during in-person instruction and adapted for remote or hybrid learning environments.

Access to Physical and Mental Health Professionals

The district will continue to provide access to a full range of health professionals, including:

- * School Nurses who support the physical health needs of students, provide medication management, health screenings, and respond to medical emergencies.
- * School Counselors, Behaviorists, and Psychologists who offer mental health counseling, crisis intervention, social-emotional support, and behavioral consultation.
- * Multilingual Staff and Services: To ensure equitable access, the district will make available staff and interpreters who can provide mental health and health services in languages other than English, supporting the needs of our diverse student population.

Virtual telehealth services, phone consultations, and translated communications will be available when face-to-face services are not possible.

Plans to provide access back-up, water and medicines in the event of an emergency.

In preparation for emergencies, each school site maintains backup water supplies, non-perishable food, and essential medicines (in accordance with student health plans). Emergency supply inventories are regularly updated and reviewed, and school nurses coordinate medication needs to ensure continuity of care during extended disruptions.

Plans to ensure continuity of other support services, including special education, counseling, after-school programs, and access to kitchens and food services, adapting these services to the online or hybrid environment when necessary.

Lakeview Elementary School's plan ensures that other critical student support services continue, even during transitions to remote or hybrid learning:

- * Special Education Services: Students with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) and Section 504 Plans will continue to receive services, supports, and accommodations through virtual meetings, teletherapy sessions, home visits (if necessary and safe), and online specialized instruction.

- * Counseling and Wellness Services: Regular check-ins, virtual counseling sessions, small group social-emotional lessons, and crisis response services will be maintained.
- * Expanded Learning (After-School Programs): If in-person after-school programs are disrupted, the district will offer virtual after-school engagement opportunities, including academic tutoring, enrichment activities, and social clubs.
- * Nutrition Services: Kitchens and food services will remain operational to the extent possible, with adaptations including grab-and-go meal distribution, meal delivery options, or other approved community meal programs for students during periods of remote learning or extended school closures.

Through these coordinated efforts, Lakeview Elementary School ensures that every student continues to have access to the essential services they need to thrive—academically, physically, and emotionally—no matter the circumstances.

Site-Based Collaboration

How administrators, faculty, information technology staff, students, and parents in the development and implementation of this ICP.

Lakeview Elementary School strongly believes that the success of the Instructional Continuity Plan relies on collaboration with all members of our school community. The development and implementation of this plan reflect the input and shared expertise of administrators, faculty, information technology staff, students, and parents, ensuring a plan that is both comprehensive and responsive to the needs of all stakeholders.

To gather meaningful feedback during the development of this plan, the district utilized several established engagement tools:

- * Culture and Climate Survey: Students across the district participated in the annual Culture and Climate Survey, providing valuable feedback on their experiences related to school safety, belonging, engagement, and emotional well-being. Their input helped shape priorities for maintaining connection and support during times of disruption.
- * LCAP Survey: Families were invited to share their perspectives through the district's Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) Survey. Responses highlighted family priorities around communication, academic support, access to technology, and social-emotional learning, all of which are reflected in the plan's strategies.
- * Department Services and Employee Services Surveys: Faculty and staff provided critical feedback through the Department Services and Employee Services Surveys, sharing insights into the operational needs, professional development priorities, and resources necessary to maintain instructional quality and student support during emergencies.

In addition to these surveys, School Site Councils—which include administrators, teachers, parents, and community members—were given opportunities to review, discuss, and provide input on the draft Instructional Continuity Plan. This collaborative process ensures that the voices of our school communities are not only heard but integrated into the decision-making and action steps outlined in the plan.

By incorporating this broad base of feedback, Rescue Union School District's Instructional Continuity Plan is firmly rooted in the shared commitment to providing safe, supportive, and effective learning environments for every student, even in the face of unexpected challenges.

Return to Site-Based Learning

Conditions that must be met prior to returning from disruption including reopening sites.

Lakeview Elementary School is committed to ensuring that any return to in-person learning following a disruption due to an emergency or disaster is safe, organized, and supportive for students, staff, and families. Our decision-making will be guided by a focus on health, safety, and the well-being of our entire school community.

The following conditions must be met before reopening school sites for in-person instruction:

- * Facility Safety Inspections: School facilities must undergo thorough inspections to ensure that buildings, grounds, and essential systems (e.g., electrical, HVAC, water) are safe, operational, and compliant with local, state, and federal safety standards.
- * Clearance by Local Authorities: The district will coordinate closely with local health departments, fire marshals, and emergency management agencies to receive clearance that it is safe to reopen.
- * Availability of Essential Utilities and Supplies: Schools must have stable access to clean water, electricity, internet connectivity, and emergency supplies, including food and medical resources, to meet student and staff needs.

- * Restoration of Transportation Services: Student transportation must be available and safe to resume normal or adjusted operations to ensure access for all students.
- * Staff Readiness and Safety Measures: Adequate staffing must be in place, including access to health and support personnel. Any required health and safety measures, such as personal protective equipment (PPE), cleaning protocols, or health screenings, must also be ready for implementation if conditions warrant.
- * Communication to Families and Staff: Families, students, and employees will receive clear and timely communication outlining reopening plans, updated safety protocols, expectations for attendance, and supports available during the transition.
- * Mental Health and Academic Reentry Supports: Plans will be in place to support the emotional and academic transition back to campus, including counseling services, trauma-informed practices, and academic assessments to determine individual student needs.

In the event that full reopening is not immediately possible, the district may implement a phased reopening plan or temporary hybrid model to prioritize the return of certain groups of students first, such as those with specialized needs, early learners, or students requiring intensive support.

Integration with Comprehensive School Safety Plan (CSSP)

Integration of this Instructional Continuity Plan (ICP) into Lakeview Elementary School’s Comprehensive School Safety Plan (CSSP).

This Instructional Continuity Plan (ICP) will be included as an integral component of Lakeview Elementary School's Comprehensive School Safety Plan (CSSP) by July 1, 2025, as required by SB 153. The information in this ICP will be considered in relation to other aspects of the existing safety plan. A locally-adopted CSSP must include this ICP to obtain approval of a Form J-13A waiver request beginning in fiscal year 2026-27.

Review and Updates of this Instructional Continuity Plan (ICP)

Frequency of review and update of this ICP.

This Instructional Continuity Plan will be reviewed and updated in collaboration with Educational Partners, considering feedback and lessons learned on the following basis:

- * School Site Councils and Advisory Committees,
- * Survey data from students (Culture and Climate Survey), families (LCAP Survey), and staff (Department and Employee Services Surveys), and
- * Input from school administrators and district leadership teams.

Procedures for Immigration Enforcement Notification

Confirmation Protocol

Detail the specific process and designated staff member (e.g., principal, superintendent) responsible for confirming the presence of immigration enforcement on the schoolsite, which triggers the notification requirement.

Site Administrative staff will confirm the presence of immigration enforcement on the school site to the Superintendent and/or Assistant Superintendent. This notification will trigger the notification requirement.

Required Notification Recipients

The procedures must ensure notification is issued to the following groups:

- Parents and guardians of pupils
- Teachers
- Administrators
- School personnel

Once notification regarding immigration enforcement on a school site is prepared, all stakeholders shall be notified, including parents and guardians, all school site staff (certificated and classified), and administrators.

Notification Timing

Specify the timeline for issuing notification following confirmation, ensuring it aligns with safety goals and minimizes panic.

The site administrator will complete an Immigration Notification Incident Report noting date, time, officer names, documents presented, and actions taken and will submit to the District Office within 24 hours. The notification will be issued to all stakeholders as soon as possible of any immigration enforcement request or contact involving their student, unless prohibited by law.

Safety and Well-being Standard

The content and timing of the notification shall consider the safety and well-being of the pupils, employees, and community members of the schoolsite.

The safety of students will take precedence over communication. Once safety and an orderly environment have been secured, detailed communication will be sent to all stakeholders that has been approved by the Superintendent or designee.

Privacy Constraint

The notification shall not include any personally identifiable information.

The District shall not release student records or personal information without legal verification and approval by the District Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent, per FERPA and Ed Code §49076.

Notification Methods

Specify the secure methods used for two-way communication to reach the required recipients, such as mass communication systems, email, or school portals, and detail how these methods are maintained.

Communication may be done through Catapult emails, text messages, or phone calls. Additionally, Google Classroom and/or Jupiter Ed may be used at the middle school level.

Resource Provision (Optional but Encouraged)

The notification may include a hyperlink to additional resources for families regarding:

- Educational rights
- State laws that protect parents' and students' privacy and confidentiality
- Counseling or support services (including services that support families impacted by immigration enforcement and model policies adopted by the LEA).

Communication will be limited to information regarding the ICE visit.

Annual Evaluation

This plan will be evaluated and amended, as needed, by the school safety planning committee, but shall be evaluated at least once a year.

Public Availability

An updated file of all safety-related plans and materials shall be readily available for inspection by the public.

The School Site Safety plan is available by request only.

State Guidance

Compliance with this plan should align with the checklist for developing a comprehensive school safety plan, which the Department of Education is required to maintain and conspicuously post on its internet website

Safety Plan Review, Evaluation and Amendment Procedures

The Lakeview Elementary School comprehensive safety plan will be reviewed, evaluated and amended (if necessary) in January each year.

Pursuant to Education Code Section 35294.6(a), the Rescue Union School District adopts this comprehensive school safety plan at a regular meeting of the Board of Trustees. An opportunity for public comment will be provided during this meeting, prior to the plan's adoption.



Incident Command Team Responsibilities

Standardized Emergency Response Management System Overview

The California Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS) is designed to centralize and coordinate emergency response through the use of standardized terminology and processes. This greatly facilitates the flow of information and resources among the agencies participating in response to an emergency. SEMS consists of five functions:

Management

During an emergency, the Incident Commander directs response actions from a designated Command Post. To effectively do this, the Incident Commander must constantly assess the situation, and develop and implement appropriate strategies. The Incident Commander must be familiar with the available resources, accurately document all response actions, and effectively communicate response strategies to others participating in the response. This function is typically filled by the school principal. The principal is assisted in carrying out this function by a Public Information & Liaison Officer and Safety Officer.

Planning & Intelligence

Planning and Intelligence involves the use of various methods to efficiently gather information, weigh and document the information for significance, and actively assess the status of the emergency. This understanding and knowledge about the situation at hand is vital to the effective management of a response. These activities are performed by a single person who reports directly to the Incident Commander.

Operations

All response actions are implemented under by Operations. This includes staff performing first aid, crisis intervention, search and rescue, site security, damage assessment, evacuations, and the release of students.

Logistics

Logistics supports the response by coordinating personnel; assembling and deploying volunteers; providing supplies, equipment, and services; and facilitating communications among emergency responders.

Finance & Administration

Finance & Administration involves the purchasing of all necessary materials, tracking financial records, timekeeping for emergency responders, and recovering school records following an emergency. These activities are performed by a single person who reports directly to the Incident Commander.

Emergency Response Guidelines

Step One: Identify the Type of Emergency

The first response to an emergency is to determine the type of emergency that has occurred. Procedures for several different types of emergencies are listed in the following section.

Step Two: Identify the Level of Emergency

The second step in responding to an emergency is to determine the level of emergency. To assist schools in classifying emergency situations there is a three tiered rating below:

- **Level 1 Emergency:** A minor emergency that is handled by school personnel without the assistance from outside agencies, e.g., a temporary power outage, a minor injury during PE.
- **Level 2 Emergency:** A moderate emergency that requires assistance from outside agencies, such as a fire or an injury which requires an ambulance.
- **Level 3 Emergency:** A major emergency event that requires assistance from outside agencies such as a major earthquake, a civil disturbance or a large-scale act of terrorism. For Level 3 emergencies, it is important to remember that the response time of outside agencies may be seriously delayed.

Step Three: Determine the Immediate Response Action

Once the type and extent of an emergency have been identified, school personnel can determine if an immediate response action is required. The most common immediate response actions initiated during school emergencies are:

- **Duck and Cover:** Students and staff protect themselves by crouching under a table, desk, or chair until the danger passes.
- **Shelter in Place:** Students and staff are kept indoors in order to isolate them from the outdoor environment.
- **Lock Down:** Students and staff are kept in a designated locked area with blinds closed and lights off and sitting quietly until danger has passed, such as an intruder being on campus.
- **Evacuate Building:** Students and staff are escorted outside to an assembly area if it has been determined that it is too dangerous to remain indoors. Assist individuals who are unable to evacuate on their own to the best of your ability.
- **Evacuate Campus:** Students and staff are escorted to an off-site assembly area if it has been determined that it is too dangerous to remain on campus. Assist individuals who are unable to evacuate on their own to the best of your ability.
- **All Clear:** Notification is given that normal school operations should resume.

Step Four: Communicate the Appropriate Response Action

Once the type of immediate response action is determined, the incident commander must immediately inform the site's staff which response action to take. The most important method of communication depends on the response action selected. When announcing what response to take, avoid codes, jargon, or any other potentially confusing vocabulary. Be calm, direct, and clear in your announcements.

- **Duck and Cover:** Immediately use the site's school-wide communication system to instruct students and staff to protect themselves by moving into a "duck and cover" position by crouching under a table, desk, or chair until the danger passes.

Time is the most urgent matter with this response action as the emergency may take place before the announcement can be made. However, do not assume that all members of the site are already in a "duck and cover" position. Make the announcement even if the immediate crisis has passed.

- Shelter in Place: Immediately use the site's school-wide communication system to instruct students and staff that they are to stay indoors until further notice, even if the heating and air conditioning system is disabled.
- Lock Down: Immediately use the site's school-wide communication system to instruct staff to lock all exterior doors, to close any open windows along with blinds, and to keep students as far away as possible from any windows until further notice.
- Evacuate Building: Immediately use the site's fire alarm bell system to notify students and staff that they are to proceed to the sites outside assembly area. Assist individuals who are unable to evacuate on their own to the best of your ability.
- Evacuate Campus: Immediately use the site's fire alarm bell system to notify students and staff that they are to proceed to the sites outside assembly area. From there, notify staff and students using a bullhorn that it has been determined that it is too dangerous to remain on campus. Provide instructions on how staff and students will be relocated. Assist individuals who are unable to evacuate on their own to the best of your ability.

Types of Emergencies & Specific Procedures

Aircraft Crash

If an aircraft crashes ON CAMPUS:

- * Sound the fire alarm (if there is no explosion or ongoing danger that would make evacuation hazardous).
- * Call 911 immediately, reporting:
 - * The location and nature of the crash
 - * Any observed injuries or fire
 - * The presence of fuel leaks, smoke, or hazardous materials
- * Evacuate the area quickly and calmly using established evacuation routes, avoiding the crash site.
- * Teachers take emergency backpacks and student rosters.
- * Admin or designee initiates the Incident Command System (ICS) and assumes the role of Incident Commander until relieved by emergency personnel.
- * School staff secures perimeter and prevents re-entry to the crash site.
- * First aid is administered to the injured until professional help arrives.

If an aircraft crashes NEAR CAMPUS:

- * Assess proximity to school and determine risk of fire, explosion, or hazardous materials.
- * Move students and staff indoors if the crash is near but poses no immediate threat.
- * Close windows and doors. Shut down HVAC system if there is smoke or chemical odor.
- * Prepare for potential evacuation if instructed by emergency services.
- * Maintain communication with district officials and local emergency responders.

2. Shelter-in-Place (if needed)

If there is a danger from airborne toxins or fire:

- * Announce: "Shelter-in-Place. This is not a drill. Please proceed indoors and seal all windows and doors."

Turn off air-handling systems.

- * Keep students calm and inside until all-clear is given.

Animal Disturbance

1. Identification of Threat

- * Any staff member or student who observes an animal that poses a threat should immediately notify the main office.
- * Do not approach or attempt to capture the animal.
- * Take note of the animal's type, location, behavior, and direction of movement.

2. Immediate Actions by School Staff

If the animal is ON CAMPUS and poses a danger:

- * Announce a "Shelter-in-Place" over the intercom:
"Shelter-in-Place. There is an animal on campus. Please remain indoors and secure all doors and windows. This is not a drill."
- * Close and lock all doors and windows; bring students inside from playgrounds, fields, and lunch areas.
- * Keep students away from windows and glass doors.
- * Alert district office and animal control (or local law enforcement if necessary).
- * Designate a staff member to monitor the animal from a safe distance and report its movement.

If the animal is OFF CAMPUS but nearby:

- * Limit outdoor activity until the situation is resolved.
- * Maintain supervision and prevent students from approaching or interacting with the animal.
- * Keep communication open with local authorities regarding the animal's location and behavior.

3. Communication

- * Use internal radios or the intercom system to coordinate staff communication.
- * Notify parents/guardians if the incident significantly disrupts the school day or poses risk.

- * Use discretion when notifying students to avoid unnecessary panic.

4. Resolution

- * Wait for animal control officers to capture or remove the animal.
- * Do not resume outdoor activities until the all-clear is given by administration.
- * If injuries occur, follow first aid and emergency medical response protocols.

Armed Assault on Campus

1. Identification of Threat

- * Any student or staff member who sees or suspects an armed individual must immediately notify the office or call 911 if safe to do so.
- * Provide as much information as possible:
 - * Description of the individual(s) and weapon(s)
 - * Location and direction of movement
 - * Any injuries observed

2. Immediate Actions

If an Armed Individual is ON Campus:

- * Initiate Lockdown immediately using intercom or PA system:
“ Lockdown. Lockdown. This is not a drill. Armed intruder on campus. Follow lockdown procedures immediately.”
- * Call 911 and provide location, description, and actions of the suspect.
- * Activate the Incident Command System (ICS) and assign emergency roles (if safe to do so).
- * All classrooms and offices should immediately:
 - * Lock doors and turn off lights
 - * Instruct students to move away from doors/windows and remain quiet
 - * Silence cell phones
 - * Barricade doors if possible and safe
 - * Remain in place until law enforcement arrives and gives the all-clear

If an Armed Individual is NEAR Campus:

- * Initiate Secure Campus procedure (formerly known as "lockout"):
“Secure Campus. This is not a drill. There is police activity near campus. Please remain inside. Lock all doors and windows.”
- * Continue instructional activities indoors
- * Do not allow anyone to leave or enter the campus until cleared by law enforcement

3. Staff Responsibilities

- * Teachers are responsible for securing their rooms and maintaining student accountability.
- * Office staff not in immediate danger will assist with:
 1. Emergency communications
 2. Contacting law enforcement and district officials
 3. Locking exterior gates and entrances if safe
- * Custodial and support staff will assist only if safe; otherwise, they must also secure themselves in the nearest safe location.

4. Communication

- * Use emergency notification systems (e.g., Catapult) to inform parents:
 - * Only when it is safe and information is verified
 - * Emphasize not to come to campus during the incident
 - * Coordinate directly with law enforcement on all public information releases.

Biological or Chemical Release

1. Types of Threats Covered

- * Chemical spill or gas leak (e.g., chlorine, ammonia)
- * Pesticide or hazardous material exposure
- * Suspicious powder or substance (potential bioterrorism agent)

- * Airborne contaminant from industrial accident or nearby traffic accident

2. Initial Response and Identification

- * Any person identifying a suspicious substance, strong odor, or unusual symptoms (e.g., coughing, burning eyes) must immediately:
- * Notify the main office or administrator
- * Call 911 if a release is suspected or confirmed

DO NOT touch or attempt to clean up the substance.

Note the location, appearance, and odor of the substance (if known) and relay to emergency responders.

3. Immediate Actions by Administration

If the release is OUTSIDE the school:

Initiate Shelter-in-Place:

“Shelter-in-Place. There is a chemical hazard in the area. Please proceed indoors and seal windows and doors. This is not a drill.”

- * Close all windows, doors, and air vents.
- * Shut down HVAC systems to prevent outside air from entering.
- * Move students to interior rooms if possible.
- * Keep staff and students calm and await further instructions from emergency officials.

If the release is INSIDE the school:

Initiate Evacuation if it is safe and the location of the release is contained:

- * Evacuate away from the affected area using pre-determined safe routes.
- * Do not evacuate into a contaminated area.
- * If evacuation is unsafe, shelter-in-place in rooms farthest from the affected area and seal rooms.
- * Call 911 and report the situation immediately.
- * Contact district office and environmental health services as needed.

4. Staff Responsibilities

Teachers:

- * Take roll and maintain supervision
- * Keep students calm and informed
- * Seal windows and doors with available materials (plastic sheets, towels)

Office staff:

- * Relay updates to staff
- * Monitor communication with 911 and public safety

Custodial staff:

- * Assist with HVAC shutoff and facility control, if safe

5. Communication

- * Notify parents/guardians using the school’s emergency communication system (e.g., Catapult) when it is safe to do so.
- * Emphasize the need to not come to the school until instructed.

Follow public health guidance and coordinate messaging with local authorities (e.g., county emergency management, fire, hazmat teams).

6. Medical and Decontamination

If exposure is suspected:

- * Move affected individuals to a designated decontamination area or as directed by authorities.

- * Administer basic first aid if necessary, avoiding contact with contaminants.
- * Await arrival of hazardous materials response team for professional evaluation and treatment.

Bomb Threat/ Threat Of violence

1. Identification of Threat

If a bomb threat is received by phone:

- * Remain calm and keep the caller on the line as long as possible.
- * Use the Bomb Threat Checklist to gather information (e.g., caller's voice, background noise, exact words, time of call).
- * Signal another staff member to call 911 while the call is still in progress, if possible.

If the threat is written, emailed, or discovered:

- * Do not touch or disturb the message.
- * Call 911 immediately.
- * Notify the principal or site administrator.
- * Preserve evidence by saving or photographing the message if digital.

2. Immediate Administrative Actions

- * Call 911 and report the threat.
- * Activate the Incident Command System (ICS).
- * Do not use radios or cell phones near a suspected device to avoid triggering it.
- * Consult with law enforcement before deciding to evacuate or shelter in place.

3. Evacuation or Shelter-in-Place Decision

Follow the direction of law enforcement or fire officials.

If evacuation is ordered:

- * Use primary evacuation routes unless a specific threat location is known—then use alternate routes.
- * Teachers bring emergency backpacks and student rosters.
- * Avoid any suspicious packages or items.
- * Leave doors and windows open to reduce blast damage.
- * Move to predesignated evacuation site at a safe distance from buildings.

If shelter-in-place is ordered:

- * Secure all classrooms.
- * Keep students quiet and away from windows and exterior walls.
- * Prepare for a possible evacuation or extended stay.

4. Staff Responsibilities

Teachers:

- * Maintain student supervision and accountability.
- * Take roll at evacuation site or during shelter-in-place.
- * Report any suspicious objects to administration without touching them.

Office and Admin:

- * Coordinate with law enforcement and district safety officials.
- * Handle parent communications.
- * Document the timeline and nature of the threat.

5. Communication

- * Use district-approved emergency communication tools (e.g., Catapult) to inform families:

- * Only when cleared by law enforcement.
- * Provide accurate updates and instructions for reunification if necessary.
- * Do not release unverified information or speculate on the threat's validity.

Bus Disaster

1. Immediate Actions by Bus Driver (If Incident Occurs While En Route)

In Case of Collision or Serious Emergency:

- * Stop the bus in a safe location, if possible.
- * Turn off the engine to reduce fire risk.
- * Assess the situation for injuries, fire, or other dangers.
- * Call 911 to report the emergency and request medical or police assistance.
- * Contact school transportation dispatch and report:
 - Location (nearest intersection, highway mile marker, etc.)
 - Number of students
 - Type of emergency or injuries
- * Keep students calm and seated unless it is unsafe (e.g., smoke, fire, risk of explosion).
- * Evacuate the bus if there is imminent danger using front/rear/side exits as appropriate.
- * Administer first aid if trained and necessary.

2. Immediate Actions by School Administration

Upon Notification of Bus Disaster:

- * Activate the Incident Command System (ICS).
- * Designate a School Incident Commander and assign staff roles (communications, reunification, etc.).

Notify:

- * Emergency responders (if not already contacted)
- * District office/transportation director
- * Parents/guardians via emergency communication systems
- * Dispatch school personnel to the scene, if safe and appropriate, to support responders and students.

3. Staff Responsibilities at the School Site

- * Prepare for student reception if students are returning to campus after the incident.
- * Set up a Reunification Area for parents if needed.
- * Deploy counselors and support staff to assist affected students and staff.
- * Document all actions taken and maintain a log for official reports.

4. Medical & Safety Response

- * Ensure all injured students and staff receive appropriate medical treatment.
- * Record:
 - Names of all passengers
 - Location and nature of any injuries
 - Treatment provided and hospital transport details
- * Maintain clear communication with emergency personnel on scene.

Disorderly Conduct

1. Definition of Disorderly Conduct

Disorderly conduct may include:

- * Verbal threats or aggression
- * Physical fights or altercations
- * Unruly behavior during school events or in common areas
- * Trespassing or refusal to comply with staff instructions
- * Threats to staff or students without a visible weapon

2. Initial Staff Response

- * Stay calm and assess the situation. If there is no immediate threat to safety, use de-escalation techniques.
- * If the situation escalates or involves violence, call the office or dial 911 immediately.
- * Do not attempt to physically intervene unless trained and the situation requires immediate protection of life.
- * Clear the area of bystanders and students if possible.
- * Notify school administration as soon as it is safe to do so.

3. Administrative Actions

- * Administrator or designee responds to the scene with support staff.
- * If behavior is dangerous or threatening:
 - Call 911 if not already done
 - Activate Lockdown if the threat escalates to physical violence or potential weapon use
 - Ensure student and staff safety is maintained above all.

4. Lockdown or Shelter-in-Place (if necessary)

- * If the individual poses an immediate threat and cannot be isolated:
- * Initiate Lockdown for entire school or affected area
- * Keep students behind locked doors and away from windows.
- * Wait for law enforcement to secure the scene and give the all-clear.

5. Communication

- * Notify district office and appropriate school safety personnel.
- * Use emergency communication system (Catapult.) if incident impacts student safety or causes significant disruption.
- * Share accurate and timely updates with staff and parents once verified by administration.

6. Incident Follow-Up

- * Debrief with staff and witnesses involved.
- * Offer mental health and counseling support for affected students and staff.
- * Conduct a threat assessment if the individual is a student.
- * Determine appropriate disciplinary action in accordance with district policies and Ed Code.

7. Documentation and Reporting

Complete incident report detailing:

- * Nature of the behavior
- * Staff response
- * Law enforcement involvement
- * Student/staff impact

Submit documentation to the district office and retain for legal and safety reviews.

8. Prevention and Training

Provide annual training to staff on:

- * De-escalation techniques
- * Identifying early signs of aggressive behavior
- * Emergency response protocols
- * Encourage positive behavior interventions and supports (PBIS) and restorative practices to reduce incidents.
- * Maintain a Visitor Check-In/Check-Out system and staff visibility in high-traffic areas.

Earthquake

Earthquake Procedures:

1. Intense shaking occurs.
2. Teacher gives command "DROP".
3. Staff and student follow Drop, Cover and Hold on procedures.
4. Wait for shaking to stop.

5. Check for injuries and/or trapped individuals. If any individuals are trapped assure them help will be forthcoming.
6. After checking for blocked exits, give command to evacuate.

Drop, Cover and Hold on Procedures:

Drop, Cover and Hold on may be used when there is a danger to students and staff of being injured by debris. Students are trained to go under desks and/or tables cover your head and neck with one arm and hold on to furniture leg with the other arm for protection. Procedures are as follows:

If inside a building or classroom:

- * Get under desk or piece of furniture as a shield
- * Drop to your hands and knees with your back to the window.
- * Make body as small as possible.
- * Cover your head and neck with one arm and hold on to furniture leg with the other arm.
- * Keep eyes closed.
- * If an earthquake, hold on until the shaking stops.
- * Wait for further instructions.

If outside of school buildings:

- * Get clear of all buildings, power lines, light poles or sources that may be dangerous.
- * Lie flat with chest down and back up with face away from dangerous hazards.
- * Cover head, face as much skin surface as possible.
- * Keep eyes closed.
- * Wait for further instructions.

When safe to do so, follow evacuation procedures

Explosion or Risk Of Explosion

1. In the Event of an Actual Explosion

Immediate Actions

- * Duck and cover: Instruct students and staff to take cover under desks, away from windows and overhead hazards.
- * Once safe, evacuate the building immediately, unless evacuation routes are unsafe.
- * Do not use fire alarms if you suspect an explosive device—it could trigger another detonation.
- * Call 911 and report the explosion, including:
 - Location and extent of the damage
 - Known injuries
 - Suspicious circumstances (e.g., if a device was seen before the explosion)
- * Notify school administration and activate the Incident Command System (ICS).

Evacuation Guidelines

Teachers:

- * Take emergency go-bags and student rosters.
- * Lead students calmly to the pre-designated evacuation area.
- * Avoid touching or walking near any suspicious object.
- * Take attendance and report missing or injured students to incident command.

Admin:

- * Confirm the location is safe before directing evacuation.
- * Coordinate with fire, law enforcement, and EMS upon arrival.
- * Ensure gates are unlocked for emergency vehicle access.

2. In the Event of a Risk or Threat of Explosion

Examples of Possible Threats:

- * Suspicious package or device
- * Gas leak or strong chemical odor

- * Bomb threat or warning call
- * Spark or fire near hazardous materials

Immediate Actions

- * Call 911 and report the suspected threat.
- * Do NOT touch or move suspicious objects.
- * Do NOT use cell phones or two-way radios near the object.
- * Notify district office and initiate ICS.

Evacuation or Shelter Decision

- * Only evacuate if the area outside is confirmed safe.
- * Use routes away from the suspected device or hazard.
- * If the threat is outdoors or uncertain, initiate Shelter-in-Place:
 “Shelter-in-Place. This is not a drill. Please remain indoors. Close and lock doors and windows. Do not use cell phones.”

3. Communication

- * Use PA system or messengers to communicate instructions clearly.
- * Notify parents using emergency notification systems only after verifying the situation with law enforcement.
- * Designate a Public Information Officer (PIO) to coordinate with media and law enforcement.

4. Medical and Safety Response

- * Provide first aid to the injured until EMS arrives.
- * Move injured individuals only if necessary to prevent further harm.
- * Maintain a log of all affected individuals (injured, missing, treated, transported).

Fire in Surrounding Area

1. Initial Identification and Notification

The principal or designee confirms the incident with:

- * Local fire department or CAL FIRE
- * Law enforcement or Office of Emergency Services (OES)
- * District safety office

Monitor updates via:

- * Emergency alert systems (e.g., NOAA Weather Radio, local news)
- * District communication channels
- * Air quality monitoring services (e.g., AQI from AirNow)

2. Immediate Administrative Actions

If there is NO immediate threat to the campus:

- * Announce Shelter-in-Place (if smoke or ash is present):
 “Shelter-in-Place. There is a fire in the surrounding area. Please stay indoors. Close windows and doors. This is not a drill.”
- * Shut off HVAC systems to prevent smoke from entering.
- * Cancel all outdoor activities, including recess, PE, and after-school sports.
- * Move all students and staff indoors.
- * Limit classroom transitions and keep students in their current locations if possible.

If the fire is approaching the school or evacuation is advised:

- * Coordinate with local emergency services before initiating evacuation.
- * Use pre-identified evacuation routes that avoid exposure to fire or smoke.
- * Prepare for possible relocation to an off-site reunification center if needed.

3. Staff Responsibilities

Teachers:

- * Close windows and doors.
- * Take roll and monitor student health (especially those with asthma or respiratory issues).
- * Keep students calm and informed.

Office/Admin Staff:

- * Maintain open communication with district and emergency services.
- * Prepare emergency go-kits and evacuation rosters in case relocation is necessary.
- * Monitor phone lines and parent inquiries.

4. Communication

- * Use emergency notification systems (e.g., Catapult) to notify families:
 - Status of fire and school operations
 - Any changes to pickup times or transportation
 - Instructions not to come to campus unless directed
- * Coordinate public messaging with the district's Public Information Officer (PIO) and local authorities.

5. Transportation

Work with district transportation to:

- * Re-route buses if roads are closed or conditions are unsafe.
- * Adjust bell schedules or release times as needed.
- * Ensure bus drivers are updated on air quality and visibility concerns.

6. Student Health Monitoring

- * Notify school nurse and office staff to monitor students for:
 - Respiratory distress
 - Headaches, dizziness, or eye irritation
- * Provide access to asthma inhalers or emergency medication as needed.

Fire on School Grounds

Fire Procedures

If you see smoke, fire or if the fire alarm sounds:

Procedure for During Class Time:

1. Teachers:

- o Grab your keys, device and Emergency Bag/Backpack.
- o Check that all exits are clear. If exits are blocked, find alternate exit route.
- o Staff exit the room with students, check that all students are out of the classroom and leave door closed and unlocked and report to the primary evacuation location unless directed to go to a secondary location. (See Evacuation Map)
- o Activate fire alarm pull station if nearby and the alarm is not yet sounding.

2. Students exit the classroom and WALK in an orderly line.

3. NO TALKING IS PERMITTED.

4. Once in the evacuation area and it is safe to do so, teachers take roll and account for each student via Catapult EMS. Account for all students who were present at time of role. The office accounts for absent students that are marked absent in Catapult.

5. Students in classrooms other than their own are to remain with that class until given permission to rejoin their class by both teachers.

6. Students remain in orderly and silent lines until the all clear signal is given.

7. P.E. Classes: Teacher/supervising adult:

- o Stop activity
- o Organize class into silent and orderly lines
- o Lead class to evacuation area.

NOTE: Elevators are not to be used during fire evacuations. Use an alternate route.

Procedure Used Before School, During Lunch and Recess:

1. Students WALK to the designated evacuation area.
2. Students wait in orderly and silent lines for their teacher/supervising adult to give further instructions.

ALL SCHOOL PERSONNEL, CERTIFICATED AND CLASSIFIED ARE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL FIRE DRILLS

Parents, guests and community people on the grounds during a drill must participate.

Using a Fire Extinguisher

Rescue Union School District provides fire extinguisher training to faculty and staff upon being hired and annually. (California Code of Regulations: Title 8, §6151. Portable Fire Extinguishers. Section G.)

During the beginning stages of a fire:

1. Pull the fire alarm (This will notify the Fire Department automatically)
2. Identify a safe evacuation path before approaching the fire. Do not allow the fire, heat, or smoke to come between you and your evacuation path.
3. Evacuate students from the room and line up outside of the classroom then, if safe to do so, the teacher/staff member may attempt to put out the fire with a fire extinguisher.
4. Discharge the extinguisher within its effective range using the P.A.S.S. technique: Pull, Aim, Squeeze, and Sweep.
5. Back away from an extinguished fire in case it flames up again.
6. Evacuate immediately if the extinguisher is empty and the fire is not out.
7. Evacuate immediately if the fire progresses.
8. After you evacuate, call 911, if appropriate.

If evacuation is necessary, follow evacuation procedures.

Most fire extinguishers operate using the following P.A.S.S. technique:

1. PULL... Pull the pin. This will also break the tamper seal.
2. AIM... Aim low, pointing the extinguisher nozzle (or its horn or hose) at the base of the fire.
NOTE: Do not touch the plastic discharge horn on CO2 extinguishers, it gets very cold and may damage skin.
3. SQUEEZE... Squeeze the handle to release the extinguishing agent.
4. SWEEP... Sweep from side to side at the base of the fire until it appears to be out. Watch the area. If the fire re-ignites, repeat steps 2 - 4.

If you have the slightest doubt about your ability to fight a fire....EVACUATE IMMEDIATELY!

Flooding

1. Initial Assessment and Notification

* Monitor flood warnings through:

- National Weather Service (NWS)
- Local Office of Emergency Services (OES)
- Emergency alert systems and district notifications

* Site administrator evaluates:

- Current and projected flood levels
- Access to campus and road conditions
- Impact on utilities and infrastructure

2. Administrative Actions

* Activate the Incident Command System (ICS).

* Notify:

- District office
- Local emergency management and public works
- School transportation department

- * Postpone or cancel outdoor activities if flooding is possible.
- * Consider early release or delayed dismissal if conditions worsen.

3. If Flooding is Occurring or Imminent

Shelter-in-Place (if evacuation is unsafe):

“Shelter-in-Place. Please stay indoors. Do not leave the building until further notice.”

- * Move students and staff to higher floors or elevated areas.
- * Turn off electrical equipment if instructed and safe to do so.
- * Block door gaps and cover vents if water begins to enter.
- * Avoid all contact with flood water due to contamination risks.

Evacuation (only if directed and safe):

- * Use pre-identified alternate evacuation routes that avoid low-lying or flooded areas.
- * Do not allow students to walk through moving water.
- * Teachers bring emergency go-bags and student rosters.
- * Account for all students at the evacuation site.

4. Transportation Adjustments

- * Coordinate with the transportation department to reroute or delay buses.
- * Avoid roads known to flood or currently closed by emergency services.
- * Consider relocating students to an alternate safe location if return home is unsafe.

5. Communication

- * Notify parents/guardians through approved channels (Catapult):
 - Flood status and student safety
 - Adjusted release, transportation, or relocation details
 - Instructions not to drive to campus unless directed
- * Coordinate public messaging with district PIO and emergency authorities.

6. Medical and Safety Considerations

- * Monitor students with asthma or health concerns, as mold or water contamination may impact air quality.
- * Avoid contact with:
 - Electrical outlets or waterlogged electronics
 - Contaminated water
- * Keep emergency medical kits and flashlights accessible.

Loss or Failure Of Utilities

1. Types of Utility Failures Covered

- * Power outage
- * Water supply failure or contamination
- * Natural gas leak
- * Loss of heating, air conditioning (HVAC)
- * Loss of internet or phone service

2. Initial Actions Upon Detection

Power Outage:

- * Notify the principal or designee and the district maintenance department.
- * Turn off electrical devices and equipment to prevent damage when power is restored.
- * If it's safe, open blinds/windows to provide light and ventilation.
- * Use battery-powered flashlights (not candles).
- * Monitor emergency radio or communication devices for updates.
- * District office to provide a generator for office phones and computer use for front office staff

Water Outage or Contamination:

- * Stop use of all water (sinks, fountains, restrooms).
- * Notify staff and restrict water access.
- * Provide bottled water and portable sanitation if possible.
- * Contact district maintenance and local public health authorities.

Gas Leak (Suspected or Confirmed):

- * Do not operate light switches or electronic devices.
- * Evacuate the affected building(s) immediately.
- * Call 911 and district maintenance.
- * Notify utility provider (e.g., PG&E or SoCalGas).
- * Initiate Lockout or Evacuation depending on the threat level.

3. Communication Protocols

- * Use alternative communication methods (e.g., two-way radios, cell phones) if phones or internet are down.
- * Notify:
 - District office
 - Parents/guardians (when safe and appropriate)
 - Local utility providers
- * Provide regular updates through available channels (email, text, intercom, PA system).

4. Shelter-in-Place or Evacuation Decision

- * If the outage poses no immediate danger: Shelter-in-Place and monitor conditions.
- * If the environment becomes unsafe or unsanitary (e.g., extreme heat, no running water, gas odor):
- * Consider evacuation or early release in coordination with the district and emergency services.
- * Initiate notification for early student dismissal (early end of school) if needed.

5. Classroom and Student Supervision

- * Continue supervision and instruction as safely possible.
- * Use alternative, non-digital learning materials if power/internet is down.
- * Keep students indoors or in safe, designated areas unless otherwise directed.
- * Monitor students with medical needs (e.g., medication storage that requires refrigeration, oxygen equipment).

6. Food Services

- * Coordinate with nutrition services staff:
 - Halt meal service if food safety standards cannot be maintained (e.g., no refrigeration, no clean water).
 - Use pre-packaged meals or snacks if available.

7. Early Dismissal (if necessary)

- * Notify families through the emergency system with instructions for early pickup.
- * Follow Student Release/Reunification Plan:
 - Verify ID before releasing students.
 - Keep logs of all released students.

8. After-Action and Recovery

- * Work with the district and utility companies to restore services.
- * Assess impact on school operations, learning loss, and food safety.
- * Provide counseling and support if the outage caused disruption or fear.
- * Review and update emergency protocols as needed.

9. Preparedness Measures

- * Maintain emergency supplies in every classroom, including:
 - Flashlights, batteries, bottled water, non-perishable snacks, blankets
- * Back up critical systems and files if applicable.
- * Post emergency procedures near phones and electrical panels.

- * Conduct regular drills that include utility outage scenarios.

Motor Vehicle Crash

1. Types of Incidents Covered

- * Vehicle crashes into a school building, fence, or campus area
- * School bus or school vehicle collision
- * Vehicle accident near school grounds involving students or staff
- * Pedestrian struck by a vehicle near or on campus

2. Immediate Actions by Witness or Staff Member

- * Call 911 immediately, provide:
 - Location of the crash (address or landmark)
 - Type of vehicles involved
 - Injuries or hazards (e.g., fire, fuel leak)
- * Notify the principal or site administrator.
- * Do not move injured persons unless they are in immediate danger (e.g., from fire).
- * Keep students and staff away from the scene.
- * Provide basic first aid only if trained and it is safe to do so.

3. Administrative Actions

- * Activate the Incident Command System (ICS).
- * Assign staff to:
 - Direct emergency responders to the scene
 - Supervise nearby students
 - Manage communication with district and parents
- * If the incident involves a school bus, coordinate with the transportation department to verify passenger lists and notify families.

4. Student and Staff Safety

- * If students were involved or witnessed the crash:
 - Move them to a secure and supervised area.
 - Account for all students using attendance rosters.
 - Keep them away from emergency responders unless needed for medical evaluation.
- * Provide support to any students who may be in shock or distress.

5. Scene Security and Hazards

- * Prevent anyone from entering the crash zone, especially if:
 - There is leaking fuel
 - Downed power lines are present
 - Airbags have deployed or smoke is visible
- * Do not allow staff or students to photograph or post about the crash on social media.

6. Communication Protocols

- * Notify:
 - District office
 - Transportation department, if a school vehicle is involved
 - Parents/guardians if students are injured or affected
- * Use official messaging platforms (ParentSquare, Blackboard, etc.) to avoid misinformation.
- * Designate a Public Information Officer (PIO) to handle media if needed.

Pandemic

1. Coordination and Planning

- * Follow guidance from:
 - California Department of Public Health (CDPH)

- Local County Public Health Department
 - Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)
 - California Department of Education (CDE)
- * Activate the School Pandemic Response Plan and the Incident Command System (ICS).
- * Designate a School Site Health Liaison to coordinate with district and public health officials.

2. Preventative Measures and Campus Health Protocols

- * Implement public health protocols as required:
- Handwashing, respiratory hygiene education
 - Regular cleaning and disinfection of high-touch surfaces
 - Physical distancing (as feasible)
 - Required or optional mask usage depending on health orders
 - Isolation of symptomatic individuals
- * Post signs throughout campus reminding of hygiene protocols and symptoms of illness.

3. Symptom Screening and Reporting

- * Daily symptom checks for students and staff as recommended.
- * Staff and students should stay home if sick or exhibiting symptoms.
- * Report confirmed cases to local health officials per legal requirements (e.g., Cal/OSHA and FERPA compliance).
- * Track absences and illness trends for early outbreak detection.

4. Response to Confirmed Case or Exposure

- * Isolate the affected individual in a designated quarantine room and send them home as soon as possible.
- * Identify and notify close contacts based on current public health definitions.
- * Follow current quarantine/isolation guidelines (may vary based on vaccination status and variant severity).
- * Communicate with staff and families while protecting individual privacy.

5. Campus Closure or Modified Operations

- If advised by public health authorities:
- * Transition to remote learning or hybrid instruction models.
- * Maintain:
- Online instruction platforms
 - Meal services for students (pickup/delivery)
 - Access to mental health services
- * Communicate clearly about:
- Duration of closure
 - Instructional expectations
 - Technology access/support
 - Grading policies and attendance procedures

6. Continuity of Operations

- * Ensure essential staff (e.g., administrators, IT, nutrition services, custodians) have safe working conditions.
- * Coordinate with the district for:
- Payroll
 - Data systems
 - Cleaning and facilities maintenance
- * Keep emergency contact information for all students and staff updated.

7. Mental Health and Wellness

- * Provide access to:
- School counselors
 - Crisis response teams
 - Virtual wellness resources
- * Promote SEL (social-emotional learning) practices in both in-person and remote environments.

8. Communication Protocols

* Use official school communication systems (ParentSquare, Blackboard, email, website).

* Share:

- Health updates and guidelines
- Changes to instruction or schedules
- Mental health and community resources

* Designate a Public Information Officer (PIO) to coordinate messaging with district and public health agencies.

9. Recovery and Return to Campus

* Follow public health clearance protocols for reopening:

- Deep cleaning and ventilation assessment
- Updated safety signage and supplies (e.g., PPE, sanitizer)
- Return-to-school criteria for students and staff

* Provide reentry support, including:

- Mental health services
- Academic assessments and remediation planning

10. Training and Preparedness

* Train staff on:

- Infection prevention
- Sick student protocols
- Distance learning platforms

* Conduct tabletop or virtual exercises with administrative teams.

11. Supplies and Equipment

Maintain stock of:

* Masks, gloves, thermometers, sanitizers, disinfectants

* Emergency food and water in case of extended shelter-in-place

* Technology tools (e.g., Chromebooks, Wi-Fi hotspots)

Psychological Trauma

1. Identifying Psychological Trauma

Psychological trauma may result from:

- A critical incident (e.g., suicide, death, violent act)
- A natural or man-made disaster
- Prolonged fear (e.g., active shooter lockdown, abuse)
- Media exposure to distressing events
- Loss of a loved one

Symptoms may include:

- Withdrawal, anxiety, or fearfulness
- Crying, emotional outbursts
- Difficulty concentrating or sleeping
- Physical complaints with no medical cause
- Aggressive or defiant behavior

2. Immediate Administrative Actions

- Notify the principal or site crisis response lead.
- Activate the School Crisis Response Team.
- Ensure immediate safety and remove students from the source of trauma (if ongoing).
- Secure the scene if related to an on-campus incident.
- Contact district mental health services and local behavioral health partners for support.
- Protect the privacy and dignity of those involved—limit rumors and social media speculation.

3. Staff Response Procedures

- Teachers or staff who observe trauma symptoms should:
 - o Provide a calm and supportive environment
 - o Listen non-judgmentally without pressing for details
 - o Refer the student to the school counselor, psychologist, or administrator immediately
 - Do not send the student alone if they are visibly distressed.

4. Crisis Counseling and Support Services

- Establish a designated counseling space on campus with trained mental health staff.
- Offer individual and small group counseling to affected students and staff.
- Provide additional supervision for vulnerable students (e.g., those with past trauma or mental health challenges).
- Maintain documentation of services offered and provided.

5. Family and Community Communication

- Notify affected families sensitively and promptly.
- Provide factual, age-appropriate information to the school community:

“Our school experienced a difficult situation today involving [brief description, e.g., the loss of a student]. Counselors are available, and we will continue to support our students through this time.”

- Include referral information for external mental health resources and crisis lines (e.g., 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline).

6. Classroom Support

- Teachers should:

- o Maintain routines but be flexible with academic expectations
- o Allow students space to talk or take breaks if overwhelmed
- o Monitor behavior changes and refer concerns to support staff
 - Provide trauma-informed classroom strategies:
- o Check-ins
- o Mindfulness or calming exercises
- o Seating adjustments or safe spaces

Suspected Contamination of Food or Water

1. Types of Potential Contamination Events

- Spoiled or expired food served to students or staff
- Water contamination (e.g., lead, bacteria, chemicals)
- Foodborne illness outbreak (e.g., norovirus, salmonella)
- Intentional tampering or foreign objects found in food/water
- Public Health or Environmental Health advisory for unsafe water

2. Immediate Actions Upon Suspicion or Report

- Stop use of all potentially contaminated food or water immediately.
- Isolate and secure any suspected food or drink to prevent further consumption.
- Remove affected items from service but do not dispose until public health officials can inspect.
- If individuals are ill or showing symptoms:
 - Call 911 for serious symptoms
 - Notify the school nurse, administer first aid as appropriate
 - Document names and symptoms of all affected persons
 - Notify:
 - Principal or designee
 - District nutrition services supervisor
 - Local public health department
 - Facilities or maintenance department (for water issues)

3. Investigation and Assessment

- Initiate a site-based food/water safety assessment with:

- Cafeteria/kitchen staff
- Maintenance personnel (for plumbing or water source issues)
- Environmental health officials
- Retain:
- Sample food/water for testing
- Food labels, preparation records, and vendor delivery logs

4. Isolation and Containment

- Restrict access to any affected areas (kitchen, cafeteria, restrooms, fountains).
- Shut off drinking fountains and sinks if water is suspected to be contaminated.
- Distribute bottled water if needed.

5. Communication Protocols

- Notify staff and families using approved platforms (e.g., Catapult):

"Out of an abundance of caution, we have suspended the use of certain food/water sources on campus today due to a possible contamination concern.

Students are safe and being monitored."

- Coordinate messaging with:
- District Public Information Officer (PIO)
- Local public health agency
- Be transparent but factual—avoid speculation until investigation confirms cause.

6. Alternate Plans for Food and Water

- Switch to pre-packaged meals if school food service is halted.
- Distribute bottled water and/or provide access to portable sanitation if necessary.
- Ensure all students have access to hydration and nutrition through alternative means.

7. Medical Response and Monitoring

- Maintain a log of affected individuals and symptoms.
- Monitor all students and staff who consumed suspected food/water.
- Notify parents/guardians of affected individuals and provide medical recommendations or public health notices.
- Follow reporting procedures for foodborne illness outbreaks as required by state and local agencies.

8. Student Release (If Widespread Exposure or Illness Occurs)

- Activate the Student Release/Reunification Plan if campus needs to be closed or evacuated.
- Provide updates and health recommendations to families at reunification.

9. Recovery and Restoration

- Work with health and safety officials to:
- Clear contaminated sources
- Test and verify water lines or food service equipment
- Clean and sanitize all affected areas
- Document response actions, retain inspection records, and submit reports as required.
- Resume service only after official clearance is given by local agencies.

10. Prevention and Training

- Train cafeteria, custodial, and office staff to recognize signs of contamination or illness.
- Conduct routine checks on:
- Food storage, preparation, and handling practices
- Water testing and plumbing maintenance
- Post safety protocols in food prep and service areas.
- Include contamination scenarios in annual emergency drills and tabletop exercises.

Tactical Responses to Criminal Incidents

1. Types of Criminal Incidents Covered

- Armed intruder on campus
- Active shooter or active assailant
- Hostage situation
- Barricaded subject
- Nearby police pursuit or law enforcement operation
- Serious violent crime on or adjacent to school property

2. Immediate Actions (Recognizing a Threat)

If staff or students observe a threat:

- Call 911 immediately and provide:
- School name and address
- Description of the suspect, weapon, and activity
- Location on or near campus
- Number of people involved or injured
- Notify the principal or site administrator (if safe to do so).
- Initiate an appropriate emergency action:

3. Emergency Response Options

A. Lockdown (If threat is on campus or nearby)

“This is a lockdown. Lock doors, turn off lights, stay out of sight. This is not a drill.”

- Lock all doors and windows.
- Move away from doors and windows.
- Turn off lights and remain silent.
- Silence phones.
- Do not open the door for anyone except emergency responders.
- Remain in lockdown until cleared by law enforcement or school administration.

B. Run, Hide, Fight (Active Assailant Guidance)

- Run – evacuate away from danger if it is safe.
- Hide – lock or barricade doors; stay quiet and out of sight.
- Fight – only as a last resort, attempt to incapacitate the attacker.

C. Shelter-in-Place (For threats near campus)

“Shelter-in-Place. Remain indoors. Lock exterior doors. Classes continue as normal indoors.”

- Lock perimeter doors.
- Keep students inside classrooms or buildings.
- Restrict movement around campus.
- Continue instruction unless otherwise instructed.

4. Law Enforcement Coordination

- Cooperate fully with responding officers or tactical teams.
- Provide access to:

o Building maps and master keys

o Class rosters and student schedules

o Names and locations of individuals with medical needs

- Follow law enforcement instructions without hesitation.

5. Communication Protocols

- Use PA system, radios, or emergency messaging system to initiate lockdown or shelter-in-place.
- The principal or designee will:
- Notify the district office
- Activate the Incident Command System (ICS)
- Coordinate with local law enforcement’s incident commander
- Designate a Public Information Officer (PIO) to manage messaging

Parent/Guardian Notification

Communicate once the situation is under control. Messages should:

- Confirm student safety
- Provide instructions for reunification or delayed dismissal
- Avoid speculative or graphic details
- Reassure families that trained personnel are managing the situation

Unlawful Demonstration or Walkout

1. Definitions

- Demonstration: A protest or public expression of opinion, which may be planned or spontaneous.
- Walkout: A student-organized event where individuals leave campus or class to protest or make a statement.
- Unlawful demonstration: Any protest or walkout that violates school policies or causes a disruption to school safety or operations.

2. Prevention and Preparation

- Establish clear school policies on student expression and protest.
- Educate students and staff on appropriate forms of protest under the First Amendment and Education Code §48907.
- Designate a staff lead (e.g., Assistant Principal or Safety Officer) to coordinate response planning.

3. Early Warning and Monitoring

- Monitor social media or informal channels for signs of an upcoming protest or walkout.
- Encourage open communication with student leadership to understand concerns and intentions.
- Notify the district office and, if needed, local law enforcement for possible crowd control support (particularly for larger or community-involved events).

4. Response to a Student Walkout

Before the Walkout:

- Remind students of:
- School rules
- Consequences of leaving campus without permission
- Safety risks (e.g., busy roads, weather conditions)
- Ensure staff coverage at exits and along probable departure routes.

During the Walkout:

- Do not physically restrain students from leaving campus.
- Do not threaten or confront protesting students.
- Document student names and times of departure.
- Assign staff or administrators (in pairs) to monitor off-campus locations where students gather, ensuring safety from traffic or outside threats.
- Keep non-participating students supervised and in class.
- Do not allow outsiders to join the protest on school property without permission.

If Protesters Are Disruptive or Violent:

- Initiate Lockdown or Shelter-in-Place if there is any threat to safety.
- Contact law enforcement if unauthorized individuals enter campus or if crowd control is needed.
- Activate the Incident Command System (ICS) to manage the event and communication.

5. Response to On-Campus Demonstrations

- If students demonstrate on school grounds:
- Assign staff to observe and supervise peacefully.
- Document incidents of vandalism, threats, or safety concerns.
- Allow peaceful protest if it does not disrupt instruction or endanger others.
- Move non-participating students away from the protest area.

6. Communication Protocols

- Keep staff informed of expectations and response procedures.
- Notify parents/guardians via automated messaging systems:

“We are aware of a student demonstration. Students are safe and supervised. We encourage students to remain on campus, and any unauthorized departure will be marked as unexcused.”

- Designate a Public Information Officer (PIO) to manage inquiries and coordinate messaging with district officials.

7. Legal Considerations and Documentation

- Students may not be disciplined for expressing their views peacefully, but:
- Unauthorized absences may be marked unexcused.
- Any disruption, defiance, vandalism, or threats may result in disciplinary action per Ed Code.
- Keep detailed records of:
 - Participants
 - Locations and timelines
 - Any safety or disciplinary incidents


8. Recovery and Support

- Debrief with staff and administrators after the event.
- Address student concerns through listening sessions, student forums, or classroom discussions.
- Offer counseling support to students emotionally affected by the event or its causes.
- Repair or clean any damage to school property.

9. Staff Training and Awareness

- Train staff to:
 - Remain calm and non-confrontational
 - Recognize the difference between disruption and protected expression
 - Supervise safely and avoid escalation
